SB 3192

RELATING TO SISTER STATE AND PROVINCE

EIA, WAM

RELATIONSHIPS.

Statutorily establishes a Hawaii sister state committee to recommend sister state or province relationships for the legislature's action.

SB 2125

RELATING TO TAX CREDITS.

EIA, WAM

Provides a tax credit for the purchase of "Energy Star" designated and

labeled products.

SB 2126

RELATING TO TAX CREDITS.

EIA, WAM

Allows qualified homeowners to claim a tax credit for the installation

and purchase of photovoltaic systems.

SB 3186

RELATING TO ENERGY.

EIA, WAM

Appropriates funds to reconvene the Hawaii Energy Policy Forum to develop an action plan, timeline, and benchmarks, and to further engage Hawaii's leaders and stakeholders in implementing the Forum's visions, concepts, and recommendations for Hawaii's preferred energy

future.

SB 3161

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EIA, CPH

Allows the public utilities commission to establish standards that prescribe what portion of the renewable energy standards are to be met by specific types of resources; provided that at least 50% of the renewable portfolio standards are met by electrical energy produced by wind, solar energy, hydropower, landfill gas, waste to energy, geothermal resources, ocean thermal conversion, wave energy, biomass, including municipal solid waste, biofuels, or fuels derived from renewable energy, or fuel cells where the fuel is derived from

renewable sources.

SB 3172

RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES.

EIA, CPH

Requires each electric utility company to establish an energy efficiency portfolio standard that acquires additional energy efficiency equivalent to a designated percentage of the electric utility company's annual

growth in demand.



SB 3173

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

EIA, CPH

Establishes an alternative fuels portfolio standard, requiring a

percentage of all new motor vehicles sold in the State to be powered by

alternative fuels, starting in 2008.

SB 3185

RELATING TO ENERGY.

EIA, CPH

Establishes a statewide energy efficiency utility and energy efficiency

portfolio standards.
