Upon being presented by the Chair, Governor Sanches made the following remarks:

"I am truly privileged, ladies and gentlemen, to address this body. I did not think I would be asked to speak, but being given this privilege, I would like to express a very heartfelt Mabuhay from another group of islands across the sea - the Philippines - which, unfortunately, has more than 7,300 islands and quite a number of people.

I come from a developing country in Southeast Asia. I've been invited here to speak, in a few days, about business and trade and our efforts to improve the economy of a country with a burgeoning 43 million people. I say it is developing, because, well, we are a part of a group of 77 countries, now 110, which is making an earnest effort to uplift the well-being of our people. And there is much we can learn from the developed part of the world there is much you in this part of the world can do to assist us by means of trade and by means of investments. And just to show the dramatic difference between what is happening in this part and what is happening in our part, I looked into some statistics and it indicates, for example, that Hawaii with a population of 850,000 people has a State Gross National Product reaching up to one-half of our own nation's GNP with 43 million people.

And so, my message to the people of Hawaii is, on the one hand, the GNP is our challenge in my country and what has been achieved in your State has been tremendous so that you are truly a very fortunate people and we hope that one day we will also be just as fortunate as you are.

### THIRD READING

# H.B. No. 2253-76

Representative Shito moved that H.B. No. 2253-76, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Cayetano.

At this time, Representative Shito rose to speak in favor of passage of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, the purpose of this bill is to provide a more equitable formula for lessees desiring to purchase the leased fee interest in their properties.

During the last legislative session, Act 184 was enacted to facilitate the implementation of the Land Reform Act of 1967, thus increasing the opportunities for lessees to convert their properties from leasehold to fee. It utilizes a formula based on the current fair market value of the lot excluding onsite improvements, less any replacement costs of existing offsite improvements. During the implementation of this Act, however, it was discovered that this formula is difficult to effectuate when it is not stated whether the lessee or the lessor paid for the offsite improvements. An inequity was also encountered under the present formula, in that the lessee is not credited for the number of years remaining of his lease. Additionally, despite passsage of this Act, prices still remain beyond the reach of the majority of lessees in the State.

H.B. No. 2253-76 is designed to alleviate the aforementioned problems and to reduce the lessee's purchase price, while equitably compensating the lessor. This bill utilizes the discount method, generally used by appraisers, banks and other financial institutions to measure the value of the leased fee. The leasehold purchase price is derived by adding the lease rental income stream and the value of the reversionary interest. The lessee is thus credited for the number of years remaining of his lease.

Additionally, H.B. No. 2253-76 clarifies and makes more equitable the repurchase option of the Authority.

This bill would make it possible for more persons to convert their property from lease to fee, and I therefore urge all House members to vote in favor of H.B. No. 2253-76.

Thank you."

Representative Hakoda then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of H.B. No. 2253-76, HD 1. The 1975 Legislature passed and the Governor enacted S.B. No. 1200, CD 1, to facilitate the implementation of the Land Reform Act of 1967. However, the cost of purchasing lease land is still beyond the reach of many of Hawaii's lessees. H.B. No. 2253-76, HD 1, will provide a more equitable formula in determining the purchase price to be paid by those desiring to purchase the leased fee interest of their properties. H.B. No. 2253-76, HD 1, is a good bill as it will make it possible for more of Hawaii's people to attain their goal of becoming land owners instead of temporary 'users' of land belonging to others. Therefore, I urge the members of this honorable body to vote 'aye' on H.B. No. 2253-76, HD 1. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Sutton then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against this bill because I am afraid that we are falling into something that constitutes a violation of a due process inhibitions of the 14th amendment of the U.S. Constitution and the inhibitions of our own Constitution on equal protection of the law.

We have passed and we have had, and it is in negotiation now, a bill which allows the various land owners to renegotiate leases on a basis of 4%. Mr. Speaker, if you will be kind enough to turn to page 2 of this bill, it states that we will use a discount rate which shall be based on the maximum rate of return for insured passbook which is now 51% and we will add thereto 3 3/4% which would take it to 9%. In other words, we have passed legislation which on one hand says 4% will be the figure which is to be used for renegotiation, and then when we come to what, in for all intents and purposes is a condemnation statute and comes under all inhibitions, which you, Mr. Speaker, as a lawyer know to exist, those inhibitions would prohibit the discrepancy of 5 percentage points when you're leasing and using discount tables.

Now, these discount tables are called the inward tables and they are the present value of one deferred so much. You then get a factor. We capitalize the income stream, say for thirty years. Representative Shito had on the board an example where there was a graduation in the leases. Now, we had to take two basic assumptions there - assumptions that a court of law will not take. We had to assume what the lease would be six years hence and then he had to assume, under his example, what the fair market value of a piece of property would be twenty years hence - and he took the fair market value as of today.

And yet, Mr. Speaker, we know that with the inflation rate that the fair market value does not stay stable; therefore, when we took that assumption, we had a false assumption and we compounded the felony, if I may so use language

which you and I use in criminal proceedings. We compounded the felony by taking an arbitrary discount figure which was 5 percentage points above the 4% that they were allowed.

Mr. Speaker, we are a body of learned men here and we do not want to engage in passing anything that is unconstitutional. We do not help the property owners, particularly in the leasehold areas. And, incidentally, mine is not a leasehold area that I come from, but I will be very honest on that , that Kamehameha School is on my property. But, Mr. Speaker, what I am concerned about is that we have incorporated a violation of the due process of law by having a percentage formula of 9 percentage points. Now, when you take a discount table, Mr. Speaker, the higher the percentage, the lower the value of your reversion. In other words, if you take a 20% rediscount figure, then you're going to have a very very low figure for your reversion. If you took a low rediscount rate, say at such as 4%, then you would find yourself with a considerably higher reversion.

Now, under the example that Mr. Shito gave us, we take a capitalization of the rental stream . . . . . "

Representative Cobb, on a point of order, stated:

"Names are not to be mentioned on the House Floor. If he's referring to the Chairman on Housing then he should refer to him by position rather than by name."

Representative Sutton then continued, stating:

"I strike that, Mr. Speaker. The eminent Chairman of the Housing Committee who did a wonderful job of explaining this to us. Now, these present value tables that we use have been distributed to all of the members of the Committee, and we used those tables and we could see very vividly that if you took 9%, your reversion was considerably less than if you took 4%.

What scares me is we're gonna pass something that's just gonna tie this all up in the courts. I move, Mr. Speaker, that we reconsider. And, this is a motion to reconsider."

The Chair then stated:

"Motion dies for lack of a second."

At 12:01 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 12: 10 o'clock p.m., Representative Lum rose and asked:

"I would like to request a ruling from the Speaker as to my ability to vote on this measure or participate in any kind of arguments for or against this. I am an owner of a leasehold land."

The Chair ruled "no conflict".

Representative Lum then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of this particular measure and, in doing so, I would like to clarify some of the assumptions that are made on this bill.

First of all, this bill relates to land that has been condemned, land which is probably going to be ending up in the area of the Hawaii Housing Authority, and the desire or want to sell the land has already been eliminated because of the procedure set up by law. This particular bill does not prohibit anybody from negotiating on an individual basis, and I want to cite a particular article written in the PACIFIC BUSINESS NEWS talking about leasehold property in my district. And in that particular article the person who is the land owner is talking about the profitability of selling fee simple land. But I want to point out some of the differences besides the fact that it's not condemned land.

The other difference in this particular situation is that the land owner probably does not have the amount of income that a big land owner like the Bishop Estate or the Campbell Estate or any of these other big land owners; so therefore, it would not be a problem with taxes if they were to sell a piece of property.

There is a tax advantage to the land owner if condemnation is implied or is brought about and so, therefore, the land owner selling the property would not have to pay the heavy taxation that is levied on him if in fact there is no condemnation.

This particular bill also addresses itself to a particular method of arriving at the fee simple fee interest. I'd like to point out also that this particular property would not have the value that it has without the

improvements. So, the fact that the lessee did in fact put a house on that property just multiplied the value of that particular property.

It is important that we realize that this will be a guideline as to how they would arrive at this fee interest, and therefore it need not be the only method used if in fact the parties will agree.

I want to also cite the particular observation made by Robert Neff in his article in the PACIFIC BUSINESS NEWS that, using the formula, the individuals would probably pay a higher per square foot than was offered by the land owner. So, therefore, this is a clear example whereby if it benefits the lessee, he can, in fact, go ahead and negotiate for a lower fee per foot rate.

I'd like to encourage everybody to vote for this and I only hope that the Senate, in their wisdom, will pass this bill out as is and, if amended, this House will further agree.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Kunimura then rose and stated:

"I'm speaking on behalf of the Housing Committee - I'm a member and I'm speaking for this bill because I cannot stand individuals rising on the Floor of this House threatening that whatever we do is unconstitutional. We have learned long ago in grade school that our country, the system of government is divided . . . . ."

Representative Ajifu, on a point of order, stated:

"I think the speaker should be speaking in reference to the subject matter and not to the argument that was said by the previous speaker."

