In accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, the House of Representatives of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1988, convened at 10:07 o'clock a.m.

The Honorable Daniel J. Kihano, Speaker of the House of Representatives, presided.

The National Anthem and Hawaii Ponoi were sung by Ms. Marlene Sai.

The Chair appointed Representatives Andrews, Arakaki, Horita, M. Ige, Kawakami and O'Kieffe to escort Reverend Christopher Eng of the Waipahu United Church of Christ to the rostrum.

The Divine Blessing was then invoked by Reverend Christopher Eng.

GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE

Gov. Msg. No. 1, informing the House of the appointment of Roland M. Kotani to fill the vacancy in the State House of Representatives, 44th District, created by the appointment of Eloise Y. Tungpalan to the State Senate, effective December 17, 1987, and pursuant to Section 17-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, Representative Kotani's term of office will expire on General Election Day of 1988, was read by the Clerk and placed on file.

The Chair appointed Representatives Hashimoto, D. Ige, Okamura, Shito and Anderson to escort Roland M. Kotani to the rostrum.

The Chair then appointed Representatives Alcon, Apo, Hiraki, Hirono and Liu to wait upon the Honorable Associate Justice Walter M. Heen, to request him to administer the oath of office to Roland M. Kotani.

OATH OF OFFICE

The Chair, thereupon, called upon the Honorable Associate Justice Walter M. Heen who then administered the oath of office to Roland M. Kotani, in accordance with the provisions of Article III, Section 5, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

At 10:30 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair, to allow the members of the House and their guests to be entertained by the Society of Seven.

Upon reconvening at 11:13 o'clock a.m., the Chair appointed Representatives Oshiro, Souki, Tajiri and Marumoto to escort Vice Speaker Emilio Alcon to join him at the rostrum.

The Chair then delivered the following address:

"Governor Waihee and Mrs. Waihee, Lieutenant Governor Cayetano and Mrs. Cayetano, Chief Justice Herman Lum, Congressman Daniel Akaka, distinguished guests, members of the House, ladies and gentlemen. .ALOHA!

"As the Speaker of the House, I look upon the opening of the session as a shared opportunity to renew our efforts toward building a strong State, toward building our PRIDE IN HAWAII.

"In years past, this House has built a record of service to the people based on the belief that however good this State may be, it can always be better. It is in this light, therefore, that we must address the needs of today, for those needs are great and the demands for our resources diverse.

"With the help and hard work of the members of this House, we can make Hawaii into the very best that it can be.

"I give you my pledge, that it shall be the policy of this House to listen with objectivity and to evaluate every possible point of view that is brought before it. We shall do this in the spirit of fairness.

"We will consult advisers of both liberal and conservative thought, weigh the counsel of all members of the House, and make decisions for Hawaii which are both fair and just.

"We will establish a policy of fair legislative action to encourage economic development and bring prosperity for our people. Job opportunities and a strong economic base are critical for the future of this State.

"It is fair that both the public and private sectors take up the challenge of solving the problems that we now face. No longer can we look to government alone to provide all the niceties of life that we have come to expect. The private sector too must do its part in an efficient and cost effective manner.

"Historically, the Democratic Party has been supported by labor because it has improved the lot of the worker. Today, it is equally interested in the success of business, not only because this is the fair thing to do, but because both business and labor are best served by a strong, growing economy.

"The Democratic Party emerged as the Party of the people in the late fifties, and in many ways its common denominator has been its willingness to break new ground, to adapt to the needs of the present, and to meet challenges of the future. It is with this spirit of challenge, therefore, that I ask you to enter the 1988 legislative session.

"I challenge the business community, as well as government, to develop a workable solution to the problem of building more affordable housing. It is only with the cooperation of landowners, lenders, builders, labor and government that a program which is fair to all can be developed.

"I challenge you to join us in devising effective means for protecting the poor. Father DuTeil's peanut butter ministry is the kind of program that we seek. It shows what can be done with the concern of one man and the helping hands of many. Simple, conscience-soothing government handouts can no longer be the only answer.

"In the past, we developed well-meaning governmental programs on welfare. In doing so, we removed that function as it had been traditionally carried out by churches and other culturally-oriented associations. Unfortunately, we unwittingly removed the imparting of values that historically went along with that aid. We have forgotten that fairness means both giving and taking. . .if they receive aid, then respect and care for others should follow.

"I challenge you to bring to every facet of life in Hawaii, be it government, business, or any other segment of society, the true spirit of aloha. When a stranger walks into a busy government office, greet him not with disdain and arrogance, but with a sincere desire to help. By the same token, when a stranger enters a private business, treat him with fairness, and even more, with that true spirit of aloha.

"I challenge you to take advantage of the government services that we provide...of our educational system, where teachers have been criticized for doing too little, while over the years they have been made more responsible for teaching our children not only the 3-R's but the basic values of life as well.

"Fairness forces us to recognize that classrooms and teachers alone cannot build a better educational system for our children. It's time now for parents to give of themselves to their own. Read to your children. Listen to their concerns. Visit your child's classroom and

supplement the learning that takes place there with your own support at home. With your help, schools will not only be respected centers of learning, but sources of PRIDE IN HAWAII.

"I challenge you to use government services in the cooperative manner that the community of Mililani did when they were faced with contaminated water. They did not merely sit by and demand government action, they devised a fair and workable plan that earned them recognition as one of the model communities in America. They pursued an ideal, and with the hard work of many individuals who sought nothing but the betterment of their community, they managed to achieve their goal and in the process bring national recognition and pride to the State of Hawaii.

"I challenge you to help us find a workable solution to the problems of the elderly who have traditionally held a very special place in the hearts of our families. With social security and fixed income checks being eaten away, and catastrophic illnesses that are not covered by insurance, care must be taken to assure that these special people who have given so much of themselves are treated fairly and with aloha.

"I challenge you to support the much needed programs that have been designed to help new immigrants meld into our community. Hawaii has long served as a model where the best of many backgrounds grow together to make an even better Hawaii. Private programs, like Temari, which encourage the learning of artistic and cultural skills, as well as public programs which provide language training, job training, and general nuturing, provide tangible evidence of the pride Hawaii has in all its people.

"At the same time, I challenge our new citizens to live up to the obligations of citizenship. Accept our ways, without forsaking the wonders of the past. Take heed of the accomplishments of immigrants like Hue Cao, a Waipahu Elementary School student who early learned the meaning of Democracy from her conscientious teachers, and embraced the spirit of aloha to a point where she earned the pride of the nation.

"I challange you to come to the aid of your neighbors in times of disaster. In response to the recent flood, I challenge the insurance industry to create an informational network that can immediately respond to the distress and the concerns that victims of disaster must face. The need to have their questions answered in a timely manner is only fair play.

"I challenge you to devote the kind of time and energy that it takes to make you the best of what you can be; the kind of commitment to a cause that our University of Hawaii Wahines gave to becoming Numer 1 in the nation; to giving enough to this commitment for all to share in the pride that evolves.

