

## FIFTIETH DAY

Friday, April 10, 1987

The House of Representatives of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1987, convened at 11:05 o'clock a.m., with the Speaker presiding.

## SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Apo, seconded by Representative Anderson and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering certain resolutions out of order.

## INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions (H.R. Nos. 459 to 461) were read by the Clerk and were disposed of as follows:

A resolution (H.R. No. 459) congratulating Danny Kaleikini on completing his Twentieth year of entertaining at the Kahala Hilton Hotel was jointly offered by Representatives Anderson, Peters, Kihano, Crozier, Apo, Kanohe, Leong, Tungpalan, Kawakami, Andrews, Arakaki, Bunda, Cavasso, Hagino, Hashimoto, Hayes, Hemmings, Hiraki, Hirono, Honda, M. Ige, Isbell, Jones, Lee, Liu, Marumoto, Medeiros, Okamura, Oshiro, Ribellia, Shito and Shon.

On motion by Representative Anderson, seconded by Representative Peters and carried, H.R. No. 459 was adopted.

Representative Anderson then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, like Representative Peters, I'm a little choked this morning.

"I've always wondered, how do you thank a person that you've known for over 20 years for the work that he's done not only for the Hawaiians but for the people of Hawaii? I've only been able to honor Danny a couple of times. Today, I wanted to make sure that during the 'Year of the Hawaiian,' that we did a little something.

"You go back and remember, years ago, Danny used to have a T.V. show. He used to take the camera, go all over this state to show people the beauty that we had here in Hawaii. He was also one who was never afraid to bring out new entertainers to make sure that they had the exposure that he could, make sure that everybody could look at the best entertainment that we had to offer here in this state. Most of us, I think, are a little afraid at times of competition. Danny never felt that way.

"Just recently, very graciously, he gave the Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club Scholarship Fund \$500.00. He's always trying to help and for that reason, we're very honored to have Danny here today."

At this time, Representative Anderson introduced the honoree, Mr. Danny Kaleikini, who was accompanied by his wife, Jacqueline; their son, Danjacques; daughter, Keikilani; and

secretary, Ms. Sheri Zigler.

Floral leis were presented to the honorees by Representatives Isbell, Liu, Marumoto, Medeiros and Ribellia and a certified copy of the resolution was presented to Mr. Kaleikini by Representative Anderson.

Representative Peters then rose to add a few remarks and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, contrary to popular belief, I'm not all choked up; I did want to say a few words in behalf of brother Danny--we all refer to him as brother Danny.

"I'm not sure if you realize that two years ago, he did have an aspiration to run for lieutenant governor. And he came to see me and he said, 'brother, if I ran for lieutenant governor, could I also keep my job at night at the Kahala Hilton?' and I said, 'gee, I wasn't sure if you could accomplish that.' Putting that aside, however, brother Danny's aloha and his love transcends all political lines, and it obviously transcends cultural lines as well because he truly loves people; he is truly the 'Ambassador of Aloha,' for Hawaii.

"Danny, to you and your family, Aloha, and God Bless you."

At 11:30 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair, "for the purpose of extending our aloha to our honorees this morning."

Upon reconvening at 11:43 o'clock a.m., Representative Horita, on a late introduction, introduced a group of fifth grade students from Aliamanu Elementary School accompanied by their teacher, Ms. May Murabayashi.

A resolution (H.R. No. 460) honoring Isamu Noguchi, a visionary and legendary figure in art was jointly offered by Representatives Hagino and Taniguchi.

On motion by Representative Hagino, seconded by Representative Taniguchi and carried, H.R. No. 460 was adopted.

Representative Hagino then rose and stated:

"Recently, Mr. Speaker and fellow colleagues and members of the gallery, we have heard about the sale of a work of art by Vincent Van Gogh, entitled, 'Sunflowers,' which was then sold for an unheard price of 39.9 million dollars. What is remarkable

about the sale price is the fact that in his lifetime Van Gogh may have sold, at most, 1 to 3 of his canvases; in fact, many art historians believe that he may not have made a single sale within his lifetime.

"I think the lesson of this recent story of Van Gogh is simply this: We do not pay enough gratitude and respect, or show enough appreciation to our artist and art visionaries in their lifetime. When an artist creates a work of art, that work of art will endure for hundreds of years. That work will inspire, entertain and educate generations upon generations of people. Because of this enduring legacy that an artist gives to all of us, we must take it upon ourselves to find the time to say a simple, 'thank you,' over and over and over again.

"Today, we take this opportunity to thank and to recognize a great artist. We are recognizing today, Mr. Isamu Noguchi, an artist who ranks with Picasso, and more, as one of the great artists and sculptors of the Twentieth century. His body of works will endure for hundreds of years. He will be recognized as part of a lineage of great masters that reaches as far back as Michaelangelo.