Representative Kunimura then continued, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I shall come to that. But, coming from the country and also like Missouri, I have to he shown

Mr. Speaker, this House and this Legislature will be hog-tied forever if we try to listen to people who say that certain acts will be unconstitutional. Mr. Speaker, this bill may thread in a gray area as far as the constitutionality is concerned, but, Mr. Speaker, this country is great because legislators, both

nationally and locally, thread in gray areas to alleviate the plight of the masses. And, Mr. Speaker, I'm going to vote for this bill because if this bill is unconstitutional then let the court decide that; but if we are going to back down because somebody pulls this bugaboo, then this problem will not be solved for another thousand years."

Representative Cobb then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, one of the previous speakers remarked on the idea of reversion, and I think perhaps an example might be in order. It was considered at some point in the Committee and is also the reality of the problem facing us today. Part of the testimony given was that if this bill were enacted there would be an incentive to charge higher leases. Yet, when we look at the practical effect of applying inward tables, exactly the opposite is true. For if the lessor wants to maintain a high interest in the property for sale purposes in fee, then it's very much to his advantage and his interest to charge the lowest possible lease; otherwise, the inward tables as applied on a discount basis, would clearly recognize the lessee's future value in the land and deduct that from the raw land value. Accordingly, Mr. Speaker, I think the Housing chairman has spent the better part of the year wrestling with this particular problem during the interim and during the earlier part of this session. I'd like to commend his efforts and urge all of my colleagues to vote in favor of this measure. Thank you."

Representative Sutton then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, just in rebuttal of the three previous speakers, if I may. There are a couple of points that have been brought out that I think we ought to clarify. If you will visualize on an imaginary blackboard, Mr. Speaker, how we work this capitalization. We use the present value of one, deferred so many years. We multiply that factor times. . . ."

Representative Shito, upon being recognized, stated:

"I think that point was made on his elaboration on his initial speech and I don't think we should elaborate further." The Chair then stated:

"Representative Sutton could you summarize it briefly."

Representative Sutton then stated:

"Yes. Why I wanted to show that was that this will encourage the lessor to make much higher rentals on his property so as to get the maximum capitalization. When you multiply a large figure times a factor, and that factor is constant, you will therfore get a higher capitalization. It is therefore to the benefit of the lessor to establish higher lease rentals, and therefore we will be working the inverse of what our original intent was and that was to have reasonable rentals. But because of the fact that we have established a discount table, established a proposition that there be no inflation and that market value be established which will be the same twenty years hence and then work the reversion that way - the only thing that is a variable in this formula, after the two false assumptions, is a variable of increased rental; therfore, it would be to their benefit to have a higher lease rental which would be to the detriment

of our constituents. Thank you, sir."

The motion to pass H.B. No. 2253-76, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO RESIDENTIAL LEASEHOLDS" on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a Roll Call vote of 44 ayes to 3 noes, with Representatives Amaral, Kamalii and Sutton voting no, and Representatives Ikeda, Machida, Oda and Yuen being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 2253-76, HD 1, had passed Third Reading at 12:20 o'clock p.m.

At this time, Representative Kunimura introduced 12 senior citizens from Kauai who were accompanied by Ms. Ellie Lloyd and Reverend Chun.

### ADJOURNMENT

At 12: 24 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Kimura, seconded by Representative Ajifu and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned until 11: 30 o'clock a.m. on Wednesday, February 18, 1976 in honor and memory of the late Representative Frank Chase Judd.

# H.B. No. 2099-76, HD 1:

Representative Suwa moved that H.B. No. 2099-76, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Akizaki.

Representative Suwa then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of House Bill 2099-76, House Draft 1.

This bill relates to the Statutes Revision Program and, in particular, to the updating of the Hawaii Revised Statutes. When the Statutes were published in 1968 as an eight volume set, it was contemplated that the individual volumes would be replaced from time to time.

This bill will authorize the initiation of this replacement program. An appropriation of \$75,000 will provide the necessary funds for the updating of Volume 4. Two volumes will be issued to supersede the original Volume 4 and the bulky pocket supplement. The new volumes will be numbered 4 and 4A. They will be most useful and serviceable to persons researching the laws of Hawaii.

Mr. Speaker, I urge the members of this honorable body to pass House Bill 2099-76, House Draft 1, on Third Reading."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 2099-76, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR

AN ACT RELATING TO STATUTE REVISION", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a roll call vote of 41 ayes, with Representatives Ajifu, Amaral, Evans, Kawakami, Larsen, Lunasco, Oda, Peters, Uechi and Yap being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 2099-76 had passed Third Reading at 11:48 o'clock a.m.

## THIRD READING

# H.B. No. 1998-76, H.D. 1:

Representative Suwa moved that H.B. No. 1998-76, H.D. 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Akizaki.

Representative Sutton then rose and inquired whether or not the Chairman of the Finance Committee would yield to a question to which Representative Suwa answered, "Yes."

## Representative Sutton asked:

"Mr. Chairman, we have a doctrine in the law that you cannot sue the sovereign. You have here an exception to that—your Committee has passed out numerous judgments and receipts, etc. that total \$70,000. Are you satisfied in your own mind that these claims are valid?"

Representative Garcia then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, point of order. I believe the question should be addressed to the Chair and not to the Chairman."

The Chair answered:

"You are correct. Representative Sutton?"

Representative Sutton continued:

"Mr. Speaker, is the Chairman satisfied that these claims are valid?"

Representative Suwa answered:

"Mr. Speaker, the answer is 'yes' and if the Representative would like to look at some of the transactions, he is welcome to do so."

Representative Sutton then said, "Thank you, sir."

Representative Suwa then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of House Bill 1998-76, House Draft 1.

This bill approves 31 individual claims against the State, and provides legislative relief by appropriating \$69,742.72 to meet the payment of the claims. The claims fall into four general categories, as follows: (1) refund of taxes; (2) judgments against the State and settlement of claims; (3) refund of unclaimed property escheated to the State: and (4) miscellaneous claims for damages to property and loss of property.

The claims were transmitted to this Legislature by the Department of Budget and Finance in accordance with statutory procedures.

Mr. Speaker, I urge the members of this honorable body to pass House Bill 1998-76, House Draft 1, on Third Reading. Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 1998-76, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE RELIEF OF CERTAIN PERSONS' CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE AND PROVIDING APPROPRIATIONS THEREFOR", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a roll call vote of 48 ayes to 1 no, with Representative Sutton voting no, and Representatives Segawa and Yuen being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 1998-76 passed Third Reading at 11:57 o'clock a.m.

#### SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Kimura, seconded by Representative Ajifu and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering a bill on Third Reading on the basis of a modified consent calendar.

#### THIRD READING

### H.B. No. 2161-76, H.D. 1:

Representative Suwa moved that H.B. No. 2161-76, H.D. 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Akizaki.

Representative Suwa then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of House Bill 2161-76, House Draft 1.

This bill authorizes the Deputy Director of Finance to sign State bonds with the approval of the Governor. When pressing matters have required the attention and presence of the Director in the State at a time when bonds were ready for signing out of State, the Director has not been able to delegate this ministerial task to the Deputy Director. This bill therefore provides a reasonable and proper solution to this problem in the administration of the Department of Budget and Finance.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I urge this body to pass House Bill 2161-76, House Draft 1 on Third Reading."

Representative Cobb rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against House Bill 2161-76, as amended. The reasons for doing so are contained both in the Committee Report as well as in the current bond situation that we face in the State of Hawaii today.

Paragraph 5 of the Committee Report states and I quote: 'the responsibility of the Director for signing loans is purely a ministerial task and the delegation of this function to the Deputy Director is in the State's best interest.' Mr. Speaker, I must honestly question whether or not any signing of bonds when we are so close to our bonded limit at this time is in the State's best interest.

Paragraph 3 of the Committee Report says that this authority should be allowed to provide maximum administrative flexibility in the operations of the Department of Budget and Finance. Mr. Speaker, looking at the past and current budget practices of the State, I really wonder how it is possible to give the Department of Budget and Finance any more administrative flexibility than it has right now. In fact, we are faced with a situation in our own budget where approximately \$10 to \$15 million of State legislative appropriations have been withheld. Yet, we are being asked to consider a supplementary budget.

Right now, because of the State's critical bond situation, we are within a few hundred million dollars, less than two hundred, if I read the figures from the latest report, of our debt limit. The CIP, if released, could push us over our debt limit, and we have been considering a number of bills before the Transportation Committee and I know the Finance Committee has been hearing the same bill in the Arthur Young report changing the Special Fund which, if enacted, would automatically push us over our debt limit.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, any additional signing of bonds now with this situatuion is not just a ministerial task under these circumstances. We must remember that our bonded debt is now almost \$1,000 for every man, woman and child in the State of Hawaii and I personally feel that few matters are more pressing than the personal attention of the Director of the Department of Finance in this area; namely, that when a bond is to be signed, it should not be just a ministerial task. It should require the personal attention of the Director of the Department and if the trip is inconvenient, then so be it, Mr. Speaker. But everytime we sign another bond; everytime we consider additional CIP; everytime we pass another budget, we are adding to the long-term obligation that we and our children and their children are going to have.

I think, therefore, Mr. Speaker, the authority for signing should be limited strictly to the Director in view of this situation. Thank you."