"I challenge you to help us build Hawaii into the islands of aloha. Our people have been characterized by their spirit of aloha, and it is now our destiny to share that spirit with the rest of the world. . .by building a meeting center of the Pacific where ideas are shared rather than imposed, by building a center of commerce between America and the Pacific nations, by providing training centers for the many disciplines that are sought by interaction between the Pacific nations and the rest of the world. To help us realize this destiny, I propose the establishment of a commission on Pacific affairs in Hawaii.

"These challenges are, of course, only the beginning of our list of 'Things to do.' There is work enough for all of us. To build our islands of aloha, to assure programs that are fair to every segment of society in every part of the State, from Hawi to Waiohinu, from Hana to Lahaina, from Kaena to Manele, from Halawa to Kapuhi, from Waianae to Hawaii Kai, to Koloa to Hanalei, from Kikepa to Kawailoa. . .will require the progressive support of our executive branch, and the unlimited vision and tireless determination of the members of this House. So join us now in meeting these challenges and building these islands of Aloha with fairness, pride and the true spirit of Aloha.

"This is our objective. This is our policy. $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) +\left(1\right)$

"Mahalo and Aloha."

The Chair recognized Representative Liu, Minority Leader, who then responded:

"Mr. Speaker, Governor and Mrs. Waihee, Lieutenant Governor and Mrs. Cayetano, friends, and even the one or two of you who may think of me as something less than a friend, even to you I wish you all a happy and very healthful New Year, and to all the families who have endured and suffered during these past few weeks while recovering from the flooding of the New Year's Eve, a very special Aloha. The resolve and patience that you have displayed during this difficult period has injected real spiritual strength within all of us who call Hawaii home. And ironically, we are now surely a stronger and closer community.

"This is an year in which we must look forward rather than backward for answers to our problems. This is the year in which we in government must understand the obvious, that criticism goes hand in hand with being decisive. But better to be decisive and accept criticism than to allow issues like mass transit, the teaching of verbal communication skills to our children and the convention center site to languish in a quagmire of confusion. 1988 is an election year and we should be held clearly accountable for things that happen as well as for things that do not. Life is much too short to center it around planning on how to avoid traffic every morning. Let's make a commitment to mass transit. The years available for a child to learn are too few to have to wait five or ten more for significant improvement in how communication skills are taught in our schools. So let us expand learning centers and give our teachers the tools to teach. The competition is growing too fast to allow us to procrastinate again on a convention center site. Mr. Governor, make your choice early in the session, push us. Do not wait until the end as we did in 1987.

"On these issues, it is time to fish or cut bait. House Republicans will be repetitious in reminding the Majority that the public wants movement on these questions. Why should the Majority make our jobs look more difficult by putting off the hard decisions. Or worse, succumb to temptation by allowing the somewhat revised but still very dangerous 1988 model of the Office of Planning now in the Governor's kuleana to be the all-knowing in every watchful guiding hand of policy for this State. This office has the potential to stifle creative thinking on the part of the department heads, the Legislature, and private citizens. The Office of Planning, with grand and limitless powers, lies contrary to the entrepreneurial spirit that should be fostered within as well as outside of government. Republicans oppose undue accumulation of power in the hands of non-elected officials within the Governor's Office. Let us not try to escape accountability for our actions.

"And, Mr. Speaker, accountability will be a watchword for us. We should be held accountable to the growing segment of our population that is advancing in years. The early effort on the part of the House to explore alternative plans to fully paid government long-term care programs is to be encouraged. We will work wholeheartedly with the Majority to foster educational programs, pointing out the need for all of us to plan ahead by wise management of our resources by cutting red tape to aid private sector experience for long-term care. An implementation of reasonably priced insurance programs for such care, care which is not covered now by Medicaid or Medicare, tax incentives and cost-sharing for both the providers of insurance and receivers of the care should also be explored this year.

"We should be held clearly accountable for what we do with an over \$450-million surplus. I repeat, \$450-million -- 4-5-0. This is a big surplus. All fifty-one House members--all of us--should be able to go back to our districts this spring and in good faith say that we seriously weighed giving some of that money back to taxpayers. In these uncertain economic times I think a family of four would welcome a check from the State of at least \$640. That would still leave \$200-million for carefully planned initiatives in areas like child care and drug enforcement.

"Conversely, it would be silly for us to be held accountable for support for another state insurance company. This time, writing workers compensation policies at the possible cost of \$20-million. Do we need it? No! There are 200 companies writing workers' compensation insurance today and the State's track record as an insurer is dismal. Thrift Guaranty cost us \$30-million. The State Patients' Compensation Fund cost us another \$20-million. When will we learn? I hope it will be in 1988.

"Many, many other subjects of social, cultural, economic and political importance should be discussed this year. Republicans hope that they will, and I take heart in your opening comments, Mr. Speaker, because it is our belief that a large part of our responsibility as legislators is to ensure and foster tough and open debate on key issues of prime concern. We need to see issues such as pornography, issues like the now meaningless resign to run law, issues like tort reform debated, not bottled up or brought up in a perfunctory committee hearing at 3:00 a.m. in the morning.

"Mr. Speaker, I assure you that by these words, I do not mean to say that we will exercise our right to question and speak irresponsibly nor do I mean to say that we will speak up to merely hear our own voices. But it is to say that we will tenaciously pursue the goal of making public discussion a more accepted practice of politics in Hawaii because it simply makes for better and fairer problemsolving and underlies my message today, and I think the message that we will hear from the voters in November. That is, accountability to those we serve.

"Mr. Speaker, on closing day, or closing evening, I hope we will be able to look back on this session and say that rather than being mere results of the past, we were the cause for the future.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair then recognized Representative Okamura, Majority Leader, who responded:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

"Mr. Speaker, my fellow colleagues, Governor and Mrs. Waihee, Lieutenant Governor and Mrs. Cayetano, honored guests and friends. . .Good Morning.

"Today we stand at a benchmark in our history. A short dozen years from now we will be in the 21st century. With a shift in world attention away from the Atlantic to the Pacific, the next century will indeed be a Pacific century.

"What role will we play?

"The decisions we make now will limit or expand the opportunities we enjoy tomorrow. Let us set our course today to seize a role of leadership in the economic and social development of the Pacific. Let us affirm our determination today to make Hawaii the future state.

"On this day, we join together to formally open the Fourteenth Session of the Hawaii State Legislature. In so doing, Mr. Speaker, we acknowledge the commitment of your leadership to bold innovation, to real accomplishment, to actively creating Hawaii's future. Under your guidance, Mr. Speaker, your House members have worked very diligently over the last six months on six issue groups -- on the space industry, on telecommunications, small business, the convention center, Honolulu waterfront, and the Pacific Basin -- to develop initiatives from which the State can march with confidence toward the year 2000. Let us review the first steps which we believe must be taken to build the foundation for our future.

