# Wednesday, January 20, 1993

In accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, the House of Representatives of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii convened in Regular Session on Wednesday, January 20, 1993.

The Honorable Dwight Y. Takamine, being the Representative at the time present who was elected from the First Representative District of the State of Hawaii, called the House to order at 10:02 o'clock a.m.

The members of the House, guests, and audience rose to sing the National Anthem led by Gilbert "Zoulu" Kauwe, and Hawaii Ponoi led by Nina Keali'iwahama.

The Temporary Chairman appointed Representatives Ululani Beirne, Romy Cachola, Kenneth Hiraki and Roy Takumi to escort Reverend Colton of Maui to the rostrum.

Reverend Colton then invoked the Divine Blessing.

## INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 1, declaring the Honorable Dwight Y. Takamine, Representative from the First District, as the duly elected Temporary Chairman of the House of Representatives of the Seventeenth Legislature was jointly offered by Representatives Say and Peters and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

On motion by Representative Say, seconded by Representative Peters and carried, H.R. No. 1 was adopted.

Representative Takamine stated:

"Members of the House of Representatives of the Seventeenth State Legislature, I am honored to serve as your Temporary Chair this morning. Thank you very much. Let us begin with the order of the day."

# INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 2, declaring the Honorable Joseph M. Souki, Representative from the Eighth District, and Jackie Young, Representative from the Fifty-First District, as Speaker and Vice Speaker, respectively, of the House of Representatives of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii was jointly offered by Representatives Okamura and Apo and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

On motion by Representative Okamura, seconded by Representative Apo and carried, H.R. No. 2 was adopted.

The Temporary Chairman appointed Representatives Rosalyn Baker, Avery Chumbley, Les Ihara, Jr., Paula Ishii-Morikami, David Morihara, Bob Nakasone, Jackie Young, Mike O'Kieffe and Cynthia Thielen to escort the newly elected Speaker to the rostrum.

The Temporary Chairman stated:

"Members of the House of Representatives, I present the Honorable Joseph M. Souki, the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Seventeenth Legislature." and presented the Speaker with the gavel.

The Speaker took the Chair and delivered his address, stating:

"Lt. Governor Cayetano, Chief Justice Lum, County Mayors, County Council Chairs, other distinguished guests, colleagues of the State House, and members of my Maui house -- my wife, Frances; and my daughter, Desire -- aloha, and welcome.

"I have been asked many times ... How does a nice Portuguese boy get a last name which sounds like half of a Japanese dish? The answer is simple. The name is not Japanese or Portuguese. It was bequeathed to me by my Austrian grandfather, Vincent Sucher, a merchant marine who came here in 1878, fell in love with the place and jumped ship.

"Somewhat similarly, my other grandfather, Antone Looms Gomes Ernesto, of Madeira, came here by sea. As the story goes, he went to a friend's bon voyage party in Madeira, had too much to drink, and passed out on board. He woke up at sea.

"So you see, one of my grandfathers jumped off ship, and the other jumped on -- apparently head first.

"The name Sucher, as you have already guessed, became Souki. But the islands and the extraordinary host culture changed far more than my name. It gave me my Maui roots, opportunities my ancestors could barely have imagined, and an island heritage from which to build and grow. The message of my grandfathers, and I know it to be so for all of you, is simple: It is not how you get to this earth that counts. It is how you leave it -- what you do with the chance.

"For this chance, to serve as your Speaker of the House, I am honored.

"We live in uncommon times.

"Here in America and home in Hawaii, we are caught between our yearning to see government do more for people, and our dread that government has gotten too big and controls too much of our lives. This is no time for the traditional struggle between left and right. It is time to reconcile our yearning to be a great society with our limits as a government. It is time for the boundless limits of common sense.

"We face hard times economically. I will spare you the litany of statistics. But I will tell you that as a person who devoted most of his adult life to anti-poverty programs, that the worst poverty of all is having no options. Whether it is creating revenue for State services, or a family's choice for a better life through a better job, reviving our economy must be our common ground.

"Let us rebuild our economy from the firm footing of common ground.

"Now, common sense tells us that difficult choices lie ahead. We must do everything we can to use public funds wisely, and to be responsible with our tax dollars. But we must also act quickly and decisively to help heal the economic problems we face.

