SB 2615

RELATING TO CHILD PROTECTION.

HMS, JHW

Requires the department of human services to make a good faith effort to locate, identify, and interview extended family members for possible foster custody placement of a child and to set forth the procedures used

and steps taken in this regard in the dependency petition.

SB 2685

RELATING TO THE INVOLUNTARY TERMINATION OF

HMS, JHW

PARENTAL RIGHTS OF KANAKA MAOLI.

Creates a Native Hawaiian Child Welfare Act preventing the involuntary termination of parental rights of Kanaka Maoli thus protecting the cultural and traditional rights of the Native Hawaiian

people. This is also known as "The Kupuna Bill".

SB 3218

RELATING TO PLACEMENT OF HARMED CHILDREN.

HMS

Clarifies the importance of kinship placement for temporary foster placement and adoption; affirms the importance of the child's present attachment and bonding to present caregivers, whether kin or non-kin.

SB 2627

CHILD PROTECTIVE ACT.

HMS, WAM

Provides additional criteria for determining foster custodians. Appropriates funds for an evaluation of the State's temporary and

permanent foster care system. Adds new definitions.

SB 2162

RELATING TO FOSTER CHILDREN.

HMS, JHW

Allows foster children to apply for a driver's license with the written consent of the Department of Human Services. Requires a foster child's natural parents to pay for the child's car insurance and provides for free insurance if the child's parents are unable to pay. Allows higher education board allowances to be paid directly to former foster

children.

SB 2617

RELATING TO TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES.

HMS, WAM

Appropriates various amounts, including unspecified amounts, for various services to be funded from the increased federal fund ceiling

for the temporary assistance for needy families program.

SB 2636

RELATING TO THE AT-HOME INFANT CARE PROGRAM. Allows qualifying TANF recipients to act as full-time at-home caregivers for children under two years of age and to receive 90-100 per cent of the childcare subsidy the State would otherwise pay for the