"In the age of the Pacific, we pledge to seize the moment and move rapidly to establish Hawaii, the future state, as the information capital of the Pacific. Transoceanic fiber-optic cables will soon link our State with friends and business partners on the not-too-distant shores of lands all along the Pacific Rim, putting us in communication with partners who are eager to engage in exchanges which can only enhance the lives of people on both sides of the Pacific. We know with certainty, Mr. Speaker, that this opportunity is offered for but a brief period to us. If we fail to move quickly, Hawaii will be bypassed and fail to assume its rightful position at the helm of the knowledge industries of the new Pacific.

"Hawaii's role as the center of the Pacific requires a more aggressive, coordinated and far-sighted approach. We call for the establishment of an international affairs office to be lodged in the Office of the Governor with the specific mission of developing Hawaii's Pacific agenda and matching potential with real accomplishments in economic and cultural exchanges. We are committed to the vision of a new waterfront, a waterfront thriving with life in oceanside parks, multicultural events, world-class museums, and recreational and maritime activities, a rejuvenated waterfront which will make Honolulu the most vital and thriving port of call in the Pacific for visitors and residents.

"And while we pledge to move Hawaii beyond the confines of its shores to the horizons of the Pacific and Asia, we will also strive to bring Hawaii, the future state, to the outer reaches of space. We call for a commitment to establish a state office of space industries, to support our University of Hawaii's achievements on the cutting edge of space research, and to lay the groundwork for the establishment of a space launch facility in our islands. We will boldly seize the opportunity to lead in the development of the space industry in the Pacific.

"But Hawaii, the future state, will not only bring economic development and progress; Hawaii, the future state, will bring the spirit also of Aloha, of compassion and caring, into the society of the 21st century. Our standard will be that expressed by Hubert Humphrey when he said, 'We must judge societies by those in the dawn of life, the young; those in the dusk of life, the elderly; and those in the shadows of life, the poor.' For the young, we promise to build an educational system that will allow the next generation to contribute creatively, energetically and competently to the multicultural, multilingual, high tech world of the future. For the elderly, we are determined to provide the opportunity for those in their golden years to express themselves through new roles, to participate actively for as long as possible, in all facets of life--enjoying their remarkable longevity in a society which regards them with respect and care. For the less fortunate, we will strive to guarantee the right of all people to live productive lives characterized by human dignity and mutual respect.

"Once again, on behalf of your Democratic members, let me thank you, Mr. Speaker, for your leadership, your vision, and your heart. You have led the way to a new sense of vision, a new commitment to action. Mr. Speaker, citizens of the State, the Democratic Majority of the House of Representatives stands ready to make real this vision. To legislate courageously, to shape today the outlines of the 21st century, to produce real accomplishments that will stand in the decades of the future as a legacy of foresight, progress, compassion and leadership. Mr. Speaker, yours is a Democratic Majority that lives its commitment to Hawaii's people through action.

"We are ready.

"Our sights are set on the future, on the Pacific century which is just around the corner. Our vision is of Hawaii, the future state -- a shining beacon of economic prosperity and human compassion in the Pacific. As we strive to meet our challenges, let me paraphrase the words of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy: 'All this will not be finished in the first one hundred days. Nor will it be finished in the first one thousand days, nor at the turn of the century, nor even perhaps in our lifetime on this planet. But let us begin.'

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Team member Leeanna Merriweather could not attend today. We are also honored to have Head Coach, Dave Shoji; Assistant Coach, Dean Nowack; Volunteer Assistant Coach, Michi Yoshino; Team Manager, Kepa Cummings; Trainer, Melody Toth; Athletic Director, Stan Sheriff; and Women's Athletic Director, Cindy Mazda.

"Mr. Speaker, these are Hawaii's own University of Hawaii Rainbow Wahine Championship Team."

Representative Marumoto then rose and remarked:

"I wanted to let the House know that Coach Shoji was also a basketball coach and he got some well-deserved recognition in the field of volleyball, but I thought some of you might know that years back, he did coach JV basketball. My son played under him more years ago

than I care to admit and I followed his progress. I am so proud of him and all the Wahines, and I was pleased to attend many of the games, and I am just thrilled.

"Thank you so much, Wahines."

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House, today we are recognizing and honoring a very dedicated, charming and hardworking lady, Lydia Ranger, who has committed 27 years of her life in our Hawaii State Library System of which 16-plus of those years were spent in serving an underprivileged segment of our population as our first librarian of the Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. Lydia tells me that she doesn't know where those 27 years went so fast. And as of this past Friday, she has retired from public service.

"When Lydia assumed the helm of the head librarian for the Blind and Physically Handicapped some 18 years ago, her primary goal was to make this segment of the

library of equal standard, of equal quality, as accessible, as exciting, and as encompassing as the rest of our State Library System. And she has accomplished this in so many ways in her tenure as head librarian by developing, monitoring and maintaining funds and programs for library services to the blind and the physically handicapped, by expanding public library services to State-supported residential institutions, by expanding and improving services, including a permanent audio-visual technician, making the Kapahulu Library for the Blind accessible with soundproof recording booths duplicating equipment rooms for transcription by working closely with private groups. This lady had a knack with private groups like Civitan to get money and that is what Lydia was very successful in doing because she was so giving and charming.

"As for me personally, I couldn't imagine how life would be now if I didn't have the opportunity during my childhood, and even adulthood, to visit Lydia's library. That's how I know it as, and to read so many fictions and non-fictions and get away from the Legislature and read books and magazines, especially PLAYBOY. I really enjoy.

you know, I hope Marsland doesn't go there--that's not pornography. Good touch. You guys want to try your eyes closed with the PLAYBOY, I think Lydia can develop a few copies there. It's a masterpiece.

"Anyway, I would like to introduce several friends, colleagues, people who have supported Lydia. They are in the gallery, and I am going to call your names and please rise as you are recognized and we will all applaud after at one shot."

Representative Tom then asked the following persons to stand to be recognized: Mary Hirata; Bartholomew Kane, head librarian; Katherine Knight, Sally Morgan, Fusako Miyashiro, Sue Sugimura, Nancy Tokuda, Misao Asato, Jay Van Zwalenburg, and members of the Library Advisory Commission.

Representative Tom then asked the honoree, Lydia Ranger, to stand to be recognized and stated: "I want to say real quickly that one of the things that Lydia dreams that we are going to see soon is automation for our circulation in the Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. We are the only segment, Chairman Tam, that doesn't have automation for the Circulation Department. All the rest of the system has it."

Representative Tom then asked William Ranger, husband of Lydia, to stand to be recognized.

Floral leis were presented to Mrs. Ranger by Representative Tam, to Mr. Ranger by Representative Hashimoto, and a certified copy of the resolution was presented to the honoree by Representative Tom.

FOURTH DAY

Monday, January 25, 1988

The House of Representatives of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1988, convened at 10:00 o'clock a.m., with the Speaker presiding.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Patricia Mumford, Executive Director of the Hawaii Council of Churches.