Representative Suwa responded:

"Mr. Speaker, I notice the Speaker has diverted into the other areas as

far as the intent of the bill is concerned, but just to keep the record straight, Mr. Speaker, the interest rates on the bonds have been consummated.

This bill primarily gives the Deputy Director the opportunity to represent the State or the Director or the Governor in signing the bonds. In other words, as to the program on the amount of bonds floated or the annual amount, the Administration has a program of floating 150 million bonds because of unemployment and because of other needs in the State of Hawaii at the present time. Likewise, the State of Hawaii is a new State and is nowhere near some of the other states celebrating its 200th Bicentennial. Some of these states have stadiums built a long time ago and other improvements made to the airports, schools, universities, community colleges. I think it is time that Hawaii, being a young state, has to advance when the construction is needed.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, this bill primarily gives the Deputy Director authority to represent the State to sign the bonds which have already been consummated and the interest rates set. It takes time after it has been consummated on the interest rate and to have the printer print the bonds, and to that end, the Deputy Director represents the Director in signing on behalf of the State.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 2161-76, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO STATE BONDS", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 47 ayes to 2 noes, with Representatives Cobb and Sutton voting no, and Representatives Segawa and Yuen being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 2161-76 passed Third Reading at 12:05 o'clock p.m.

Representative Abercrombie, at this time, rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, this morning, I had the privilege and honor of being a witness, as one of 58 people appeared in the United States District Court of Judge Nils Tavares and were admitted as citizens to the United States of America. It was a very moving ceremony and, by way of announcement, I wanted to indicate to the rest of the members here and to the audience that perhaps some of us--I know I have--have occasionally forgotten what a profound privilege it is for us to serve here in the State Legislature, and it is ceremonies like people being admitted as citizens to the United States that reminds us of what privileges and responsibilities we have here. And I just wanted to say that this day is one of particularly profound and moving one for me as a Representative in the State of Hawaii and it made me recognize how I have to re-dedicate myself to the principles for which this nation stands and for which this Legislature stands as a state in that union."

Representative Carroll then rose and inquired whether or not the Chairman of the Environmental Protection Committee would yield to a question.

The Chair replied:

Representative Blair then answered:

"I will yield to the question; I don't guarantee an answer."

Representative Carroll then asked:

"Mr. Speaker, last year, Representative Blair introduced legislation which would have the effect of abolishing my home. This year, he is attempting, apparently, to abolish my yacht club, and my question is, what next?"

Representative Blair replied:

"My eyes are on his Jaguar next."

Representative Suwa then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, before making my Committee announcement, I hope that the rededication of Representative Abercrombie means that he will have a conservative outlook."

"Mr. Speaker, I am deeply concerned about Waimano Home and I am deeply concerned that the Federal government has indicated that we are not doing our proper job there. I would like to ask the Chairman if we intend to do more than just a resolution."

Representative Segawa replied:

"Mr. Speaker, this resolution calls for a study of the community placement program, foster parents and boarding homes and half-way homes for the mentally retarded. Our Committee hearings have centered a lot in regards to Waimano Home.

The resolution will look into this concept of deinstitutionalizing Waimano Home from the present patient load of approximately 650 patients to bring this down to approximately 350 patients by 1979. This is a new concept to decentralize Waimano Home, and to place these many patients out into the community is a great concern for the Committee. We do not want these patients just placed in any old home or in any old way. Therefore, the Committee has included in the budget almost \$2 million to Waimano Home for the purpose of upgrading Waimano Home to provide a stepped-up and up-graded program at Waimano Home, while at the same time working on a program to decentralize in placing patients out in the community in half-way homes, boarding homes, group homes, and foster homes. At the same time, we have alloted from this sum (\$2,000,000) to be spent for day activities, sheltered workshops in the areas that do not have them now--Lahaina on Maui, Windward and Leeward areas of Oahu--while, at the same time, trying to maintain the current services that are provided by non-profit private organizations in the different parts of the islands throughout the State.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, this study will look into how the Department of Health plans to implement this program, and we want to bring in a report to this body so that we can report that the program is being done in an organized, coordinated and systematic manner. And we hope that next year, when this plan has already been implemented, we may be able to report back to this body that this program is going along the way that we have reported.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Sutton rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, the excellent answer given by the Chairman satisfies my immediate concerns. However, the proof of the pudding, Mr. Speaker, is in the eating. We look forward to seeing some real results. Thank you, sir."

# INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

On motion by Representative Kawakami, seconded by Representative Yamada and carried, H.R. No. 316 was adopted.

At this time, Representative Kawakami introduced to the members of the House Mr. Ronald Linsky, Director of the Sea Grant College Program, and Mrs. Rose Pfund, coordinator of Makahiki-Kai.

Certified copies of House Resolution No. 316 were then presented to Mr. Linsky and Mrs. Pfund by Representative Kawakami.

At 12:04 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair, for the purpose of meeting with the guests.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:03 o'clock p.m.

By unanimous consent, the following resolutions (H.R. Nos. 317 to 319) and concurrent resolution (H.C.R. No. 52) were referred to the Committee on Legislative Management and further action was deferred until tomorrow, March 2, 1976:

## THIRD READING

The following bills, which were on the calendar for Third Reading, were read throughout, and the following actions taken:

## H.B. No. 2228-76, H.D. 1:

On motion by Representative Yamada, seconded by Representative Yap and carried, H.B. No. 2228-76, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE MOTOR CARRIER LAW", passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Kiyabu and Carroll being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 2228-76 had passed Third Reading at 12:05 o'clock p.m.

# H.B. No. 2127-76:

Representative Yamada moved that H.B. No. 2127-76, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Yap.

Representative Sutton then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I wanted to ask a question. This duces tecum seems to me to equate -- to give that power to the Consumer Protector. Seems to me you're equating the Consumer Protector to being the judge. There are adequate..."

The Chair interrupted:

"Representative Sutton, are you speaking for or against the bill?"

Representative Sutton replied:

"No, Mr. Speaker, I wanted to ask the Chairman a question. Would the Chairman yield?"

Representative Yamada said: "Yes, I will, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Sutton then asked:

"Mr. Speaker, what I wanted to know is this--why do we have to give this power to the Consumer Protector if. . . the Committee Report indicates that he already can go into court and ask the judge for this. Mr. Speaker, we are deviating a long ways from the common law. We have in our constitution a proposition of. . ."

Representative Kunimura, at this point, rose and stated:

"Point of order, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair recognized Representative Kunimura and he went on to say:

"Is this a point of information or debate against the bill?"

The Chair replied:

"Representative Kunimura is absolutely correct. Representative Sutton, will you please ask the question and refrain from making any arguments or statements regarding the bill."

Representative Sutton continued, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like the Chairman to answer me why we need to give these additional powers to the Consumer Frotector?"

Representative Yamada replied:

"Mr. Speaker, presently, the Consumer Protection Office can ask for a subpoena duces tecum but that can occur only after an action is filed. With this bill, they can have this power prior to an action being filed to ascertain whether, in fact, there is reason to believe that action should be brought against any person."

Representative Sutton then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, then I wish to speak against this bill."

The Chair asked Representative Sutton to "proceed."

Representative Sutton proceeded, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in my opinion, the Chairman has just indicated that there is a mechanism there; there is a procedure; there is a proposition. It seems to me, Mr. Speaker, that we are encouraging the Consumer Protector to go on fishing expeditions; to go under the safe and small businesses and go and get whatever record he possesses, and it will be a club in his hands which I think will be overly coercive. We are interested in protecting the consumer, Mr. Speaker, but we certainly are not interested in having something where the Consumer Protector becomes something that holds a club over the small businessmen or the individual who does not immediately have the ability to get his attorney to help him. We certainly have the mechanism that

the Chairman has just indicated at the present time.

Mr. Speaker, I do not feel that we need to give this additional encroachment on the common law to the Consumer Protector. As you recall, the Fifth Amendment says that 'there shall be no illegal search and seizure.' That is, of course, for criminal concept but we have the same concept.

Representative Roehrig interrupted:

"Mr. Speaker, point of order."

The Chair asked Representative Roehrig to state his point and Representative Roehrig went on to say: "Mr. Speaker, I believe that's the Fourth Amendment."

Representative Sutton continued, stating:

"Excuse me, I stand corrected. Did I say the Fifth? It's the Fourth. Would you please have that stricken, Mr. Speaker?

But the whole concept -- and I am glad that the Chairman of our Judiciary corrected me because this idea of illegal search and seizure is a very basic one in our common law. It is a very basic constitutional protection and, all of a sudden, we are giving this Consumer Protector the whole way of going on a fishing expedition, as you and I, as attorneys, call it, Mr. Speaker. We call it a fishing expedition. Those are words of art and we do not wish to see that this particular power of going on a fishing expedition is given to the Consumer Protector. We do not want to arm him with a club, Mr. Speaker, and therefore I would move that my colleagues would vote 'no'."

The Chair then recognized Representative Lum who stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I have a few questions myself. I rise on a point of information. Will the Chairman of the Committee yield to a question?"

Representative Yamada answered:

"I will, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Lum then asked:

"As I understand this bill, we are allowing the Consumer Protector to now subpoena other than just the individuals but includes books, papers, documents or any other kind of relevant material as determined by the Consumer Protector."

