SB 2762	RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING. Allows any person to appeal a denial of eligibility for public housing that is based on an eviction which occurred more than ten years prior to the current application for public housing.	СРН
SB 2057 SD1 (SSCR2380)	RELATING TO TIME SHARE ZONING. Authorizes the counties to restrict time share units and time share plans in zoning districts, if they establish a time share zoning district; eff. 7/1/2020 (SD1)	TSM/IGA, CPH

Extends the deadline for applying for a mechanic's lien where the contractor has forgone the filing of a lien conditioned upon receipt of full payment within 45 days of completion, and the owner fails to pay

in full within that time period.