"The resolution that we have just adopted does not say enough about Mr. Noguchi. Indeed, it would be impossible for any resolution to incorporate all of the great achievements of this man. He has created many works--other works--too numerous to mention in the resolution, such as, the indoor granite mountain in the Sogetsu School in Tokyo and the water fountain at the Detroit Renaissance Center. Currently, he is engaged on another public monumental work of art for the city of Miami which is on a 28-acre parcel of land.

"The resolution, also, does not list many of the accolades that he has received. For example, several years ago, he was designated a 'living treasure' by Hawaii's own Honpa Hongwanji. Later this year, on June 18th, he will be honored by the President of the United States for his great achievements for art and as America's greatest living artist. And indeed, no resolution can list all of his works because this man is still creating and designing, constructing and sculpting. Although he is 82 years of age, he continues to work to produce and to inspire all of us."

At this time, the honoree, Mr. Noguchi, was introduced by Representative Hagino and was asked to stand

and be recognized. Accompanying Mr. Noguchi were Mr. Sean Brown, "a fine young sculptor from Hawaii"; Dr. Franklin Odo, chairperson for the State Foundation of Culture and the Arts; Mr. Ron Yamakawa, staffperson on the State Foundation of Culture and the Arts; and Mr. George Ellis, director of the Honolulu Art Academy.

A certified copy of the resolution was presented to Mr. Noguchi by Representative Taniguchi and floral leis were presented to the honoree by Representative Horita; to Mr. Brown by Representative Hirono; to Mr. Ellis by Representative Kawakami; to Mr. Yamakawa by Representative Hayes; and to Dr. Odo by Representative Marumoto.

A resolution (H.R. No. 461) recognizing Mr. Tony Curtis for his world premiere exhibition of original and creative paintings, drawings, and assemblages on April 10, 1987, in Honolulu, Hawaii, was jointly offered by Representatives Say, Marumoto, Alcon, Anderson, Andrews, Apo, Arakaki, Bellinger, Bunda, Cachola, Cavasso, Crozier, Fukunaga, Hagino, Hashimoto, Hayes, Hemmings, Hiraki, Hirono, Honda, Horita, D. Ige, M. "Ladies and gentlemen, humor aside, and with great respect and honor, let me introduce to you to him."

At this time, Representative Say introduced the honoree, Mr. Tony Curtis, who was accompanied by his

son, Nicholas; Mr. Bill Mett, president of the Center Art Gallery; Ms. Lynn Cook, executive director of the Visitor Industry Education Council; and Mr. Michael Patrick, marketing director of Center Art Gallery.

Floral leis were presented to Mr. Curtis by Representative Marumoto; to Nicholas by Representative Hashimoto; to Mr. Mett by Representative Kawakami; to Ms. Cook by Representative Taniguchi; and to Mr. Patrick by Representative Horita. Monday, April 13, 1987

SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Apo, seconded by Representative Anderson and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering a bill on Final Reading on the basis of a modified consent calendar.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Representative Cachola moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and S.B. No. 735, SD 2, HD 2, CD 1, having been read through-out, pass Final Reading, seconded by Representative Souki.

Representative Hemmings rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"I am very pleased to express strong and positive support of this bill which appropriates funds for the promotion of the 1990 America's Cup in Hawaiian Waters, and in doing so, I must commend in a non-partisan way and extend my congratulations to Governor John Waihee. Governor Waihee has displayed imaginative and decisive leadership in promoting the America's Cup yacht race.

"In addressing this bill, I would like to note that the Governor, in a recent speech, has acknowledged a 'hidden' industry that is already a significant contributor to our economy, and I might add, to a healthy Hawaiian lifestyle. That industry is sports and recreation.

"In passing this legislation, we will facilitate the growth of the sports industry in our State. Sports and recreation expenditures may already surpass pineapple and sugar in gross revenues generated. The America's Cup alone would more than double, in a year, the gross revenue generated by those two industries.

"The point is that we are already in the sports business. It is healthy, it is prosperous, it complements our lifestyles, and it complements our tourist industry.

"The fact that the Governor recommends passage of this bill signals the international sports community that Hawaii is one of the great sports playgrounds of the world. In fact, I think it can safely be said that we are one of the sports capitals of the world. Let's do everything we can to bring the America's Cup to Hawaii.

"I urge your support of this bill."

Representative Anderson rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to speak in favor of the bill, however, I do have some reservations.

"Mr. Speaker, I am reading the bill and it says that this \$300,000 is supposed to be used for an impact statement, environmental assessment, necessary planning, analyses and promotions. I don't know where \$300,000 came from, Mr. Speaker, but I am not really sure if that's going to be enough money.