At 10:05 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

JOINT SESSION

Upon reconvening at 10:10 o'clock a.m., the House of Representatives met in Joint Session with the Senate, pursuant to House Concurrent Resolution No. 1, to receive the Governor's address. (Gov. Msg. No. 48)

At this time, the Speaker welcomed and introduced the following distinguished guests to the members of the Fourteenth Legislature:

The First Lady of the State of Hawaii, Mrs. Lynne Waihee. She was accompanied by her two children, John and Jennifer. Pikake and ilima leis were presented to Mrs. Waihee and her children by Representative Apo, Senator George and Senator Hagino.

The Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawaii, the Honorable Benjamin Cayetano, and former governor of the State of Hawaii, the Honorable George Ariyoshi and Mrs. Jean Ariyoshi.

Commander of the Fourteenth Coast Guard District, Rear Admiral William P. Kovalesky.

The Honorable Frank F. Fasi, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu; the Honorable Jay Hans Strasser, Dean of the Consular Corps in Hawaii; the Honorable Richard C. Smith, Consul General of the Australian Consulate; and the Honorable Tomas Gomez, III, Consul General of the Philippines.

First Lady of the House of Representatives, Mrs. Daniel J. Kihano.

The Chair then appointed Senators Patsy Young, Gerald Hagino and Mary George, and Representatives Emilio Alcon, Tom Okamura and Michael Liu to escort the Honorable John D. Waihee, Governor of the State of Hawaii, to the rostrum.

Senator Patsy Young presented Governor Waihee with a maile/ilima lei on behalf of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

The Speaker then presented to the members of the Fourteenth Legislature, and guests, the Honorable John D. Waihee, stating:

"Members of the House and Senate, ladies and gentlemen, I present to you the Governor of the State of Hawaii, John David Waihee."

The Governor addressed the Joint Session, stating:

"Thank you.

"President Wong, Speaker Kihano, members of the Fourteenth State Legislature, honored guests, ladies and gentlemen. . . Aloha.

"Last year when I stood before you, I had little doubt that we, together, were embarking on a difficult journey through a world of change.

"I was barely two months on the job, the executive branch had a new cabinet; the House new leadership; and like myself, many of you, Democrats and Republicans alike, in the Senate and the House, had assumed new responsibilities. Indeed, through no fault of their own, the mantles of elder statesmen had descended on Dickie Wong in the legislative branch and Al Simone in the executive.

"Furthermore, it was absolutely clear that we were in the midst of a new Pacific era preparing to enter the twenty-first century. Our challenge: To seize new opportunities, lead Hawaii to the forefront of Pacific/Asian affairs and turn the corner of this century with authority. Our vision: To move all of Hawaii's people forward to reach their Pacific destiny.

"I called upon you for action, and you responded. You took the programs and ideas of a new administration, heard them, aired them, reshaped them, improved them, supported them and added programs and ideas of your own. Together, we took significant steps to meet our challenge and fulfill our vision.

"Today, we find ourselves at the beginning of a new session and a new year. Do we have the will, commitment and vision to continue the work we have begun? Are we willing to reach for greatness again?

"Last Thursday, I, along with many of you, attended the Red Mass and heard Reverend Clarence Liu quote from the book GRENDEL by John Gardner. The book tells the story of 'Beowulf' from the viewpoint of the dragon, Grendel. Grendel feels safe and observes of the ineffective peasants:

'There is no conviction in the old priests' songs; there is only showmanship. No one in the kingdom is convinced that the gods have life in them. The weak observe the rituals--take off their hats, put them on again, raise their arms, moan, intone, impress their palms together--but no one harbors unreasonable expectations.'

"My friends, it is reasonable for many in our community, based upon past experience, to assume that because of the strong divergence of opinion regarding the convention center we will be unable to select a site this session.

"It is reasonable, having heard it so many times before in Opening Day and State-of-the-State messages, for people to assume that there will be much ado about Hawaii's role in the Pacific or our need for affordable housing. But to expect few, if any, initiatives that rise to the occasion.

"It is reasonable to believe that there will be much activity and even resources spent on education, yet feel that, somehow, not enough is being done to insure accountability, address the quality of the end product or foster the involvement of all who have a stake in the outcome--administrators, teachers, parents and students alike.

"It is reasonable, reviewing our recent political past, to expect that various initiatives proposed for passage will invariably conjure up such labels as 'pro-business' or 'pro-labor' rather than discussions about what is good for Hawaii and our quality of life.

"It is reasonable for so-called political pundits, using conventional knowledge, to suggest that since this is an election year, we will be content to rest on our laurels of the past session--after all, a lot of good work was done--and avoid the tough decisions needed to face the challenges ahead.

"It is unreasonable to take a stand on commitment, vision and dreams. So the critics, like Grendel, sit complacently by, awaiting the status quo. What the naysayers have not counted on is that you and I have unreasonable expectations.

"Last week, our Senate President called upon us to 'dream big,' especially for our children; our Speaker of the House challenged all of us to rise to new heights based on our mutual pride in Hawaii; our House Majority Leader described Hawaii as the 'future State'; and our Minority Leader, in between light volleys over the bow, called for bi-partisan action.

"Likewise, my administration has publicly declared our intention to no longer accept the passive custodial role of pure administration. Instead, we have assumed a more aggressive role as investor, participant and catalyst in creating an economic and social environment which would best nurture the ideal of a Pacific community entering the twenty-first century.

"Quite a collective calling. A call for hands-on action. A willingness not merely to go for what we think we can get, but beyond.

"Now is the time to let the work begin.

"The future will place a new premium on our resourcefulness and ability to adapt to circumstances vastly different from those of the world we were born into. To meet new challenges we must build a society that will be competitive in the twenty-first century.

"Competitiveness starts in our schools. Last session we made sizable investments in the physical plants and program of our public schools. Today I am asking you to immediately ratify a teachers' salary contract which will allow us to attract strong candidates into teaching and to retain teachers dedicated to their profession.

"This session let us enhance our educational agenda with classroom success in mind. But beyond program enhancements, we must commit ourselves--educators, parents, children, business, labor, and those who believe President Wong, that children are the future--to our public schools if we are to move forward toward building a school system that is second to none.

"Our goal for higher education is nothing less than the premiere university of the Pacific/Asian region. Our Pacific-ness is at the core of our competitiveness, and we will succeed in the world to the extent that we are able to offer unique understandings of our human and physical environment.

"Let us build for excellence through the construction of a new Pacific Ocean Technology Center, support for research and instruction in marine and geological programs of the new school of ocean and earth sciences and technology and additional funding for the new school of Hawaiian, Asian and Pacific studies. "Competitiveness means bolstering our basic industries. Here we have major unfinished business--our convention center.

"Last session we came close to picking the spot for the center, only to find that there was no perfect site.

"Let us therefore consider the nature of the industry and the center. Convention centers have characteristically been built to stimulate the further growth of a visitor industry.

"However, that is only part of our purpose: We must also recognize that we cannot continue to prosper simply by welcoming ever-growing numbers of visitors. The quality of our product is of equal, if not greater, importance.