Representative Yamada replied:

"Yes."

Representative Lum then asked:

"Does this mean also that he has to go to court to do this or can he just do this from his office?"

Representative Yamada replied:

"Mr. Speaker, he can just do it from his office."

Representative Lum further asked:

"Is there any other additional personnel or staffing that has to be assigned to this office in order to do this?"

Representative Yamada said, "No, Mr. Speaker, it is not necessary."

Representative Lum stated:

"Mr. Speaker, then I rise to speak against this particular measure.

As I understand this bill as presented by the Chairman of this Committee, this bill will give the power to the Consumer Protector to bring in any kinds of books, papers, and documents which may be confidential to that particular business, into his office for him to look and investigate and look over to see if there is a proper claim. I think this is a very, very bad precedence to start, especially since the Consumer Protector does not, in my opinion, have the ability of that of a judge.

There are several problems here. First of all, the issue is not too clear as to why he is being brought in. Maybe a complaint has come in, but there has not been any kind of clear issue determined and maybe there will be some kind of procedure set up to determine a clear issue but, without this clear issue, this individual may not know whether he should be getting an attorney or not, and most businessmen are like all of us that are not attorneys, we don't really know what our legal rights are.

This particular bill will allow the Consumer Protector to bring that individual in, ask him to bring in all his documents, and then they can look at these particular materials to see whether there is a case or not.

I am very, very suspicious as to the type of personnel that may be in the Consumer Protector's office as far as the secrecy, as far as the confidentiality that might be kept in this regard, and I feel that it can be used or abused if the wrong Consumer Protector is there. I feel should have been given to the Judiciary Committee and I am surprised that this particular bill was referred to Consumer Protection and Commerce. I think the intent of this bill is to set up another court and I really am hesitant to allow such power in the particular Consumer Protector's hands.

As seen through the previous Consumer Protectors, one is presently a member of this particular body; there is another that is presently on the staff of one of our executives in the State of Hawaii and also you can see that this may be a stepping ground into a political arena. This kind of power put in the hands of an individual would probably be very, very damaging to certain sectors of our community.

As a member of the Senate, I know that we look very closely to the selection of judges. In fact, the issue of the selection of judges has become an issue for Constitutional Convention as to qualifications and so on. But I am not too sure that the members of the body, especially the Senate, look that closely at the Consumer Protector. Therefore, I request, Mr. Speaker, that the members of this body seriously consider what they are doing here, possibly maybe recommitting it back into Judiciary Committee. If not, I urge all the members of this body to vote 'no'."

Representative Yamada then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of this bill. It seems from the comments of the prior speakers that they seem to be afraid of something that is not there.

Under our present rules of said procedure, in order to file a subpoena duces tecum, really all you do is fill out a form and it's kind of a proforma matter that the Clerk then puts a seal on and the subpoena is served, and if the person upon whom the subpoena is served feels that such a subpoena is unreasonable, then they can make a motion in court

to quash or to limit the subpoena duces tecum.

Now, under this bill, all we are doing is saying that the Office of Consumer Protection itself can sign a subpoena if, after such subpoena is signed and it is served and the person upon which it is served feels that it is unreasonable, or feels that it is a fishing expedition, then all that person has to do is file a motion in court as is our practice now and quash that subpoena. So I don't think we are really changing our present rules radically by this bill or making the Consumer Protection Office a judge. I really don't see how they can get that interpretation.

I might also add presently that this power of subpoena duces tecum prior to filing of suit—that the Attorney General also has it. I would just like to add, Mr. Speaker, and members of this body, that in the Office of Consumer Protection, one of its primary functions is as an investigatory body and that we have empowered the Office of Consumer Protection to protect consumerism in the State. This bill would give that office just another tool to fulfill that mission. Such being the case, Mr. Speaker, I urge all members to vote 'aye'."

Representative Abercrombie then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to rise to speak in favor of the bill. I don't think anyone in the chamber is more wary than I of the encroachment in the area of privacy; that we should obey the Constitution; that we shouldn't have government agencies coming into the area of activities of private citizens where it is not warranted; and this bill does not do that. On the contrary, when I read through it and I read through it again, I am looking at it very closely, I want to point out, perhaps in reiteration of the Chairman's comments, but from a layman's point of view, that obedience to the subpoena may be enforced by the Circuit Court. That is to say, the way I read this, that if the subpoena has been issued arbitrarily or capriciously by the Consumer Protector, that the Court will strike it down. I think we are looking at it from the wrong end. What we are trying to do here is enable the Consumer Protector to, in fact, protect us and I have discovered in conversations with the Consumer Protector over issues that I am interested in, in terms of protecting the consuming public, that that office

is not sufficiently empowered now to carry on its basic activities. What it needs to have here, in terms of books, papers, documents and objects and so on, seems relevant to or material to the inquiry. It is absolutely essential if the citizen is not going to get involved in a long and protracted court suit where he does not have or she does not have the opportunity to have the services of an attorney.

While looking at this, I would ask those who are opposing the bill to stop and take a look and see whether they are not coming at this from the wrong end. What we are trying to do here is avoid going into lenghty and expensive court situations and enable the Consumer Protector to carry out the functions of that office.

Thank you."

Representative Sutton rose and upon being recognized, asked:

"Mr. Speaker, may I have a rebuttal?"

The Chair directed Representative Sutton to "proceed."

Representative Sutton proceeded, stating:

"The Chairman and the last speaker have indicated that this would not require any legal expertise and yet the rules of civil procedure indicate that there must be a motion to quash if you think that the other party is going on a fishing expedition or if you wish to limit the amount of the relevancy concerning the duces tecum. The mere fact of those words, Mr. Speaker, means 'to grab'. This is from the Latin 'duceo, ducare, ducates'. We are going to grab; we are going to seize. In this bicentennial year, I think it is highly inappropriate that we should breach the basic concepts of the Fourth Amendment.

Thank you, sir."

Representative Yamada then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I would just like to comment on the prior speaker's comments that I don't think a motion to quash is a motion to grab. A motion to quash is a defense as to whether a person has to obey the subpoena duces tecum."

Representative Kimura rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of the bill.

What my colleague from the 15th District is really alluding to is the violation of the doctrine of quare clausum fregit. And we have really, not a question of the Fourth Amendment as to unreasonable searches and seizures, but it really refers to an invasion of privacy. The action of the Consumer Protector, Mr. Speaker, in this instance the cause of his investigation is civil in nature and what it is is although it presently has the power to subpoena, which is to order the body of the person in, this gives him the added power to bring his books and his records, and many times a person is brought before an examining body, whether it be judicial or administrative in nature, if he does not bring in the pertinent documents, his examination oftentimes is not very definitive and final, and again, as I said, Mr. Speaker, this does not violate the doctrine of quare clausum fregit in any way."

Representative Lum rose and stated:

"I think that the previous speakers on that side of the aisle have made my point--that this would allow the Consumer Protector to bring in books, papers and documents at the time he is investigating. Now, the present law says that he can bring in the individual -- any director, officer, employee, or agent of any business organization but it says nothing about his documents. That is what I am afraid of. If we give this power to the Consumer Protector, he will bring in the documents which may be privileged information for that particular businessman and that is the reason why I think this kind of opening up so that the particular individual director, Consumer Protector, whoever he is, and might I remind you, that particular position, since I have been in office, has changed hands at least three times and most of those people have become political animals. I fear that this particular power put in the wrong hands of the individuals that is placed there can be very detrimental to this community and to some sectors of the community."

Representative Kimura then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, one last point in rebuttal to the previous speaker-and that is what I think he fears is essentially a presumption that the Consumer Protector and our appointed and elected officers are going to be adversaries to fairness and equity. I would rather proceed on the assumption, when he is appointed and with the confirmation of the Senate, that a man of integrity and a man of honor will be in that position. And if his powers are abusive as pointed out previously by the Chairman of the Committee on Consumer Protection that there are means in which his powers may be held in check."

At this time, Representative Ajifu asked for a roll call vote and the Chair replied: "If no objections, so ordered."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. "Mr. Speaker and honorable body, I would like to give some background on Mr. Mark--what he has accomplished. He is a member of the College of Continuing Education and Community Service. Last year, a year ago, with the invasion of our so-called National Guard, Mr. Mark took it upon himself to assist and give free time to the inmatesto give them classes in ukulele. # SUSPENSION OF RULES

Representative Kimura moved that the rules of the House be suspended for the purpose of considering Third Reading bills on the basis of a modified consent calendar, seconded by Representative Ajifu.

Representative Sutton then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, can I have discussion?"

The Chair directed Representative Sutton to "proceed."

Representative Sutton proceeded, stating:

"We have Third Reading. This will become the law of the State of Hawaii and I think it is very important that we hear discussions on it. It has to do with the question of whether or not we will have a preference for Hawaii goods."

Representative Kimura rose on

a point of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, the Third Reading by the consent calendar does not preclude debate. It is only a matter of calling for the vote but I think my colleague from the 15th District is afraid that debate will be cut out and this is not the case."

