The following measures were previously heard on February 3, 2006:

SB 2268	RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR VIOLATIONS INVOLVING MINORS. Requires judges to suspend the driver's licenses of licensed drivers under the age of 21 when the drivers have been convicted of illegal possession of liquor and if the defendant does not yet have a driver's license. Postpones the defendant's eligibility to obtain a license until the defendant is 18 years of age or for 90 days, whichever period is longer. Allows a judge the discretion to permit limited driving for those with a suspended license, if there is a need to drive for employment or educational purposes.	TGO, JHW
SB 2053	RELATING TO THE FUEL TAX. Exempts county mass transit buses from the state fuel tax.	IGA/TGO, WAM
SB 2054	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. Amends definitions of motor vehicle for purposes of motor vehicle dealer licensing law to exclude vehicle bought by county to use in public transit system or for disabled. Authorizes state or county to purchase public transit vehicles from person who is not a licensed dealer.	TGO/IGA, CPH
SB 2065	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION. Clarifies that the motor vehicle owner is responsible for paying parking citations; clarifies that unpaid parking citations do not prevent the transfer of registration or ownership.	TGO/IGA, CPH
SB 2540	RELATING TO STATE HIGHWAY FUND. Allows moneys in the state highway fund to be used by the counties to construct and improve county roads.	TGO/IGA, WAM
SB 2745	RELATING TO ADVERTISING. Prohibits commercial advertising for consideration on vehicles.	TGO/IGA, JHW

SB 2746

RELATING TO OUTDOOR ADVERTISING.

TGO/IGA, JHW

Prohibits advertising on a vehicle engaged in business when the vehicle is operated or parked in a public place, or private place if viewed from a public place, if the primary purpose is advertising.

SB 2901

RELATING TO HIGHWAY IMPACT FEES.

TGO/IGA, WAM

Removes the restriction that allows only counties with a population of

greater than 500,000 to impose highway impact fees.