"What bothers me even more is that there is a bill right now whereby we could use \$15-million for the HVB. If, in fact, that's going to the Department of Planning and Economic Development and they are going to say that they could possibly use some of that money to offset this because it is tourist-oriented, it would bother me, being that we have already planned on marketing and other areas for the tourist industry to move forward. And if we are going to utilize money, and taking it from one program and putting it to another, I really don't know if we are doing justice to the tourist industry itself.

"Again, I would hope when we go into conference, that we would look at the overall picture and not just what's there immediately because I don't know if \$300,000 is really going to do the job.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Hayes rose and stated:

"I recently sent a questionnaire to my constituents. So far, we received 450 replies. One of the questions was, 'Do you support America's Cup in Hawaii?' and. . .

At this point, Representative Anderson interrupted on a point of order and said:

"She speaking on behalf of the bill -- for or against?"

Representative Hayes answered:

"Yes, I am speaking in support of the bill.

"All but about three of the replies were in favor of holding the America's Cup in Hawaii.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted, and S.B. No. 735, SD 2, HD 2, CD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE 1990 AMERICA'S CUP IN HAWAIIAN WATERS", having been read throughout, passed Final Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Bunda and Hagino being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 735 had passed Final Reading at 11:46 o'clock a.m.

Representative Metcalf then rose to speak in support of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, Representative Cavasso has convinced me--I'm changing my vote--I'm supporting the measure."

Representative Tungpalan then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I would just like to thank the chairmen of the various committees who heard this measure. I know it's a controversial one and a lot of people are holding their breaths to see if everything will go well.

"Because of our amendments made in 1985 and subsequent amendments made the following year, I do believe that this is a well-regulated system. Indeed, there are treatment schedules and fee schedules that will contain the cost. This was done because we did recognize in 1985 that one-third of the costs of workers compensation could be attributed to the cost of medical care and, as such, the Legislature did what was necessary and implemented rules and regulations that now actually determine, by weeks, the amount of time for each injury and illness that is compensable under the workers compensation. Should a person want to go beyond the scheduled treatment, he would have to

obtain the approval of the Department of Labor; so in no way could anyone, who is a medical provider under workers' compensation, go beyond and abuse the system.

"Also, the psychologists are currently designated as medical providers; they are not designated in the section that we are amending but, currently, if referred to, they may treat patients under workers compensation. They have direct access to patients who come to them and are compensated by H.M.S.A. and CHAMPUS.

"So I don't believe that we are, as the former speaker said, going in the wrong direction. I do believe that this is a measure that is prudent and justified.

"Thank you."

This year, we have those brought up under a form of democracy, we have some that's brought up under a monarchy, and also we have one that's been educated under communism, and that's terrific so that all of these people can get together and see that we are really not that much different -- we're still human beings."

Representative Cavasso introduced Miss Margaret Vikers, "an Indian from Canada who worked as my special aide for two years. . . a very special person, someone who is an international person as well. She is a member of the Shimshian Indian Nation of British Columbia and Canada, President of the Professional League of Women of British Columbia, founding member of the British Columbia Native Teachers' Association, and currently specializes in socio-economic development as a consultant with her company."

Representative Marumoto introduced Mrs. Mary Yort, "an old friend of mine. Her roots go very deep into Hawaii's history. Her family has been here for generations."

Representative Apo introduced Laura and Kathy from Kauai who are employed by the Napalii Coast Zodiac Company.

Representative Cavasso rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"The loyalty oath is good and the authority to waive that oath rests with the Governor right now and as the highest elected official of our State, it is appropriate that it should rest with him to waive that loyalty oath. The oath simply says two things. It says that, 'I solemnly swear that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States, and the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.' The Constitution of Hawaii is the highest law of our State; the Constitution of the nation is the highest law of our nation. It seems reasonable that we should expect people who work in our community, our State and our nation to uphold the supreme laws of our land.

"There are situations when we have a guest, a guest speaker, or professor or such that, for special reasons, where he would have problems with his own country if he stated that he would affirm or uphold the Constitution of our State or nation, and in those cases, the Governor should have the authority to waive and the law gives him that authority.

"This is going further. It is giving that authority to the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii, a non-elected body by the people of Hawaii, and I believe that it is unwise to further dilute the responsibility to enforce and uphold the Constitution of Hawaii and the United States. That authority should rest with the Governor and should not be diluted and placed in lower bodies.

"I think that it is a mistake, and particularly in light of some of the problems we are having with loyalty and the situation overseas with the consulate and the problems with the marines and such, and I think this would be a step in the wrong direction. I have an uneasy sense here about taking this authority away from the Governor. He can handle it; he has handled it in the past and should be allowed to continue to handle it.

