

## **Pushing Fixes to Radford and Makalapa**

State officials met this afternoon to come up with a game plan to accelerate the Army Corp's clean up for Radford's and Makalapa's fields, slated for remediation in 2028. Both schools are situated above a 70 year old military landfill.

Area lawmakers and DOE personnel toured the campus and discussed next steps. In the next month, State and Federal officials plan to meet with the military to press them to hasten the remediation process.

"The areas are safe as long as they are not disturbed; however the state needs to move dirt to upgrade the schools' facilities," says Sen. Wakai. "The military is handcuffing our efforts to enhance education for our keiki."