"Our visitor industry in Waikiki must have facilities which offer the space and accommodations that will attract off-season and higher-paying guests if it is to remain competitive and flourish. We must preserve and enhance what we already have.

"In facing the tough decision of selecting a site, we should be reminded that the epicenter of visitor lodging in Waikiki is the Royal Hawaiian Shopping Plaza, surrounded by some 40,000 hotel rooms.

"I believe that a center should be as close as possible to that location in Waikiki. Although several properties fall within this guideline, Fort DeRussy should not be included among them. We need its open space, and it simply will not be available, if at all, for a long time.

"In addition to your deliberation of known sites, I suggest you consider a partnership with the private sector to develop an urban convention center on private property. Suitable lands are properties around and including the Magoon Estates and the International Market Place. There may be others as well.

"Competitiveness means new industries, new products and the use of new technologies. Our steadfast goal is to diversify.

"Our products can be knowledge, tangible goods or marketable skills, so long as they originate here. We have a wealth of opportunities--in space, in the oceans, in renewable energy, in high technology. But all the creative thought devoted to these disciplines will come to nothing unless we can successfully convert our knowledge into trade and enterprise.

"To encourage that result, we are proposing the creation and funding of an Office of Technology Transfer and Economic Development at the University of Hawaii specifically charged with the task of bringing invention out of the laboratory and into the marketplace.

"For the same reason we propose the allocation of nearly \$7 million to the establishment of an innovation center which will serve as an incubator for high technology businesses and \$5.7 million for comparable facilities on Maui.

"As information is a product, action is needed to develop Hawaii as the information hub of the Pacific, through the brokering, processing and creation of information. In 1989, we will have a U.S. Mainland/Hawaii/Japan fiberoptic cable in operation. It is a new highway upon which we can move our goods. Let us open it to all.

"High among the sources of new technologies are space industries.

"Last year your action made it possible for us to investigate the existing potential for Hawaii. The findings are in; the windows of opportunity are open; let us move forward.

"We can advance our knowledge of the universe around us, as we are already doing from the top of Mauna Kea. Through the Hawaii Institutes for Astronomy and Geophysics, we can provide quality jobs in engineering, computer sciences and skilled trades. We can participate, as did the ancient navigators who found this island home of ours, in the exploration of the unknown.

"With your continued support, we will accelerate our efforts with a strategic plan for commercial launch services. And so we propose an appropriation for basic research in astronomy and astro-physics, for environmental and marketing studies of a launch site, for conceptualization of a space theme park and education center, and for space expertise to lead the way.

"The waterfront is the face of Honolulu. Its features include our industry and vitality, our beauty and our grace, and our unique character as a people of land and sea. From Keehi Lagoon, where potential for recreation and maritime industry abounds; to the treasured people-beckoning charisma of Aloha Tower; to the old and new of Kakaako. It is a remarkable resource, with vast potential unrealized.

"To compete we must make real the dream launched by the waterfront reawakening program to present to the world a waterfront of Hawaiian character--a place for people and new economic life; at the same time priority consideration must be given to the maritime requirements of a working harbor. Therefore, I urge:

- * The purchase of Kapalama Military Reservation from the federal government to open new lands for maritime businesses.
- * An appropriation of \$18.1 million to make Barbers Point Deep Draft Harbor a fully operational harbor, not only to take some of the load off the Honolulu waterfront, but to enhance economic development in Central and Leeward Oahu.
- * An appropriation of \$1.7 million to clean up Keehi Lagoon, the most beautiful eyesore in our State, and funds for planning and environmental impact statements for the lagoon.
- An appropriation of \$2.5 million for a coordinated areawide plan and development program for the waterfront.

"As we move forward with our aspirations for the future, we must remember that we are here for people, and that government with no heart is no government at all. The measurement of our compassion is how we take care of the needs of our people, and respond to the least fortunate among us.

"No human need is more basic than shelter. No family's dream more basic than a home of their own. Yet the average price of a single family home has risen over \$55,000 in the last eight years, rendering it, as it has been for far too long, unaffordable for so many of our families.

"Scarcity of land contributes to the lack of affordable housing. We must make more lands available for the construction of homes, and it is the policy of this administration to identify State lands suitable for development throughout the islands. We have prospects for the Big Island at Kealakehe, on Maui at Lahaina, and on Kauai, but on Oahu there is a notable shortage of public lands for this purpose.

"We were, therefore, pleased at the prospect of a second city on Oahu where people could live and work in a new urban center, rather than simply commuting to and from more urban expansion. Unfortunately, it just hasn't happened.

"To make land available for development on Oahu and assure the emergence of the second city at Ewa, I will be asking you to support the acquisition through purchase and lease either by negotiation or condemnation of some 4,000 acres on the Ewa Plain. This will form a ready land bank for timely home construction, as well as preserve the viability of agriculture in the area.

"In addition to land, we need capital to facilitate and expedite the construction of affordable homes, and I will be asking you for a \$120 million revolving fund to augment our existing resources.

"Land, capital and, finally, the participation of the private sector are essential ingredients of a successful affordable housing program. We need to make affordable housing good business, because only then will we have affordable homes. Not quotas, not conflicts--just homes.

"A compassionate society and government protect the well-being of the community through health leadership. We are embarking upon a long-overdue department-wide reorganization which will make our State Department of Health more administratively effective, more accessible to the public, and more responsive to the pressing health and environmental needs of our community. Moreover, this restructuring prepares the department for leadership of what has become a \$2 billion industry in Hawaii-health and health care.

"Three especially significant health initiatives we have proposed this year are: First, funds for an even more visible and effective AIDS education and prevention program; two, funds to initiate a special focus on the health needs of Hawaiians and to assist them in developing leadership in their own health promotion and disease prevention; and three, a new state laboratory to ensure that purity of our food and water supplies, provide state-of-the-art testing for AIDS, support new programs to monitor contaminants in our environment and provide health leadership to the private sector and our Pacific Island neighbors.

"A compassionate society keeps its obligations. The most obvious of which is our fiduciary duty to native Hawaiians. The issue of ceded land revenues must be resolved. We have begun discussions with the Office of Hawaiian Affairs on this matter, and while the process of arriving at a fair and just settlement will not be easy or always pleasant-indeed it may even take longer than one session--we are committed to settling this issue once and for all.

"A compassionate government does not abide the wreckage of human lives. In the catalog of things that cause harm to families and individuals, there is no more insidious an evil than substance abuse, which breeds crime and destroys lives. In 1987, our vigorous State-operated drug eradication programs took almost one billion dollars of marijuana out of our lands. That's three and a half times as much marijuana as was eradicated the prior year. With your help, we have also launched an

aggressive federal, state and county \$1.5 million program to eradicate drugs where they are grown, transported and sold.

"In addition, we must attack the problem from the people side to prevent and end abuse. Thus, we have proposed an additional appropriation of \$2.3 million for drug treatment, education and prevention.