"I am voting no and ask others with the same reservation, keep this authority in the hands of the Gover-

nor only. The laws of the land. . .the Constitution is too important to threaten or dilute in any way."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. "Mr. Speaker, in my office I have, above the inner door, a quote from Chief Justice Lewis Brandeis which he stated in 1928 and it goes: 'The greatest danger to liberty lurks in insidious encroachment by men of zeal, well-meaning, but without understanding.'

"Mr. Speaker, this bill represents a well-meant intent to become more efficient in the election process. However, I think it goes a little bit too far. It does two things, sir. First of all, it gives the Lieutenant Governor the right to combine both charter amendments and constitutional amendments on the same card. What happens then, sir, is you mix, or you co-mingle, State issues and City and County issues. I can see people making judgment decisions in the ballot box and being confused on what they are voting on, what government they are voting for or against, or the issue which relates to whatever government.

"The other concern, sir, is on the ballots for the Primary Elections where you are going to include primarily for the minor parties -- Libertarian Parties -- put them on the same ballot as the non-partisan ballots. You know, there are a few.

"I also can see the potential for confusion from the voters. Mr.

Speaker, maybe some of the more mature members can remember when we had the open primary prior to having the closed primary. I remember my Mom and my Dad and my uncles and aunties talking about how people spoiled their ballots because they didn't realize they were not allowed to cross over. In the Primary, you're just supposed to go down one column but some people accidentally made the mistake and jumped over and that nullified their ballots.

"Mr. Speaker, what we are supposed to be doing, when it comes to voting, we are supposed to minimize any chances of error. You know, there is an old saying that all of us use when we campaign and we all should use all the time and that's the 'kiss' formula -- keep it simple, stupid! Okay, we got to keep it simple so that we don't make mistakes, and if we have the potential of making mistakes, we are supposed to keep it simple so that the voters also will not make mistakes.

"Members, I realize this is on Second Reading but I would like for you folks to pay attention and take a look at this bill and tomorrow, when we vote on Third Reading, you'll understand where I'm coming from.

"Thank you very much, sir."

Representative Crozier then rose and requested that his oral remarks against the bill, which was stated yesterday, be again inserted into the Journal, and the Chair, noting that there were no objections, "so ordered."

The remarks of Representative Crozier, against the bill, are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, in my office I have, above the inner door, a quote from Chief Justice Lewis Brandeis which he stated in 1928 and it goes: 'The greatest danger to liberty lurks in insidious encroachment by men of zeal, well-meaning, but without understanding.'"

"Mr. Speaker, this bill represents a well-meant intent to become more efficient in the election process. However, I think it goes a little bit too far. It does two things, sir. First of all, it gives the Lieutenant Governor the right to combine both charter amendments and constitutional amendments on the same card. What happens then, sir, is you mix, or you co-mingle, State issues and City and County issues. I can see people making judgment decisions in the ballot box and being confused on what they are voting on, what government they are voting for or against, or the issue which relates to whatever government.

"The other concern, sir, is one the ballots for the Primary Elections where you are going to include primarily for the minor parties--Libertarian Parties--put them on the same ballot as the non-partisan ballots. You know, there are a few.

"I also can see the potential for confusion from the voters. Mr. Speaker, maybe some of the more mature members can remember when we had the open primary prior to having the closed primary. I remember my Mom and my Dad and my uncles and aunties talking about how people spoiled their ballots because they didn't realize they were not allowed to cross over. In the Primary, you're just supposed to go down one column but some people accidentally made the mistake and jumped over and that nullified their ballots.

"Mr. Speaker, what we are supposed to be doing, when it comes to voting, we are supposed to minimize any chances of error. You know, there is an old saying that all of us use when we campaign and we all should use all the time and that's the 'kiss' formula -- keep it simple, stupid! Okay, we got to keep it simple so that we don't make mistakes, and if we have the potential of making mistakes, we are supposed to keep it simple so that the voters also will not make mistakes.

"Members, I realize this is on Second Reading but I would like for you folks to pay attention and take a look at this bill and tomorrow, when we vote on Third Reading, you'll understand where I'm coming from.

"Thank you very much, sir."

Representative Liu then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I concur with the sentiments expressed by Representative Crozier yesterday, but also indicate that should this bill pass--just to reiterate for the record--I do think the intent is to not co-mingle the ballots or the names of candidates from the two major parties. I think it would be a mistake. I also have problems with even co-mingling the names of candidates on the minor parties or nonpartisans, and I think the committee report is unclear because it does talk about constitutional amendments and City and County amendments although the bill itself does not really mention those items. But if that is also the intent, I think the bill is unclear, the committee report is unclear and I would hope that the bill does not pass, but should it pass, I hope that the words that I just expressed will be considered as part of the legislative history of this measure.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."



Representative Marumoto then rose to speak against the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I'm just wondering that if there was a major party where all the races did not fit on one ballot and it spilled over to a second ballot with some other parties, if there would be some violent objections to that, and I think that if people think in those terms, there would be more no votes, so I would strongly urge you to reconsider your vote on this particular measure.

