SB 2238	MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR ELECTRICITY PAYMENTS STATEWIDE. Makes an emergency appropriation for FY 2005-2006 to cover statewide budgetary shortfalls in electricity payments for facilities assigned to DAGS.	TGO, WAM
SB 2308	RELATING TO TAX CREDITS FOR RETROFITTING PRIVATE FACILITIES. Provides a tax credit for taxpayers that incur costs for planning, designing, constructing, or otherwise modifying private facilities, which reinforces the facility's integrity pursuant to civil defense specifications.	TGO, WAM
SB 2488	RELATING TO INCOME TAX CREDITS. Provides a tax credit for purchase of a hybrid motor vehicle.	TGO, WAM