"And, of course, a drug free Hawaii has no need for drug paraphernalia. It is time to pass such legislation.

"In the past we have usually measured our compassion for the less fortunate by the kinds and amount of 'safety net' assistance and services provided. In many cases this was enough to help an individual or family through a rough period. But too often our help, however well intended, reduced individuals and families to the captivity of dependency instead of liberating them from the cycle of poverty.

"My friends and fellow policy-makers, I do not believe that creating this kind of dependence is a compassionate act. True compassion recognizes the dignity of the human being.

"Ask the people of Molokai what they prefer: Jobs or more welfare?

"We did, by going into partnership with them and employers on Maui and subsidizing a ferry to take workers to jobs. Many cynics said it wouldn't work, but the people responded. Last September, Molokai's unemployment rate stood at 14.2%. By December it had declined 56% to 6.3%. Today, if you go to Molokai, you will find a new sense of hope.

"Our people deserve opportunity and dignity. The goal of a compassionate society is independence.

"To prevent dependency we need to do more than change or even add programs. We must change mindset. We need to view government assistance through the eyes of those who need help. Do we offer our people a program from a catalog, or do we give them a path to productivity, self-esteem and a more independent tomorrow?

"Last year you took a great step forward with the voluntary work fare program for welfare recipients, which has been dubbed 'Project Success.' This year we must continue to make similar investments in our people.

"And yes, Mr. Speaker, the search for independence is nowhere so poignant as among our senior citizens, who all too often are prematurely forced to give up everything that home means to them to enter a nursing facility. It is one of the great challenges of our time to pioneer new methods of home care. We need funds for demonstration projects and for a searching investigation of the most suitable means of financing long term care and the needed shift to community-based care.

"Hawaii families often require the support of both parents. The situation is even more acute with singleparent homes. In far too many cases, the result is usually a female-headed family, dependent on public assistance.

"To compliment the efforts begun by 'Project Success,' we are proposing a new training program aimed at getting unemployed fathers of dependent children into the workforce and earning wages from which they can pay child support.

"Furthermore, parents who need to work need day care that does work. To meet the growing need for child care for youngsters from infancy to age two, for which conventional child care programs are not available, we are proposing an expanded program of recruitment, training and licensing of family day care operators.

"And to create a government and private sector partnership for child care, we propose a pilot project to help employers develop new and more effective programs, using our tax laws to assist employees with child care needs.

"Hawaii has over 100,000 people who are functionally illiterate. Many of them cannot find work, and those who do have little hope of getting a better position or dealing with a layoff. All of them must face the shame of knowing they cannot help their children with school work, or read a manual at work.

"To boost the highly productive efforts of the Governor's council for literacy, we are proposing an appropriation to support private sector initiatives and a system of matching grants. Literacy for the individual means choice, self-fulfillment and self-esteem.

"Providing affordable shelter for our families, protecting the health of our people and giving those who enjoy less of life's opportunities the ability to be independent are the attributes of a caring, compassionate society.

"My friends, how we enter the 21st century is ours to decide. Will Hawaii have the means to compete in an international economy? Will we be the kind of compassionate society that embraces all of our people in the search for a Pacific destiny?

"Today, we have the opportunity to determine tomorrow. Our guiding force is the depth of our commitment to define the future, to take the contract between people and state and affirm it with our greatest expectations and vision.

"Commitment means finding new ways to solve old problems. Last year we brought about the most comprehensive reorganization of state government since statehood. Today, I announce the creation of a Committee on Excellence, headed by businessman Bobby Pfeiffer to hear from government's customers and recommend to us how we can improve our services.

"Commitment means using all of government's resources to tackle the tough problems. That is why this year, with our encouragement and support, all county police chiefs, prosecutors and the State's chief law enforcement officer, our Attorney General, have for the first time come together as one with a crime-fighters legislative package. The common enemy is crime. The common commitment is to end it.

"Commitment means partnership--private and public, county and state--to get the best, the very best, out of ourselves. To turn our vision of affordable housing and waterfront renewal into reality, we need and invite the participation of the private sector which is responsible for most development in Hawaii, the county governments which have housing resources of their own, and especially the county councils who are charged with the responsibility of zoning urban lands.

"Commitment means not being anchored to yesterday's paradigms or caught up in today's buzzwords. Commitment means focusing on tomorrow.

"I have heard it said that a person can only cross the same stream once. Because the stream changes. And so does the person.

"Now is our time to cross the stream of change as changing people, with the firm footing of our 'Pacificness,' our island kinship and heritage.

"Competitiveness, compassion, commitment, unreasonable expectations, but the issue is the future, the time is now, and we are the people to do it."

Senate President Richard Wong then rose and stated:

"Thank you very much, Governor Waihee. I am not sure what to say. I had a few things that I wanted to say but I think, in all tribute to you, that kind of presentation was one I haven't heard for quite a little while. I must say, Governor, that your agenda and the legislative agenda for this next session appears to be almost the same. I do realize that in the process, we will be taking into serious consideration the suggestions you have made and, of course, allow some opportunity for legislative input into the product. And I am confident that with everything working in synch that we should come up with a heck of a session.

"Governor, I do want to assure you that the Legislature is prepared to go to work. I think, members of the House and the Senate, it is time to roll up our sleeves and let the work begin.

"If there are no further discussions by members of this Joint Session, I declare this Joint Session adjourned."

At 10:55 o'clock a.m., the Joint Session with the Senate adjourned and the House stood in recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

"Today we honor the March of Dimes and congratulate this organization for fifty years of immeasurable dedication to the health of our mothers and children. I would now, Mr. Speaker, like to introduce to you the members of the Foundation Chapter of the Pacific."

Representative Bunda then asked the following honorees to stand to be recognized: Mr. John Henry Felix, National Trustee of the March of Dimes; Mr. Ed Pai, Chapter Chairman; Mr. Warden Miner, Area Director from California; and Mrs. Edith Woodworth, "a very famous, a very special person. She is the first diagnosed polio patient in Hawaii and had the privilege of meeting President Roosevelt at Tripler Army Medical Center;" Miss Lynne Cook, Executive Director of the Chapter of the Pacific; and Mr. Ed Paik, Senior Vice President of Development."

Representative Isbell then rose and said:

"I have been a direct recipient of the March of Dimes. I also had polio, bulbar polio, when I was sixteen and spent many months in the Crippled Children's Hospital in Helena, Montana, which received a large amount of its funds from the March of Dimes. Representative Andrews then asked He Dexin, the leader of the delegation; Cheng Chuanyao, Zhu Tanguan, Huang Jinrong and Shi Pengfei, to stand to be recognized.

Representative Andrews continued:

"Mr. Speaker and members, Mr. Shi was the interpreter for Mr. Neill at his seminar in Beijing that Representative Honda and I attended, and I know the Legislature appreciates their assistance and we look forward to a long and fruitful cooperative relationship between the People's Republic of China and Hawaii's wind energy programs.

