SD1 (SSCR579) Requires the department of education, in a partnership with the

department of health, to establish a three-year food waste recycling pilot project within public school districts. Makes an appropriation from the environmental management special fund for this purpose.

SD1 (SSCR546) Increases the volume limit of deposit beverage containers from 64 to 68 fluid ounces. Requires distributors to report container numbers sold

SB 672 (SSCR165)	RELATING TO INMATE REINTEGRATION PROGRAMS. SB 855 (SSCR105)	RELATING TO CORRECTIONS. Appropriates funds to the department of public safety to provide a cognitive restructuring and transition program in the county of Hawaii.	PBS, WAM
SB 910 SD1 (SSCR166)	RELATING TO CORRECTIONS. Establishes a two-year pilot day reporting center administered by the department of public safety. Appropriates funds. (SD1)	PBS, WAM

SB 919 SD1 (SSCR108)	RELATING TO CORRECTIONS. Requires the mainland branch of the department of public safety's corrections division to collect quarterly reports on the condition of Hawaii resident inmates housed in mainland prisons under the Interstate Corrections Compact. (SD1)	PBS, WAM
SB 914 SD1 (SSCR107)	RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES OF COMMITTED PERSONS. Appropriates \$500,000, for each year of the fiscal biennium to the department of public safety to improve mental health services for committed persons in Hawaii prisons. Requires two reports to the legislature. (SD1)	PBS, WAM
SB 1112 (SSCR193)	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Appropriates funds to the department of public safety and the office of youth services for the expansion of gender-responsive community based programs for women and girls.	PBS/HSP, WAM
SB 1174 SD1 (SSCR109)	RELATING TO INCARCERATED PARENTS. Appropriates funds for the expansion of incarcerated parent-child interaction programs, such as the Strengthening Keiki of Incarcerated Parents Project, at state correctional facilities and institutions servicing other offender populations. (SD1)	PBS, WAM
SB 1484 (SSCR171)	RELATING TO THE GARNISHMENT OF COMMITTED PERSONS' MONEYS. Authorizes DPS to garnish inmate wages to pay court ordered crime victim compensation fees.	PBS, WAM
SB 1489 SD1 (SSCR172)	RELATING TO THE HAWAII PAROLING AUTHORITY. Provides for the extension of Hawaii paroling authority board members from part-time to full-time work; provides that salaries are to be set by the governor with the guidance of the current executive salary commission report. Appropriates funds for the resulting increase in salary and additional equipment needs. (SD1)	PBS, WAM
SB 1491 (SSCR173)	RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. Authorizes the use of the controlled substance registration revolving fund to offset the cost of the DPS Narcotic Enforcement Division's forensic drug laboratory and costs associated with investigating violations.	PBS, WAM
