WAH/EDT

SB 1035 RELATING TO MAKAHIKI DAY COMMEMORATION. WAH/EDT
Establishes each November 20th as the Makahiki Commemoration day.

SB 1585 RELATING TO HISTORIC SITES. WAH/EDT, WAM
Requires landowner of a potential native Hawaiian historical site on private property to obtain prior approval of the department of land and natural resources before conducting certain activities on the land; specifies procedures; defines "potential native Hawaiian historic site."

SB 768 RELATING TO EMERGENCY VEHICLES. WAH/TIA
Designates vehicles of the division of conservation and resources enforcement as authorized emergency vehicles.

SB 1361 RELATING TO ALOHA TOWER DEVELOPMENT WAH/TIA, WAM
CORPORATION.
Establishes a formal partnership between the Aloha Tower Development Corporation (ATDC) and the DOT - Harbors Division for the development of selected harbor infrastructure projects on an expedited basis to meet the critical demand for harbor expansion and upgrades.

SB 1367 RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS. TIA/EDT, WAM
Establishes the Office of International Affairs in DBEDT.

SB 1237 RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. TIA
Permits motor vehicle backup warning beepers to be disabled between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. if certain conditions are met.

SB 1238 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TIA, JDL
Prohibits motorcycle, motor scooter, and moped mufflers from emitting a noise level above an unspecified decibel level. Provides a graduated schedule of fines for first, second, and subsequent violations.

SB 1515 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. TIA, WAM
Increases fines imposed on users and tenants who violate chapter 266, the department's administrative rules, or any lawful command of any harbor master, agent, or district manager. Allows for a full recovery of fines imposed on the DOT for violations of federal and state air and water pollution laws committed by harbor users and tenants.

SB 1522 RELATING TO TRAFFIC ABSTRACTS. TIA, JDL
Clarifies the content requirements for traffic abstracts.

SB 1528 RELATING TO TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS. TIA, JDL
Clarifies that all traffic violations subject to the penalty provisions of section 291C-161, Hawaii Revised Statutes (statewide traffic code; penalties), are treated as civil matters pursuant to chapter 291D (traffic offenses; administrative adjudication).

SB 1529 RELATING TO TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS. TIA, JDL
Expands scope of traffic infractions law to include infractions committed by minors. Permits concurrent trials and clarifies requirements. Clarifies citation form requirements. Authorizes use of electronic citations.

SB 1569 RELATING TO CHAPTER 291, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES. TIA, JDL
Clarifies penalties for violating state motor vehicle operation and equipment requirements.

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.