"I believe at this time Representative Honda has some additional remarks."

Representative Honda rose and stated:

"Thank you.

"In addition to the delegation that we are honoring on the floor this morning, we have, in the gallery, several more scholars and engineers from the People's Republic of China. They are working with the Hawaii Natural Energy Institute of the University of Hawaii as graduate research assistants, visiting researchers and post doctoral researchers in renewable energy. They are from the top universities in China and are outstanding students and reseachers. They are part of the HNEI-China cooperative program where eight universities have signed agreements, and a non-profit corporation is being created in Hawaii to continue the relationship when they return to China. I will not try to introduce each one of them by name, but I would want to ask them to please stand up to be acknowledged.

"As a token of this growing friendship between China and Hawaii, the new Hawaii-China-Asia Energy and Technology Corporation which is being incorporated in Hawaii this very day, is pleased to present to each member of this House a little fan that you find on your desks. And this fan is to help keep you cool when there is too much hot air circulating in this chamber."

Floral leis were presented to the honorees by Representatives Isbell, Hashimoto, Hirono, Horita and Fukunaga, while Representatives Andrews and Honda presented Mr. Dexin with a certified copy of the resolution.

And I would like to tell each member here that as far as leadership and statesmanship, I believe it is more in the House of Representatives than in the Senate. They have, always in the past, been the ones that always got. . they were the real statesmen of Hawaii and we were sort of secondary.

So, I would like to congratulate every member of this House and I hope they will vote for the bill, and I thank you very much, Mr. Speaker."

"On the eve of the Great Aloha Run, we're very happy to acknowledge one very sweet lady who can galvanize and organize people into doing what they want to do but don't for lack of leadership. It is only fitting that we recognize this dynamic personality and this very caring person.

"It is my pleasure to introduce to you today Miss Carole Kai."

Representative Marumoto continued:

"She has brought with her today two gentlemen who have also contributed very much to Hawaii.

"The first is a resident genius who came up with the idea of the Great Aloha Run during a violent brainstorm one night. He is a man familiar to many of us in government because we know him as the Editor-in-Chief of the Honolulu Advertiser. He is a great person--Mr. Buck Buckwach."

"Today, we also have Dr. Jack Scaff with us and Dr. Scaff is a respected cardiologist in town, a leader in sports medicine and aviation medicine. He has worked tirelessly for the health and welfare of our people in general and the running community in particular. He has become renowned for his organizational efforts, and he is the one who bears much of the responsibility for the success of these runs. He is the Director of the Great Aloha Run/Walk--Dr. Jack Scaff."

"I know many of you will be participating this weekend and Carole asked me to remind you that you can pick up your packets at NBC. So, I hope a lot of you will be participating."

THIRD READING

S.B. No. 151, HD 1:

Representative Hayes moved that S.B. No. 151, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Hagino.

Representative Metcalf rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in support of Senate Bill 151, House Draft 1, relating to drug paraphernalia.

"Mr. Speaker, drug abuse and its attendant social repercussions threaten us all. This realization is reflected on our existing laws which seek to prevent free and easy access to controlled substances. It seems then to be a contradiction of the most conspicuous sort that the same body of laws which recognizes the inherent danger of drugs also permits the sale and possession of drug paraphernalia.

"This bill is intended to redress this omission by making paraphernalia illegal. It follows the provisions of the Model Drug Paraphernalia Act drafted by the Drug Enforcement Administration of the United States Department of Justice.

"While we at the legislature have been subject to criticism for our caution in adopting a paraphernalia law, I must note that on matters bearing constitutional implications, we have a particular duty to consider the right course of action and not merely that which is popular or otherwise politically expedient. Prudence, therefore, demanded that we study the progress of the model act to insure that it could indeed stand up to the scrutiny of the courts. It has since been found to meet constitutional muster and is, in fact, law in 38 states and the District of Columbia.

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to recognize the sponsors of House Bill 2079, the body of which constitutes the House draft to the Senate bill. They are Representative Shon, Representative Bellinger, Representative Hayes, Representative Tom. I would like, as well, to recognize the efforts of my colleagues who have previously introduced versions of this bill. They include Representative Peters, Representative Tom, Representative Hiraki, Representative Bellinger and Representative Bunda.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Hayes rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, as a resident of Waikiki, I am well aware of the prevalence of so-called 'head shops.' It is

shocking to residents of my district that they can walk down the street and see hypes made for marijuana, for cocaine, for heroine, and all the assorted paraphernalia that accompany that.

"I am very grateful that the bill has passed the House and I look forward to seeing a different horizon when I walk down the streets.

"Thank you."

Representative Liu rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"I appreciate the comments of the Chairman of the House Judiciary Committee. I am happy to see the change in attitude since many years prior to my holding this seat, in sitting on the committee it's been interesting to see the development and changes in attitude on this measure. But I would only hope that although caution should be a watchword in many areas of the law, in some areas where we deal with fundamental values and contradictions in what we say and what we do, that we would be in the forefront rather than in the back row.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and S.B. No. 151, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO DRUG PARAPHERNALIA", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Horita and Peters being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 151 had passed Third Reading at 12:07 o'clock p.m.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions (H.R. Nos. 79 and 80) were read by the Clerk and were disposed of as follows:

- H.R. No. 79, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION HONORING THE MILILANI HIGH SCHOOL MATH TEAM FOR ITS STATE, REGIONAL AND NATIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS," was offered by Representative Lee.
- On motion by Representative Lee, seconded by Representative Anderson and carried, H.R. No. 79 was adopted.

Representative Lee rose to introduce the honorees, stating:

- "Mr. Speaker, education is the key not only to personal development but also to economic development.
- "We know what education means to us personally, but we should also know what it means for economic development.
- "When I was born, there was only one public high school in Honolulu--McKinley--but many private high schools, among them Punahou, Kamehameha, Iolani, St. Louis.
- "To get ahead then, one had to go to school--to a private high school. For the others, especially those living in the rural areas, which in those days began in Kalihi, there were no high schools, there were only plantations.
- "All that has changed. Our Speaker is a graduate of Waipahu High School. Our Lieutenant Governor is a graduate of Farrington High School and many of my colleagues are graduates of the public schools.
- "The rise in public education meant not only personal development but also economic development for the islands. The change from the plantation days to modern Hawaii is dramatic, and we got here largely because of education.
- "Today, we would like to honor the achievements of one of the newest high schools in the State--Mililani. I am proud to do so, not only because it is a high school in my community--the community I represent--but also because my daughter graduated last year, my son Thomas is a freshman, and my youngest son Andrew will be in the class of 1991. It is a good school. It has made its mark in mathematics, but it has wider horizons.

"This year, for the first time, the Central District has an after-school drama class involving three high schools-Waialua, Leilehua and Mililani. And this class is held in Mililani. Many of you may have read about the first production of PINNOCHIO at the Mililani High School cafeteria. The Mililani High School is also scheduled to be a learning center in science, provided we appropriate the monies at this session. This center will open in 1989.