"Thank you very much."

Representative Lee then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to rise to speak against the bill and associate myself with the remarks made by Representative Crozier.

"I think the remarks are sufficiently serious to warrant further consideration and study before we proceed with something so serious. There is something fundamental about voting. It should be clear and honest rather than something that is adopted in haste and simply to cut costs.

"I would like to be recorded as opposing this bill, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and S.B. of the political process, involved in decision-making, and plugged into the economy. That is the goal of these resolutions.

"I believe government is most effective when it is closest to the people it serves. Therefore, it is good news for Molokai that an interim House/Senate committee will be determining the facts relating to forms of government for Molokai that may provide greater input and self-governance for Molokai such as townships, or neighborhood boards, or satellite city halls.

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against House Resolution 172, HD 1, and House Concurrent Resolution 100, HD 1.

"Mr. Speaker, the easy thing for me to do would be to sit idly by and let this resolution pass without saying anything, but in good consciousness and probably the wise political thing for me to do would be to sit by and let it pass, but in good consciousness I must speak against the resolutions.

"First of all, it is my understanding from the Department of Land and Natural Resources, and I checked this a short time ago. . . it was ten minutes ago, that the concerned land is outside the Diamond Head Monument line and eligible to have something constructive and positive to be done on it without interfering with the established line to protect the Diamond Head Monument.

"Secondly, most of the people that have come to my office and lobbied in behalf of these resolutions have lobbied without seeing the plans of the proposed tennis complex, and I have seen the plans, Mr. Speaker and colleagues. The plans provide for a very aesthetically beautiful tennis complex in which many hundreds of thousands of dollars are going to be spent on beautification and landscaping which will greatly enhance the aesthetic value of the place. It will be contrary to misinformed peoples' statements about a modest clubhouse and a modest restaurant on the property.



"Third, this facility would, at no cost to the taxpayers, provide a recreational benefit to visiting tourists as well as, under the terms of the lease, certain courts would be reserved for use by the residents in the nearby areas, so we would get a recreational facility at no cost to us.

"Fourth, it would turn land that is presently a liability. . . if any of you have driven by that area, you can see that there is keawe bushes, it's very poorly kept. We turn a liability land into an asset. Not only an asset aesthetically, but also an asset economically because the business activity would be going on there. We pay taxes, you know we pay land taxes, so it would benefit not only the recreational use, but also benefit the economic activity in the area. The Department of Land and Natural Resources, in good consciousness, has examined this very closely and has and are proceeding with allowing this to happen.

"There is another principle involved here and as every year goes by, and as our State becomes more and more crowded, it seems that we are having our actions dictated by the nimbies and by the nay-sayers rather than by the people that want to constructively do something. Every major economic development activity and every major proposal, including some of the many wonderful proposals of our Governor, are being bogged down by nay-sayers. We do want economic opportunity; we do want diversified industry; we do want jobs; we do want affordable housing; we do want improved transportation, but not in our district -- do it somewhere else. And I think we had better start rethinking it and I think on issues like this, we are going to have to take a stand in favor of some of these activities rather than letting the nay-sayers and the anties and the nimbies dictate the course of this Legislature. We have to take bold leadership positions; we have to advocate development of the America's Cup; we have to advocate development of geothermal energy; we have to advocate development in our districts that is going to benefit the larger interests of the State of Hawaii.

"For that reason, I ask all of you to vote against these resolutions. It's in my district. Probably the safe thing for me to do would be to sit down and let it just fly but in good consciousness, I am asking you all to consider voting no.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

On motion by Representative Levin, seconded by Representative D. Ige and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.C.R. "Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker."

"So, with those words, Mr. Speaker, I speak against the resolutions and hope all of us take note as we end up this evening.

We have here, today, the individuals that this resolution congratulates, and it is my honor, at this time, to introduce the now-famous 1986 State election observer team.

"First, from the Office of the Legislative Auditor, James Sterling; Patricia Rivera from Alu Like; Charlene Norris, Bar Association of Hawaii; Mary Jane Van Buren, Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii; Kevin Corrigan, Common Cause, Hawaii; Dennis Kam, Hawaii Newspaper Agency; Paulynn Ichimura, Hawaii Society of Certified Accountants; Barbara Sunderland, League of Women Voters; Glenn Robinson, Libertarian Party of Hawaii; and Jalna Keala, Office of Hawaiian Affairs; and Elwin Spray, Republican Party of Hawaii." All were asked to stand and be recognized.

Floral leis and certified copies of the resolution were presented to the honorees by Representatives Alcon, Arakaki, Bellinger, Cachola, Hayes, Hashimoto, Hiraki, Hirono, Ihara, Kanoho, Kawakami and Tungpalan.