Representative Abercrombie then rose on a point of order and upon being recognized by the Chair stated:

"Mr. Speaker, the Representative from the 15th District is mistaking that if it passes Third Reading in the House, that it becomes the law of the State of Hawaii. I believe that there is still another house for it to get to. I know it is sometimes difficult to find out where that other place is but I understand it exists."

The motion to suspend the rules was put by the Chair and carried. Representative Sutton voiced a 'no' vote.

No. 1185, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO DISCLOSURE BY LIQUID FUEL DISTRIBUTORS", passed Third Reading by a vote of 41 ayes, with Representatives Evans, Inaba, Kiyabu, Lee, Machida, Mizuguchi, Peters, Santos, Shito and Takamine being excused.

# H.B. No. 2087-76:

Representative Suwa moved that H.B. No. 2087-76, having been

read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Akizaki.

Representative Sutton then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, this particular bill would change the present law. Under the present law, a person may claim preference for low bid purposes on any public works or repair or maintenance contract when the specifications include Hawaii products. . ."

At this point, Representative Kimura rose on a point of order, stating:

"Point of order, Mr. Speaker. I think the speaker should state his position whether he is for or against the bill at the outset."

Representative Sutton responded: "I am against the bill."

The Chair asked Representative Sutton to "proceed" and Representative Sutton went on to say:

"Mr. Speaker, you see what this will do is this bill proposes to limit the preference to those contracts in which the value of the Hawaii products is 51 percent or more. In other words, the present law is changed on preference on bidding. Now, Mr. Speaker, we have probably the worst unemployment we have ever had in the history of Hawaii; we have the worst unemployment of any state in the union and we must protect our people by allowing them to produce their goods. Here is the government, the State of Hawaii, being mandated under the present law to show a preference for Hawaii goods and all of a sudden what do we dowe say, 'no, not unless it is 51 percent or more.

We are going in the wrong direction, Mr. Speaker. The basic concept of the tariffs that protected the United States of America on those industries that had to compete with foreign countries was a basic process and we had our tariffs come in. This is not a tariff per se; all this does is give a preference so that if you are producing something that is a Hawaii product, you will get a preference on the bid. We are headed in the wrong direction, Mr. Speaker, and this is something which, in times of unemployment, we should consider very carefully because we may have to mandate certain public works programs. This may be a minor subject but it is a very big principle. Let us not break a big principle, Mr. Speaker, for a small thing. Thank you."

Representative Suwa then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"I think the philosophy of the past speaker seems to differ from mine. I think this bill will help in the area of unemployment. Concerning the present law, only 3 out of 426 awards in 1974 and 1975 were affected by the preference, Mr. Speaker. I think we are protected by the preference in the area of American-made goods. We have a statute giving preference to Americanmade products and this bill, Mr. Speaker, will primarily be in the area of computation. If the project does not have an equivalent of more than 50 percent or 51 percent, it is meaningless, Mr. Speaker, because of the award differences, primarily bid differences, will eliminate these small preferences. At the present time, there is a delay in awarding the contract. Therefore, I ask the members of the House to support this measure."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 2087-76, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EXPENDITURE OF PUBLIC MONEY AND PUBLIC CONTRACTS", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 40 ayes to 1 no, with Representative Sutton voting no, and Representatives Evans, Inaba, Kiyabu, Lee, Machida, Mizuguchi, Peters, Santos, Shito and Takamine being excused.

## H.B. No. 2056-76, H.D. 1:

On motion by Representative Suwa, seconded by Representative Akizaki and carried, H.B. No. 2056-76, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES BY INFORMAL BID", passed Third Reading by a vote of 38 ayes to 3 noes, with Representatives Carroll, Larsen and Sutton voting no, and Representatives Evans, Inaba, Kiyabu, Lee, Machida,

"The Chair would also like to remind all chairmen that today is the Thirtieth Day. Cut-off date for both Senate bills and House bills passing Third Reading is the Fortieth Day (March 17, 1976). The Chair requests that all chairmen step up your hearings, step up your decision-making and use the week-ends."

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:45 o'clock p.m.

DEFERRED MATTER FROM EARLIER ON THE CALENDAR

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 166-76 on H.B. No. 2598-76, H.D. 1:

Representative Takamura moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H.B. No. 2598-76, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TAXATION AND THE ELDERLY", pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Kunimura.

Representative Poepoe then offered the following amendment to H.B. No. 2598-76, H.D. 1:

"SECTION 1. House Bill No. 2598, H.D. 1, is amended by amending Section 1 to read as follows:

'Section 1. Chapter 237, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

- Sec. 237- Exemption of sales and gross proceeds of sales of prescription drugs [.] and food products.

  (a) The retail sale of prescription drugs and food products for human consumption sold to persons age 60 and over as provided in this section shall be exempted from the taxes imposed by this chapter [; provided that this section shall not exempt the gross proceeds or income to the seller of such drugs or products from any tax imposed by this chapter].
  - (b) As used in this section:
- (1) 'Retail sale of prescription drugs' is defined as:
- (A) The retail sale of drugs prescribed for the treatment of a human being by a person authorized to prescribe drugs and dispensed on prescription filled by a person authorized to dispense drugs in accordance with law;
- (B) The furnishing of drugs by a licensed practitioner of medicine, osteopathy, podiatry, or dentistry to his own patient for treatment of the patient;
- (C) The furnishing of drugs by a hospital for treatment of any person pursuant to an order by a licensed practitioner of medicine, osteopathy, podiatry, or dentistry.
- (2) 'Prescription drugs' include:
- (A) Any substance or preparation intended for use by external or internal application to the human body in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease;
- (B) Insulin furnished by a licensed pharmacist to a person for treatment of diabetes as directed by

a physician.

(3) Prescription drugs and food products do not include any liquor of intoxicating liquor as defined and regulated by chapter 281.

# (4) 'Food products' include:

- (A) Cereals and cereal products, oleomargarine, meat and meat products, fish and fish products, eggs and egg products, vegetable and vegetable products, fruit and fruit products, spices and salt, sugar and sugar products, coffee and coffee substitutes, tea, and cocoa and cocoa products.
- (B) Dairy products, dairy product substitutes, or items or beverages composed at least in part of dairy products or dairy substitutes in their preparation; and
- vegetable juices, and other beverages, whether liquid or frozen, except bottled carbonated beverages.
- (5) Food products do not include preparations in liquid, powdered, granular, tablet, capsule, lozenge, and pill form sold as dietary supplements or adjuncts.
- The exemption granted under this section shall be allowed by retailers of prescription drugs or food products only upon presentation by a person age 60 and over of [the prescription to be filled together with] (a) an automobile driver's license duly issued by any state or territory of the United States; (b) birth certificate; (c) medicare card; (d) State or county identification card; or (e) any other means of identification approved by the Attorney General of the State of Hawaii, provided, that on the retail sale of prescription drugs the above identification shall be presented with the prescription to be filled and that the names on the prescription and the source of identification shall match.
- (d) None of the exemptions provided for in this section in regard to food products shall apply to establishments furnishing food or beverages where such food or beverages are normally served and consumed on the premises of the person furnishing them. As used in this subsection:
- (1) Food or beverages are normally served and consumed on the premises of a restaurant, cafe, diner, teahouse, night club, bar, and other

like establishments offering prepared foods for retail sale. A restaurant includes an establishment which serves a smorgasbord or buffet."

Representative Poepoe moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Ajifu.

Representative Takamura then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, first of all, I would like to say that the members of the House majority have stated last year and this year in their party program, and I think in numerous occasions by actions that we have taken, that we are in strong support of the senior citizens in Hawaii and doing everything we can to further their welfare and their benefits and, for this reason, I would say that we have worked last year, and this year again, to find different means by which we could accomplish this end. This has not only been done by the Committee on Youth and Elderly Affairs but also by the Finance Committee, the Housing Committee, and a number of other committees.

I don't think there is any question here as far as the commitment of the House majority members to the welfare of senior citizens. However, Mr. Speaker, I must say that I look with a great deal of consternation about the amendment being offered to House Bill No. 2598-76 by the Minority members, not because we are against the intent or the purpose of the amendment, but because of the way it was done.

First of all, I would like to say that we had open hearings on this particular bill, 2598-76, which dealt solely with prescription drugs; that the Minority members were present; that they were welcome to give input; that they were also present at our decision-making sessions. They were also welcome to give input and at no time, Mr. Speaker, and I would like to reiterate that, at no time, did any of the Minority members even mention the possibility of amending this bill to include food. I think if they had bothered to do that, I think the Committee, because of its commitment, would have seriously considered it, discussed it, and I think, if possible, attempted to accommodate because I think, again, we are committed to help the senior citizens and this is something that I think we would have seriously considered. But again, they did

not bring this up at that time and I think that would have allowed the Committee, if they had done so, to properly discuss to get their relevant information that we would need to act on a measure such as this and then to proceed with whether or not we would decide to go ahead and do it.

Now I think, at this time, for the Republican leadership to present this kind of amendment at this late date. . . "

Representative Larsen rose on a point of information and stated:

"Would the Chairman of Youth and Elderly please state whether he is for or against the amendment."

The Chair responded, stating:

"It is quite obvious that he is against the amendment. Proceed."