"But today, we are going to honor what the school has achieved on its own. You have heard the resolution. I don't think we need to elaborate on them. It is very clear that the achievements of the math team are due to dedicated teachers, committed students and involved parents. Allow me, members of the House and Mr. Speaker, the honor to introduce the coaches, teachers and students of the Mililani High School Math Team."

Representative Lee then asked the following teachers to stand to be recognized: Sharon Abe, "an inspirer of this whole group"; Carolyn Okunaga "who has devoted much time in tutoring her students, not only those who are ahead in their work, but also those who need additional help"; Aileen Kajiwara "who has been very helpful and has been overlooked because she is quite retiring; Edward Sawada, "the person who has started it all and who remains the coordinator of the whole program"; and Philip Abe, "the fifth teacher who deserves a special mention. He is not a public school teacher. He teaches regularly at the Variety Club School, but he has volunteered his spare time, particularly on the weekends, in tutoring the students."

Representative Lee then asked the following students to stand to be recognized: Merritt Eto. "Last year when all these achievements were made, Merritt placed sixth among the top 15 juniors throughout the country, winning third place in the probability examination and again third place in the number theory examination"; Glenn Tachibana. "He placed fourth among the 15 top juniors in the nation and he did this with a score higher than the highest senior grade. They all got the same questions, and he won second place in the functions examination"; Roanna Doty "who placed 10th among the top sophomores in the nation"; Melissa Aczon "who is now a junior"; and Shari-Lynn Sawa, a freshman.

Representative Lee then asked the following parents of the honorees who were seated in the gallery to stand to be recognized: Mr. & Mrs. Merrill Eto; Mr. Sawa; Mr. Tachibana; and Mr. Knud Rasmussen, President of the Golden Years Club in Mililani, Vice Chairman of the Mililani Neighborhood Board, and "he is the person who handwrites all the certificates which are given out to Mililani residents--our calligrapher in residence."

Vanda orchid leis were presented to the honorees by Representatives Isbell, O'Kieffe, Medeiros, Taniguchi, Marumoto, Hayes, Hashimoto, Crozier, Ihara and Fukunaga while Representatives Lee and Hiraki presented them with certified copies of the resolution.

"On this day designated as Institute Day when hundreds of dedicated teachers, salary raises gleefully in hand, are attending self-improvement workshops across the State, it is appropriate that we honor a public school teacher who epitomizes the dedication and excellence we desire in all our educators.

"While the resolution sings high praises for our award-winning honoree, I feel compelled to point out that she is a product of our public schools in Kalihi and our University of Hawaii. And what is really incredible is this 20-year veteran of teaching, like in the TV program, Welcome Back Kotter, returns to her alma mater to teach. For Farrington graduates like Representative Yoshimurand me, we recognize that as real dedication and guts. Even though she resides in Representative Anderson's district in Kailua, she chose to return to the community where she grew up to share her talents.

"Mr. Speaker, while our honored guest is deserved of all the superlatives heaped upon her, she represents but one of many teachers in our public schools who strive for and achieve excellence in education. We cannot possibly recognize all our dedicated educators with floor presentations. However, we, in our respective communities, should make every effort to pay tribute to excellence in education and praise those who best nurture and enhance our investment in Hawaii's future.

"With that thought in mind, Mr. Speaker and fellow members, I present to you with a great deal of pride the recipient of the 1987 Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching Science, Mrs. Jo Kanehiro."

Accompanying Mrs. Kanehiro was her husband, Mr. Gary Kanehiro.

Representatives Yoshimura, Hirono and Anderson presented floral leis to the honoree and her husband while Representative Alcon presented Mrs. Kanehiro with a certified copy of the resolution.

Representative Hemmings rose to speak against H.B. No. 2020, HD 1, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, there has been a plethora of bills this session appropriating money for various uses, some of which have been good, others questionable, and others obviously spendthrift endeavors just to burn off the surplus. We are talking about \$98-million worth of taxpayers' money to be spent for the State to acquire land, and the State is already one of the largest landowners in the State of Hawaii. We do not have enough wherewithal to take care of what we already have.

"There are great economies in the world. They are based upon free enterprise, private ownership and the ability of the individuals to develop their resources. I think we realize that many of the economies in the world that are in trouble are ones in which the state owns all the resources, they have central planning, and the 'state' does for people what they should and could do for themselves. Those economies are in trouble.

"So, Mr. Speaker, in the spirit of perestroika, I ask that this body vote this bill down. It's money not well spent.

"Thank you."

Representative Lee rose to speak in favor of H.B. No. 2020, HD 1, stating:

"I think in life, you look at spending in two ways. One, to consume, and on the other hand to invest.

"During the last seven years, we have seen an orgy of consumption on the part of the United States. We are greatly in debt to foreigners and the servicing of that debt

is going to be a heavy burden on our children and our grandchildren.

"What we have today is not a bill for consumption. It is a bill for investment. We all know how we invest individually. We skimp and save to send our children to school, to college, to set them up in their careers. In other words, we are investing. Spending for the sake of consumption is bad. I grant you that. Spending in the sense of investment is excellent. What we are doing today is investing in the future in our patrimony.

"This bill represents a verve and imagination and a foresight rarely seen in political life. And for that reason, it alone commands our attention and our support. But let's remember, it will never be as cheap as it is today, and it is wise to spend to invest and not to consume.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

As a practicing physician, Dr. Corboy opened one of the first medicare-certified outpatient eye surgery facilities in the United States--the Hawaiian Eye Surgery Center in Wahiawa.

"His service to the people of Hawaii has been outstanding, especially his devoted attention to the needs of the elderly, the senior clubs, retirement centers, and other golden-age citizens of our great State.

"Mr. Speaker, it gives me great pleasure to introduce to you and members of this honorable body Dr. John Corboy."

Representative Leong then asked Dr. Corboy to stand to be recognized. Accompanying Dr. Corboy was Mr. Robert Talent, "a very personal friend and also Community Relations Director at the Hawaiian Eye Center."

Representative Tom rose to introduce the honorees, stating:

"Kung Hee Fat Choy. This is the year of the dragon and it is with great pride for me personally as being of Chinese ancestry and an attorney that I introduce to this honorable body the ten-member delegation of judges and legal officials from the People's Republic of China.

"This is the largest delegation of judges and legal scholars ever to visit our country. They are here in Hawaii to participate in the China Law Conference which was held yesterday at the East-West Center, focusing on the increased use of courts, lawyers and administrative mechanisms to enforce the rights and obligations provided by the laws in China, and the positive effect that it has on the business enterprises in the People's Republic.

"Just to give you an example of the legal system, in 1985 there were 840,000 civil cases and 226,000 economic disputes in China, an increase of 160 percent from the year prior. Sounds like Hawaii, doesn't it?

"For the next several days, this delegation will be examining the many facets of Hawaii's court system, visiting with our courtrooms and talking to our judges and our legal scholars and learning how Hawaii's courts work."