Representative Tom then rose to comment that the Democratic Party's observer in the State election was Representative Ihara.

No. 476) commending and congratulating members of the heart transplant team and St. Francis Hospital for the successful performance of the first heart transplant operation in Hawaii was jointly offered by Representatives Cachola, Alcon, Anderson, Bellinger, Bunda, Hagino, Hayes, Hiraki, Hirono, Honda, D. Ige, Ihara, Isbell, Lee, Leong, Marumoto, Medeiros, O'Kieffe, Pfeil, Ribellia, Shito, Shon, Taniguchi and Tungpalan.

On motion by Representative Cachola, seconded by Representative Apo and carried, H.R. No. 476 was adopted.

Representative Cachola then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker and members of this Honorable Body: March 10, 1987, is a historical day for Hawaii for it was on that day that the first heart transplant operation in Hawaii was performed--truly a pioneering act. The fact that the modern day miracle such as heart transplant can be done in our lifetime is something that we can all be grateful for.

"The gifted physician who led this most significant operation is a man

with a remarkable background. His name is Dr. Ricardo Moreno-Cabral who is from Mexico. He arrived in Hawaii as an immigrant in 1971, the same year that I immigrated to Hawaii. I first met Dr. Moreno when he interned at St. Francis Hospital with my wife, Linda, in 1971-72. It was also in the same year that I met Sister Maureen Keleher, a friend. Since then, Dr. Moreno has risen to greater heights and contributed much to Hawaii's medical profession. Dr. Ricardo Moreno has an impressive list of awards and accomplishments including fellowships with the American College of Surgeons, Royal College of Surgeons of Canada, and the Mexican Academy for Vascular Surgery. In addition, Mr. Speaker, Dr. Moreno has served as visiting professor of cardiac surgery in Barcelona, Spain, and as well as in Argentina. Dr. Moreno is currently assistant professor at the College of Medicine at the University of Hawaii."

The honoree, Dr. Moreno, was introduced to the members of the House by Representative Cachola. Accompanying Dr. Moreno was Sr. Maureen Keleher, chief executive officer of St. Francis Hospital and the heart transplant program, who is "a very special individual who spearheaded the project from its infancy in January of 1984 at St. Francis Hospital."

Carnation leis were presented to Dr. Moreno by Representative Fukunaga and to Sr. Keleher by Representative Ihara and certified copies of the resolution were presented to the honorees by Representative Cachola.

Also recognized by Representative Cachola and who were seated in the gallery were the registered nurses who assisted in the heart transplant operation. They were: Ms. Joan Machado; Kathy Doi; Jan Kachur; and Fiona Beckley. Mrs. Bernice Moreno, wife of Dr. Moreno, was also recognized as well as the hard-working staff of Dr. Moreno. A resolution (H.R. No. 477) recognizing and acknowledging the Center for the Hearing Impaired of the Diocese of Honolulu was jointly offered by Representatives Tom, Alcon, Crozier, Kawakami, Leong, Levin, Okamura, Oshiro, Say, Takamine and Tam.

On motion by Representative Tom,

seconded by Representative Tungpalan and carried, H.R. No. 477 was adopted.

Representative Tom then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, it is with great pride that I stand before this Honorable Body and offer this resolution congratulating and acknowledging the Center for the Hearing Impaired for the Diocese of Honolulu.

"There are an estimated 60,000 hearing-impaired citizens in Hawaii, 4,500 of those with severe or profound hearing loss, and this is a significant segment of our population.

"I'm pleased to report that more and more people are learning sign language as a means of facilitating communication to those who are deaf, and you're seeing this means of communication being demonstrated before you today. I am told that even the Bishop of Honolulu, His Excellency Joseph Ferrario, is able to sign and further, popular recognition of the deaf community is growing as evident by the hit movie and Academy Award winner, 'Children of a Lesser God.'

"Sometimes, Mr. Speaker, we in the Legislature can formulate bills to meet the needs of our citizens and sometimes it is best to be left to outside groups. Here is an example of an organization, the Catholic Church in Hawaii, reaching out to meet the needs of our deaf community. This is an exciting trend and I look forward to more groups to follow their lead."

At this time, the honorees were introduced to the members of the House and all were asked to stand and be recognized. They are as follows: Lorideane Mahaulu; John Morales; Sr. Marion Tung from the Office of the Hearing Impaired; Fr. Tony Bolger; and Fr. Tom Coughlin.

Representative Bunda then rose to speak in favor of the resolutions, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, just briefly to explain why the resolutions are important and were chosen as a part of the Ocean and Marine Resources Committee as a majority package.

"In 1983, as you all know, the United States claimed ownership and control over the riches within the exclusive economic zone which extends 200 miles from all of the United States coastal shores. This area is already known to have great potential for OTEC aquaculture and minerals like cobalt. It is one of the most crucial areas for the future of our state and a time to do something about it, is now.

