No More Camping in Sand Island Park

In an effort to rehabilitate Sand Island Park, the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) will be prohibiting camping there beginning on August 23.

DLNR Deputy Director Alan Carpenter noted the constant disregard for park rules, littering, drinking, coupled with the lack of adequate staffing and law enforcement, as reasons for the shutdown.



Sen. Wakai supported DLNR's request for \$5 million from this past legislative session for master planning, replacement of picnic shelters, and constructing a new pavilion.

Public hearings will be held prior to starting construction.