Representative Takamura continued, saying:

"At this time, for the Minority leadership to present this amendment, I think smacks of the rankest form of opportunism because they themselves know that there are difficulties involved in expanding this particular measure to include food products which are not. . .I don't think adequately being handled by the amendment they have here.

Also, I think that we have to question their sincerity because they also realize that by doing this at this late date, that they are jeopardizing the intent of House Bill 2598-76 in the first place which is to provide some kind of relief to the senior citizens with regard to prescription drugs.

Now, health care and the health of our senior citizens is a very vital issue and a very important matter to us, and I believe we, on the majority side, would like to see this body take some action this session—some positive action this session—to do something about this area. I think to come in at this late date with this kind of amendment jeopardizes that kind of..."

Representative Ajifu, at this point, rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to a point of order. I think the speaker should be speaking with regards to the amendment as proposed and I do not hear any of his remarks reflecting the proposed amendment. The proposed amendment, Mr. Speaker, really adds on food products and. . ."

The Chair interrupted:

"Representative Ajifu, you are not to explain the amendment at this time."

Representative Ajifu answered:

"Yes, okay, Mr. Speaker, I agreeexcept that the speaker should confine his remarks to the amendment."

The Chair then directed Representative Takamura to "proceed."

Representative Takamura continued, stating:

"Okay, Mr. Speaker, I would just like to say that I would urge the members of this body to reject the amendment. I believe that we can handle this issue if we need to, either next session or even, if possible, we could discuss this issue this session. However, I would like to say that, at this time, since we have had thorough discussion on House Bill 2598-76 as it was originally presented and that we would like to see that measure adopted, that for us to consider this at this late date without sufficient information and discussion would be irresponsible on the part of this body and also seriously jeopardize, I think, a very important measure that we have before us to consider. Thank

Representative Cayetano was then recognized by the Chair and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against the amendment. I think Representative Takamura has amply stated some of our general feelings about this ploy by the Minority members, and before elaborating a bit further on that, I would like to pose some questions to the Minority Leader. Will he yield to a question—to a series of questions?"

Representative Poepoe replied:

"Mr. Speaker, I will yield. I have been trying to get the floor as a proper courtesy as the movant to speak first. However, I will yield to questions."

Representative Cayetano asked:

"Would you, Mr. Speaker, ask the

Minority Leader if in the ten years he has been in this House whether he has seen bills introduced before which would exempt the elderly from paying the 4 percent general excise tax on food and drugs?"

Representative Poepoe answered:

"Mr. Speaker, I certainly have."

Representative Cayetano then asked:

"Would you ask the Minority Leader, Mr. Speaker, whether he knows the reasons why those bills have not become law?"

Representative Poepoe answered:

"Mr. Speaker, yes, he is asking for it if he wants me to answer how long."

Representative Cayetano then said:

"A 'yes' answer would suffice, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Poepoe stated:

"Mr. Speaker, those bills have not passed because the Democratic majority has not seen fit to meet the needs of the people in exempting the 4 percent food and drug excise tax."

Representative Cayetano then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I think my remarks are pertinent. I want to head off Representatives Ajifu and Larsen. Maybe, as to the relevancy of my remarks because I think at issue here is the sincerity of the minority's efforts in proposing this amendment.

Now, Mr. Speaker, would you ask the Minority Leader if, in fact, one of the problems in passing this bill in the past has been the possibility of abuse?"

Representative Poepoe answered:

"Mr. Speaker, the Republicans have always been for the people, and they believe that we have sufficient funds in our revenue to exempt food and drugs from the 4 percent excise tax. Now, the Majority members of this House have not seen fit to meet the needs of the people. . ."

Representative Cayetano stated:

"Mr. Speaker, will the Minority Leader answer the question?" The Chair stated:

"Representative Poepoe?"

Representative Poepoe answered:

"Yes, Mr. Speaker, I have just answered it."

The Chair then said:

"Representative Cayetano?"

Representative Cayetano replied:

"So then he agrees that one of the arguments against this kind of measure is that it is subject to a great potential abuse. Okay, fine.

Mr. Speaker, would you ask the Minority Leader if, in fact, much of the opposition to this kind of measure has come from people who are in the business of selling food and most of these people are, in fact, members of the minority party?"

Representative Poepoe answered:

"Mr. Speaker, there are several people in the community who might want to respond to that question, but I do understand now. . .no, it is not impossible to generate this type of program in the retail stores. We have. . ."

Representative Cayetano stated:

"Mr. Speaker, that wasn't the question."

Representative Poepoe answered:

"I am finished."

The Chair then asked:

"Will you restate the question, Representative Cayetano?"

Representative Cayetano replied:

"The question, Mr. Speaker, was, isn't it a fact that in the past much of the opposition to bills introduced to exempt the elderly from paying the 4 percent general excise tax on food and drugs have come from people who sell food and drugs and most of these people are members of the minority party."

Representative Poepoe replied:

"Mr. Speaker, that is absolutely not true. The opposition to this bill has come from the Administration. That is a fact. That is on record in testimony."

Representative Cayetano replied:

"Is that right--okay, fine. Mr. Speaker, I would like to pose a question to Representative Sutton, if I may."

The Chair asked:

"Representative Sutton, will you yield to a question?"

Representative Sutton replied:

"Indeed, I shall yield."

Representative Cayetano then asked:

"Representative Sutton, you were there at the hearing of this bill were you not?"

Representative Sutton replied:

"Yes, sir."

Representative Cayetano then asked:

"Did you propose an amendment to the bill that we include food products?"

Representative Sutton replied:

"In the discussion, Mr. Speaker. . . "

Representative Cayetano then said:

"Please answer the question 'yes' or 'no'. It is a simple question."

Representative Sutton replied:

"I will answer a 'no', but a qualified 'no'."

The Chair then said:

"The question has been answered. Representative Cayetano?"

Representative Cayetano then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I think the intention of the minority is quite clear by the answers to the questions, and I ask the majority members to vote down this amendment and, in closing, Mr. Speaker, may I say this that I don't think I have ever been more proud of being a majority member than today because I think we take the business of the people very seriously and we know that . . ."

Representative Ajifu then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to a point of order."

The Chair then said:

"Representative Ajifu, state your point."

Representative Ajifu continued:

"Mr. Speaker, I think we have an amendment before the floor. The speaker should again confine his remarks to the amendment itself and I think we are getting so far out of line that we are just wasting a lot of time."

The Chair recognized Representative Cayetano who stated:

"Mr. Speaker, in closing, I withdraw my remarks regarding my pride in being a majority member. But, in closing, Mr. Speaker, let me say that, I guess the issue of who is wasting time depends on what side of the aisle you sit on, right?"

The Chair then recognized Representative Poepoe who asked:

"Will the Chairman of the Youth and Elderly Affairs Committee yield to a question?"

Representative Abercrombie then rose on a point of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I ask Representative Cayetano to also withdraw the last part of his remark about depending on which side of the aisle you sit on inasmuch as Representative Oda and myself would fall under that designation and, Mr. Speaker, I have a hard enough time straddling the cracks any way."

Representative Cayetano rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, may my remarks be so amended."

Representative Poepoe then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, that point of order does not interrupt my position on this floor."

The Chair replied:

"Representative Poepoe, you have the floor."

Representative Poepoe then asked:

"Will the Chairman yield to questions?"

The Chair asked:

"Representative Takamura, will you yield?"

Representative Takamura replied:

"I will yield to questions that need answers."

The Chair directed Representative Poepoe to "proceed."

Representative Poepoe asked:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to ask the Chairman if he considers an amendment a proper or improper procedure on the floor of this House and under parliamentary rules?"

The Chair asked:

"Representative Takamura?"

Representative Takamura replied:

"I think the answer is obvious. If it wasn't proper, we wouldn't be doing all this right now. You would have been called out of order a long time ago."

Representative Poepoe then asked:

"Mr. Speaker, second question. Is the floor of this House a proper place for debate or is it not?"

The Chair asked:

"Are you addressing the Chair?"

Representative Poepoe replied:

"Yes, sir."

The Chair answered:

"A proper debate at a proper time in a proper form."

Representative Poepoe interrupted:

"Mr. Speaker, I am asking that question of the Chairman of the Youth and Elderly Affairs Committee."

Representative Takamura replied:

"Proper debate, proper time, proper form."

Representative Poepoe then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, now I do rise to speak in favor of this amendment.

Mr. Speaker, I have offered this amendment because for too many

of the years that I have been in this House, too much has been said about what should be done for the senior citizens and too little has actually been accomplished.

Fifteen months ago, the Comprehensive Master Plan for the Elderly said that in 1969 17 percent of Hawaii's elderly had incomes which placed them below the U.S. official poverty level. In just the past 30 months of inflation, Mr. Speaker, the cost of living index has gone up by some 20 percent. This inflation has been a burden on everyone but it has been a particularly harsh burden on the senior citizens, many of whom have had to live on fixed incomes from retirement pensions and social security. If the poverty level figure for 1969 was 17 percent in 1969, you can imagine that the figure would be much higher today. Many of the senior citizens that I have talked to have told me that they have been digging into their meager savings to maintain their already frugal lifestyle. Some, in fact, have depleted their savings.