"The EEZ was only recently declared. However, the Federal Govern-

ment has not yet established policies governing it. Hawaii, like other coastal states, must make a commitment now if we are to have a say in what happens within the EEZ. If we miss this chance, the Department of the Interior and other federal agencies will establish management policies that would exclude us. The importance of the ocean of our state is becoming clearer, Mr. Speaker, as we realize its true potential. The EEZ area around Hawaii covers an area approximately 100 times the size of the land mass of our state and the three mile limit that the state now controls brings in hundreds of millions of dollars alone. The economic potential is somewhat known. Just how great it can be depends upon a cooperative plan of shared management and shared revenues with the Federal Government.

"Mr. Speaker, we must convince the Federal Government that we are competent and committed to the development and management of our ocean. We have the administration, the university, the private sector and now, the Legislature, behind us and I hope this sends a clear message to Washington.

"Mr. Speaker, I appreciate the House's support on these resolutions and may I say that we're heading in the right direction and that to insure that we continue to do so.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted, and H.C.R. "Mr. Speaker, this is I know, a very well-meaning measure and I think the underlying statute which it intends to amend is also very well meaning. However, I think we have to, perhaps, at some point, perhaps, question where we're going and why and in some instances, perhaps, draw the line also.

"I can understand the sense that, perhaps, volunteer boating enforcement officers maintain the same type of potential danger in their line of assistance to the state as do reserve police officers and volunteer firefighters.

"However, I would like to point out that, currently, under our statutes--under 386-171 -- that, '...volunteer personnel are entitled to medical benefits for injuries incurred on the job'; that Section 90-4 concerning volunteer benefits, '...requires that the State agencies, within their budgets, should provide various benefits to volunteers, including meals, transportation reimbursements, out-of-service training, conference reimbursements, etc.' Granted, some agencies may not have that room in their budget, in which case they do not have to provide such measures. However, I think in many instances it can occur. The statutes again, I reiterate, does require the State to provide for medical costs when injuries are incurred on the job, and I think we have to take a look at the whole reason that people volunteer, and I think those reasons are for a genuine feeling for wanting to assist others. I think we have to balance the interest involved and various cost to the State, and for that reason, I urge my other colleagues to please vote 'no' on this measure.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

"In short, it furthers the problem that we are facing in our society with a criminal justice system where we are too often worried about the welfare, rights, and the benefits of the criminal while ignoring the rights and the welfare of the victim and society at large. I think it furthers the imbalance within our criminal justice system. We need systemic reform to the criminal justice system, and I do know that the chairman of Human Services and also the chairman of the Judiciary Committees have worked hard in certain aspects of this problem.

"This bill, in light of what happened to the victim rights bill in the Senate, should not be acted on and passed.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Lee then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, the purpose of the bill is to establish an offender family service center. If we are to do something to rehabilitate, namely, the inmates, we should make it easier for the family members to come and visit them. It has nothing to do with coddling criminals. It has to do with trying to reintegrate inmates with their families, and I think we all

should recognize what the bill is and vote accordingly.

"Therefore, I am in favor of this bill.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Crozier rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I am one for justice; I am one for incarceration. However, I am a person who also believes in compassion. This bill addresses the needs and concerns of the families. They are not the criminals, but the families are still developing. They need to have an area where they can communicate with their parent, be it the father or the mother. I think we need this, we must show compassion for them.

"Thank you very much."

Representative Jones rose to speak in favor of the bill, with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I realize that this House does have compassion and I want to commend my colleagues for supporting this bill as well as the victims bill of rights. I think this House has definitely taken the high road and I think both Representative Hemmings and myself want to express our extreme frustration with the chairman of Judiciary in the Senate who has held up this victims bill of rights and, again, we see him leading the Senate in, perhaps, helping the families of the criminals, which is good, but ignoring the tremendous needs of the victims of our state, and when are we and our state going to get on board with helping the victims of crime? I think that both Representative Hemmings and myself want to bring this point out very strongly this morning that the House was shafted by the chairman of Judiciary in terms of a balance to helping people who are victims of crime as well as the families of the perpetrators.

"That is why I have reservations and thank you, Mr. Speaker, for this chance to speak."

Representative Hemmings then rose to speak in rebuttal, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I have a lot of compassion. But I have compassion, first, for the people who have been victimized, maimed and lives destroyed--for the families that have been destroyed--by the perpetrators

of crime on our society. Compassion has to be balanced, and I see all too often the imbalance in our system where compassion is being given to the perpetrators of pain and anguish in our society, while the victims of pain and anguish are receiving little or nothing.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

On motion by Representative Souki, seconded by Representative Fukunaga and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 533, SD1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO OFFENDER FAMILIES", passed Third Reading by a vote of 42 ayes to 5 noes, with Representatives Cavasso, Hemmings, Liu, O'Kieffe and Ribellia voting no, and with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

Representative Souki, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1509) recommending that S.B. No. 1357, SD1, pass Third Reading.