Mr. Speaker, this is something I feel that we, as the elected Representatives of Hawaii, can no longer sit by and casually let continue. It is our responsibility to do all in our power to help alleviate the plight of the senior citizens. Many of these people are the citizens who paid the taxes to build and maintain the schools we were educated in, to build the roads we drive our cars on daily and pay for the parks and other recreational facilities the people of Hawaii use daily. In other words, throughout many years, they have made their economic contribution to Hawaii and, Mr. Speaker, I quote the Committee Report.

Let me now present some figures as to the cost of this amendment. It is an amendment to release the senior citizens, age 60 and over, from paying the 4 percent excise tax on food products. In fiscal year 1974-1975, the total revenues to the State from the 4 percent general excise tax was \$287.2 million. I would estimate that the total revenues from the total excise tax in fiscal year 1976-1977 would be in the range of \$320 to \$330 million. I would estimate that the share of that tax paid by Hawaii's citizens over the age of 60 would be about \$3 million. This is a very small cost to the State to help our senior citizens. It is an especially small amount when you consider that the State is currently sitting on an \$83.5 million surplus. It is my firm conviction that we must act and we must act now.

Even were this amendment to become part of Hawaii's State laws, I do not think we would have begun to lift the burden upon Hawaii's elderly as much as it needs be. But this amendment would be a positive step, a move that will show Hawaii's senior citizens that we do care and that we are willing to enact measures that will be of benefit to them.

Mr. Speaker, I urge all of my colleagues to vote 'aye'."

Representative Kunimura then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to state for the record that the contributions of the senior citizens to the building of this State, I agree, and I would also like to state for the record that we are trying our darnest to bring about equitable and manageable relief to the elderly in this State. Now, we have gone through this many times as our Chairman of the Committee has said. Our big problem is the manageability. We have not been able yet as a legislature and as committees of this legislature and past legislatures to find the mechanics to implement the exemption of food because there is no way that a person in this particular category would be confined to only food for his or for his wife's or spouse's use.

But this bill before this House now, Mr. Speaker, has a built-in manageable quality--which all prescription drugs must be prescribed by State law by physicians--and there is no other way can you get prescription drugs otherwise. And, therefore, we felt that this would be one way. Now, if we examine our record, both this session and past sessions, that no one in this State has ever. . ."

Representative Ajifu then rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to a point of order."

The Chair asked Representative Ajifu to state his point and Representative Ajifu went on to say:

"Is the speaker speaking in favor of the amendment?"

Representative Kunimura replied:

"Common sense would dictate that, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair stated:

"The speaker is speaking against the amendment. Proceed, Mr. Kunimura."

Representative Kunimura continued, stating:

"The record of this legislature and past legislatures, Mr. Speaker, clearly indicates that wherever and whenever we could afford the relief to these people in a manageable way, we have taken that step--real property tax exemptions and many other benefits for the elderly. So, Mr. Speaker, I am not accusing the movant nor the people who are behind this amendment. My only question that this may be a very political way of trying to embarrass the majority.

I would, if I may, Mr. Speaker, be allowed to classify this amendment, that this amendment is a very 'cheap shot' and possibly a serious political chicanery, and this amendment, if adopted, would seriously jeopardize the welfare of the elderly in the State."

Representative Roehrig was then recognized by the Chair and he stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against this amendment, and sitting here listening to the rationale given by the Minority Leader for introducing this amendment and listening to the Chairman of the Committee talk on this matter, I felt that it was pertinent that I say my piece on this.

It is my understanding that the Chairman of the Youth and Elderly Affairs Committee has been quite accommodating of the minority members in his Committee, not only listening to their wishes, but accommodating them by putting their bills on for hearings. He has referred bills that has been in his Committee. . ."

Representative Ajifu rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I again rise to a point of order."

Asked by the Chair to "state your point", Representative Ajifu went on to say:

"I think the speaker again should confine his remarks to the amendment. I think if what he says is true, then the majority should be just as accommodating here on the floor of the House."

The Chair then said:

"Representative Ajifu, I believe the speaker is leading up to his arguments against the amendment. Representative Roehrig."

Representative Roehrig continued:

"As I understand it, Mr. Speaker, it's uncontradicted that the minority members of the Youth and Elderly Affairs Committee have never raised this issue in Committee, and I hope that the public and those in the gallery would tell their friends that. And I hope that the TV and the press will tell their friends that and print it in the papers that the first time that this matter is raised for any kind of serious discussion is here on the floor. This is an election year and the senior citizens who are on fixed incomes..."

Representative Ajifu again rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to a point of order again."

Asked by the Chair to "state your point", Representative Ajifu stated:

"I think the speaker on the floor is not speaking to the subject here, and I think you, as the Speaker, should control that operation here.

The Chair replied:

"It is quite obvious that I am in control."

Representative Ajifu then stated:

"I think you have the responsibility, Mr. Speaker, to see to it that the proper order is followed and that..."

The Chair interrupted:

"The speaker is addressing his remarks to the elderly who are on fixed income and if you would allow him to continue. . ."

Representative Ajifu interrupted:

"He has not stated a point to the question that is on the floor, Mr. Speaker. The matter that he raises is an irrelevant question."

The Chair replied:

"The Chair rules you out of order, Representative Ajifu. Proceed, Representative Roehrig."

Representative Roehrig continued:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. As I was

saying before I was interrupted by the minority floor leader who wish to interrupt some of the marks that were hitting home here, I was saying that many of our senior citizens, in this election year, are looking to the legislature for ways to alleviate the plight of the. . ."

Representative Lum then rose on a point of order and stated:

"I believe that the election year and the people out there has nothing to do with the motion on the floor."

The Chair said:

"Proceed, Representative Roehrig."

Representative Roehrig continued:

"If it didn't, Mr. Speaker, I respectfully would say that Representative Lum wouldn't be objecting."

Representative Lum then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, point of order again."

The Chair replied:

"Representative Lum, will you please be calm."

Representative Lum went on to say:

"Well, Mr. Speaker, then rule in the right way. He is not speaking to the point of the motion."

The Chair replied:

"I have ruled. Will you proceed, Representative Roehrig."

Representative Roehrig continued:

"And for us to have the motion entertained relating to senior citizens at this time, suggesting to them that perhaps this matter may be adopted, is to seriously mislead them when we have not had the opportunity, neither in caucus nor in committee, to have had the opportunity to determine the implications of this amendment. And I would suggest that for that reason, this kind of amendment is very misleading, and it has been stated before by some of the majority members--it certainly smacks of showboating in an election year. And so I would like to say in finality, speaking against this matter, that the Minority Leader who offered this amendment, I hope is well advised that if this is the way the amendments are going to come, for

showboat purposes, that the committees and the committee chairmen are going to give that serious consideration when these matters relating to minority concerns are brought before their committees. . ."

Representative Poepoe then rose and stated:

"Point of order."

The Chair asked Representative Poepoe to "state your point."

Representative Poepoe replied:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise now on a point of personal privilege."

The Chair again asked Representative Poepoe to "state your point."

Representative Poepoe replied:

"Mr. Speaker, I have been aggrieved on this floor. I have a right to speak."

The Chair answered:

"It is a matter of interpretation."

Representative Poepoe then said:

"Mr. Speaker, your Democratic majority is denying us the opportunity to speak, debate, and amend on the floor of this House. I think that is ridiculous."

Representative Abercrombie then said:

"Point of order, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair then recognized Representative Abercrombie.

Representative Abercrombie then stated:

"I have been personally aggrieved and I wish to rise on a point of personal privilege. I mentioned before on this floor. . ."

The Chair then said:

"State your point, Representative.

Representative Poepoe interrupted:

"Mr. Speaker, do I have the floor or don't I?"

Representative Abercrombie then said:

"I have a point of personal privilege

here. The Chair ruled previously.  $^{\shortparallel}$ 

The Chair rapped his gavel and stated:

"Let us have some order here."

Representative Abercrombie then stated:

"The Chair ruled previously, and it was agreed to, that the use of the word 'Democrat majority' is pejorative. The proper word is 'Democratic.' It is well established that that word used in that manner is pejorative and if the speaker is rising on a personal privilege, I insist the word 'Democratic' be used. . ."

Representative Poepoe then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, he can only interrupt me on a point or order and that is all. Otherwise, I have the floor on a point of personal privilege."

Representative Abercrombie stated:

"I am rising on a point of personal privilege. The previous speaker is using 'Democrat' in a pejorative sense."

The Chair responded:

"Representative Abercrombie, your point has been made. The Chair recognizes Representative Poepoe at this time. Your point has been made."

Representative Abercrombie then said: "Thank you."

Representative Poepoe stated:

"Mr. Speaker, the majority party in this House is denying the minority the right to debate; the right to amend. This is the proper form for debate and amendment. There is nothing improper about introducing an amendment on the floor.

I might remind the previous speakers that this bill is passing Second Reading, going to a further committee for further debate--Period!"

Representative Blair then asked:

"Mr. Speaker, I wonder if Representative Lum would be willing to yield to a question?"

The Chair called:

"Representative Lum?"

Representative Lum answered:

"I will yield."

Representative Blair asked:

"The question, Mr. Speaker, is based on the fact that Representative Poepoe has spoken so eloquently on the needs of the senior citizens with which I think most of us concur, and I was just wondering if Representative Lum would tell us when it was exactly between the date of decision-making and the present moment that he first became aware of these needs?"

Representative Lum answered:

"11: 20 a.m. today I was informed of the amendment."

The Chair asked:

"Any further discussions? If not, let us proceed."

Representative Roehrig then rose on a point of personal privilege, stating:

"Previously, the Minority Leader rose on a point of personal privilege and stated that the majority party is attempting to deny the minority the right to debate on this floor. The previous speaker has just confirmed what everybody here had very strong hunches about -- that this ploy on the part of the minority leader and the minority leadership was a last minute fabrication in order to try and impress the public with some false baloney concerns that they profess to have. So, I would like to state that I am aggrieved that the democratic process has been abused by the minority leadership in this election year."

The Chair then stated:

"Let us proceed with the voting."

Representative Ajifu was then recognized and he stated:

"I rise to speak in favor of the amendment.

Mr. Speaker, what this amendment does is several things. First, the amendment adds to the sentence 'exemption of sales and gross proceeds of sale of prescription drugs' and it adds 'and food products.'

The other portion that this proposed amendment amends is that it deletes the proviso sections which states in the bill, 'provided that this action shall not exempt the gross proceeds or income to the seller of such drugs or products from any tax imposed by this chapter.'

Mr. Speaker, as I said, this portion is deleted. Under the bill, if it is passed as it is, the retail stores will just up the excise tax and include it in the total price which really would not help the purchaser and, therefore, what the bill really does is just increase the price of the prescriptions, and so what our amendment does is really deletes that portion of it and adds on 'food products'."

Representative Cobb then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against the amendment, and in doing so, I take cognizance of the work done by the Chairman of the Youth and Elderly Affairs Committee, particularly in the decision-making session of the Committee when the concerns as expressed in the amendment were not brought out, and I think if everything possible is going to be done to reflect the concern and the need for exemption on food prices, that it should be raised both during the Committee hearing, as well as during the decision-making session of the Committee.

I know a goodly number of the chairmen have been receptive to these ideas. Where we raise the concerns and if it is possible to amend that bill later on, or another bill that is similar or identical in nature, that we do so because the concern has already been raised. Unfortunately, Mr. Speaker, that is not the case in this amendment."

Representative Ajifu then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, may we ask for a roll call vote?"

At this point, Representative Kunimura rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"My reason for rising here on a point of personal privilege, Mr. Speaker, is that we have an understanding that the Republicans assign members of their minority group as spokesperson for the minority on committees, and when their designated spokesperson is notified at this very late date, as he stated on the record here this morning, at 11:20, I seriously feel that something is going haywire.

As a majority whip on this Committee, we try to work very closely and listen and have input, especially when it comes to a. . ."

Representative Fong rose and stated:

"Point of order, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair asked Representative Fong to "state your point."

Representative Fong stated:

"I think the previous speaker has risen on a point of personal privilege. I cannot see where he has been personally aggrieved."

The Chair then recognized Representative Kunimura who stated:

"Mr. Speaker, when somebody who is responsible for representing the minority views as their spokesman for the minority on the committee doesn't know from headquarters of the minority as to what's going on, it aggrieves me."

The Chair then recognized Representative Ho who stated:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I would like to express my feeling and speak against the amendment.

If I may, and if the minority would indulge me, try and go back when we reorganized the House last year. The majority felt that they needed a committee on youth and elderly. It was dedicated to look for measures to give relief for youth and elderly and the Chairman on the Committee on Youth and Elderly Affairs, I believe, took this and was dedicated and showed us this dedication last year.

This year, they had seminars with senior citizens to find what was their concerns; what would be the best methods to give them relief. I believe the Chairman has come up with something equitable. It is a start. We cannot, I know, in all fairness, accommodate everything in youth and elderly or any other programs 100 percent.

I feel this amendment, to me personally, would be a slap in the face to the Chairman for with his dedication and sincereness and to come up with this at the last minute. Is it really the intent of what this amendment will do or is it like what was previously said—showboating.

To my majority members and minority members, please take it for what it is worth. Thank you."

Representative Cobb then rose and stated:

"Point of parliamentary privilege, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair asked Representative Cobb to "state your point."

Representative Cobb then said:

"As a matter of parliamentary procedure, both in the committee and on the floor, my regret is that the amendment and the considerations contained within it were not brought before the committee so that we could have had the chance to get the adequate research done, if necessary, for a consideration and decision-making on this particular amendment. As it is, the only chance we have now is on the floor without any consultation with either the tax office or any of the experts or resource people.

I really regret that, Mr. Speaker, because in committee, if we could have had this kind of information, I would have liked to have supported this, and on principle, I have. But I think we need the information before we can make the decision."

Representative Kamalii then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of the amendment and I am just a little surprised at some of the remarks that have been said on this floor. I think that they have turned this into politics and it certainly was not the intent of the amendment. I think that the majority has failed to look at the amendment and the deletion which is far more important than the addition of the food products.

As a member of Finance, I look at all of these bills that are being referred to Finance, and when this body tells me that this isn't the proper place to catch a mistake when it is not caught in committee, and we hope that maybe Finance will clean up a bill, and then it goes on that we hope the Senate will clean up our bills--Mr. Speaker, this disturbs me.

We are attempting to allow this body to catch their own mistakes by this deletion. When we made this deletion, it was because we felt that it would not be helping the elderly; that the cost would be added on to the consumer. As an example, a bottle of aspirin going at a dollar; add on the 4 percent--\$1.04. That would be what the cost of that drug would be--\$1.04 to the consumer.

Ladies and gentlemen of this body, let's not get caught up in politics; let's look at the issue; and we are trying and being sincere in amending this bill because it would not be helping. Now, if you want to take it any other way, so be it, but I urge my colleagues to stand strong as a Republican on this amendment and vote 'aye'."

Representative Takamura then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I really think this thing is being prolonged but I hope I can say this one thing and get on with the voting. But, you know, I think the bill as we originally had it was worked out. We weren't the ones that asked for anything to be cleaned up so let us get that straight. I mean this thing about, you know, we expecting Finance or somebody else to clean up our bills. The bill, as far as we were concerned, was in good order and that was not our point.

I would like to say that as far as I am concerned. . . "

Representative Poepoe then rose on a point of order and asked by the Chair to "state your point", Representative Poepoe stated:

"I believe he has already spoken on this amendment."

Representative Garcia then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I yield my time if time is a factor, but I believe that a person is entitled to speak further on a particular measure should he desire to, after everyone else has spoken."

The Chair then stated:

"The House rule provides that the chairman has a right to rebut. Proceed, Representative Takamura."

Representative Takamura continued:

"Just one last comment and I believe that the members of the majority stand on their record and I think it is a record to be proud of as far as the senior citizens are concerned, so let us proceed with the voting."

Representative Cayetano then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of information and I hope this will be the last point that is made. I would like to ask Representative Lum a question. Will he yield to a question?"

The Chair asked:

"Representative Lum, will you yield?"

Representative Lum replied:

"I will."

Representative Cayetano asked:

"Mr. Speaker, will you ask Representative Lum that whether he, in response to Representative Blair's questioning, whether I heard correctly that he, as a minority spokesman on the Committee on Youth and Elderly Affairs, first became aware of the needs of the elderly at 11: 20 a.m. today?"

Representative Lum replied:

"Mr. Speaker, I believe the question addressed to me by Representative Blair was when did I first find out? As I interpreted his question, when did I first find out about this amendment? My answer was to finding out about the amendment because I was in Youth and Elderly with Representative Takamura and some other Representatives all morning discussing other bills, and I was not contacted about the amendment until I hit the caucus room."

The Chair then stated:

"Let's proceed with the vote", and the motion to adopt the amendment was put to a roll call vote and failed to carry by a vote of 30 noes to 13 ayes, with Representatives Ajifu, Amaral, Carroll, Clarke, Fong, Hakoda, Ikeda, Kamalii, Larsen, Lum, Poepoe, Santos and Sutton voting aye, and Representatives Evans, Inaba, Lee, Machida, Medeiros, Shito, Suwa and Takamine being excused.

The motion to adopt Standing Committee Report No. 166-76 and passing H.B. No. 2598-76, H.D. 1, on Second Reading and referring it to the Committee on Finance was put to a roll call vote and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted, and H.B. No. 2598-76, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR

AN ACT RELATING TO TAXATION
AND THE ELDERLY", passed Second
Reading and was referred to the
Committee on Finance by a vote of
42 ayes to 1 no, with Representative
Kamalii voting no, and Representatives
Evans, Inaba, Lee, Machida, Medeiros,
Shito, Suwa and Takamine being excused.

At this time, Representative Kihano rose on a point of information and asked:

"I realize we are meeting later in the evenings now. I just wanted to find out whether Representative Kunimura had the time to change from his pajamas?"

Representative Kunimura responded:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of personal privilege. I would like to state for the record that if I may look sleepy, I changed and got into my work clothes. With respect to the Philippines, this is very famous and popular wear in the Philippines. This is not pajamas."

## ADJOURNMENT

At 1:35 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Kimura, seconded by Representative Ajifu and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:30 o'clock a.m. on Monday, March 8, 1976.