On motion by Representative Souki, seconded by Representative Fukunaga and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1357, SD1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE MOLOKAI IRRIGATION AND WATER UTILIZATION PROJECT", passed Third Reading by a vote of 47 ayes, with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. Nos. 533 and 1357 had passed Third Reading at 1:10 o'clock p.m.

Representative Souki, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1510) recommending that S.B. No. 1160, pass Third Reading.

On motion by Representative Souki, seconded by Representative Fukunaga and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1160, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CONCESSIONS", passed Third Reading by a vote of 46 ayes to 1 no, with Representative Anderson voting no, and with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 1160 had passed Third Reading at 1:11 o'clock p.m.

Representative Souki, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1511) recommending that S.B. No. 1734, pass Third Reading.

By unanimous consent, action was deferred one day.

Representative Souki, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1512) recommending that S.B. No. 1737, SD2, pass Third Reading.

On motion by Representative Souki, seconded by Representative Fukunaga and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1737, SD2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND FINANCE", passed Third Reading by a vote of 43 ayes to 4 noes, with Representatives Hemmings, Jones, Liu and O'Kieffe voting no, and with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

Representative Souki, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1513) recommending that S.B. No. 1758, SD2, pass Third Reading.

On motion by Representative Souki, seconded by Representative Fukunaga and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1758, SD2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT", passed Third Reading by a vote of 46 ayes to 1 no, with Representative Hemmings voting no, and with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. Nos. 1737 and 1758 had passed Third Reading at 1:12 o'clock p.m.

Representative Souki, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1514) recommending that S.B. No. 1702, SD1, pass Third Reading.

On motion by Representative Souki, seconded by Representative Fukunaga and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1702, SD1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EMPLOYEES OF THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR'S OFFICE", passed Third Reading by a vote of 42 ayes to 5 noes, with

Representatives Anderson, Cavasso, Jones, Liu and O'Kieffe voting no, and with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 1702 had passed Third Reading at 1:13 o'clock p.m.

#### S.B. No. 1112:

Representative Hirono moved that S.B. No. 1112, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Hiraki.

Representative Tungpalan then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, first, I surveyed my community and the majority voted against the passage of this bill.

"Secondly, I believe that matters pertaining to conception are articles of faith and morals. In vitro fertilization does not recognize the existence of the soul at the moment of conception. For this reason and the fact that the majority of my community doesn't support this measure, I am casting a 'no' vote on it."

Representative Lee rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I do so because this is an elective luxury. I don't think that it is in keeping with the 'raison d'etre' of medical insurance, and I join Representative Tungpalan in opposing this bill.

"Thank you, sir."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and S.B. No. 1112 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO INSURANCE", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 38 ayes to 9 noes, with Representatives Anderson, Cavasso, Hemmings, Jones, Kanoho, Lee, O'Kieffe, Ribellia and Tungpalan voting no, and with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

#### S.B. No. 449:

On motion by Representative Hirono, seconded by Representative Hagino and carried, S.B. No. 449, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO OPTOMETRY", passed Third Reading by a vote of 47 ayes, with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. Nos. 1112 and 449 had passed Third Reading at 1:17 o'clock p.m.

#### S.B. No. 1286, SD1:

Representative Hirono moved that S.B. No. 1286, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Hiraki.

Representative Liu then rose to speak in favor of the bill, but with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I think the basic reason behind the change in the maximum loan amount from \$100,000.00 to \$500,000.00 makes some sense. We all know the cost of home mortgages, etc., are tremendous these days and a hundred thousand dollars, in many instances, is just not enough.

"However, I am concerned with the large jump without an attendant tying of that jump to the assets of the banks involved or the financial institutions involved.

"I just hope that we keep an eye on it during the interim and, hopefully, with some research I hope to be working on, will, perhaps, indicate next session whether or not further modification of this section is needed. My concern is that in the smaller banks, smaller financial institutions, five hundred thousand dollars is a lot of money, and I think we just have to be on the lookout that all board members be kept aware of those transactions and that shareholders, as well as depositors, are protected to the maximum abilities that the State can put forward.

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and S.B. No. 1286, SD1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO BANKING", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 47 ayes, with Representatives Horita, M. Ige, Metcalf and Tajiri being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 1286 had passed Third Reading at 1:20 o'clock p.m.

#### S.B. No. 1483, SD1:

By unanimous consent, action was deferred one day.

At 1:20 o'clock p.m., Representative Okamura asked for a recess, and the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 1:26 o'clock p.m.