"That means helping to stimulate the single largest segment of private economic activity in Hawaii -- the visitor industry. So in the coming weeks, we will concentrate on finding ways to achieve four objectives:

- \* Build a convention center, which once again will make Hawaii competitive in this growing tourism segment;
- Provide adequate funding for marketing and promotion of Hawaii;
- Develop Europe as a third major visitor market for our State; and
- \* Create new ways to enhance Hawaii's image as a destination.

"It is important that our image is one that is honest and real. It should reflect our culture, our sense of place, which is Hawaii's ultimate attraction. This is being done at places like the Kaanapali Beach Hotel. Fore more than six years, managers and employees have worked hard to incorporate Hawaiian culture and values into their daily operations. As a result, tradition is preserved, and cultural integrity is maintained. As a side benefit, the hotel has one of the highest occupancy levels on Maui, and is profitable even while visitor industry counts are dropping. This is one good example of how responsible,

sensitive, quality tourism has a positive effect on the 'bottom line'

"However, common sense tells us we don't put all 'our eggs in one basket.' Economic diversity has long been one of our most important goals. In this regard, we will continue our steps to build opportunity through economic development. We will encourage new initiatives and approaches to international trade, finance, and investment. And we will continue to be patient as the seeds of economic diversity begin to root.

"Meanwhile, let's face facts. A strong economy requires a positive business climate. We're tired of hearing Hawaii called 'a business hell.' Let us work together to find ways to create a climate that is friendly to business, large and small. We can improve our tax policies, our regulatory policies, and our programs to assist business. We may not be able to change 'hell' to 'heaven' overnight ... but let's try as fast as we can to rise as far as we can, and find the common ground that business and government must share.

"I don't believe that being 'pro-business' means ignoring workers, either. We must take steps to provide more flexibility in the working environment, training to keep up with the 21st century job demands, and programs to ensure wellness and security in these fast-changing times.

"Our economic agenda is ambitious. But as important as it is, there are other critical issues to address. Common sense has told us that before we can try to tackle any of them, we first must get our own House in order.

"Let me say that I believe all of us have gotten the message. We have launched procedural reform, and we are taking meaningful steps to open up the legislative system. We are moving to encourage more public involvement in decision-making, and to restore public trust and confidence in the way we operate.

"These are important lessons I personally learned time and time again, working in anti-poverty programs. We must remember that people need to have a voice, and a way to participate in the decisions and the programs that affect their lives.

"That's why we are changing the way we make decisions in House committees -- to improve participation by members and the public, and to increase our accountability to the people who elected us. We have formed new committees on Economic Development and Business Concerns; Hawaiian Affairs; and Public Safety and Corrections, because these are what people have told us are the areas important to them.

"It makes sense, too, to treat colleagues and employees fairly and with respect. We have seen how tragic it is when we fail. Lives and careers have been damaged, even destroyed, because of sexual harassment, intolerance, and discrimination. I believe we must send a message that is clear and unmistakable. Harassment and discrimination cannot and will not be tolerated.

"The House now has new policies against both for members as well as staff. Everyone must be treated with dignity and respect. We are all entitled to work in an environment free from any type of harassment. This House must be a model for others in our community in the way the people who work here, in service of the public, are treated and respected.

"And it also is important in these hard economic times to be efficient and respect taxpayer dollars. So we are instituting reforms in an area that was the focus of controversy last session. The House now has new policies governing legislative travel. These policies are clear, specific, and open to public inspection.

"We will apply this same approach to reforming State procurement laws, to curb abuse, to reduce inefficiency, and to restore public trust. No dollar is more valuable than a tax dollar!

"Reform this session will go beyond our own operations. It is the only logical response to a series of concerns that the people have voiced. We will take action to improve our judicial system, especially our prisons. We will look for ways to achieve tort reform to regain the delicate balance between needs and responsibilities. And we will review our laws governing insurance, in the hopes of again balancing the interests of the insurers, the insured, and the public at large.

"No one benefits when one segment of government points a finger at another. People want fairness. In Hawaii, we have laws which prohibit state government from passing legislation which costs county government money to implement without providing state funding necessary to do the job. I will submit a resolution, and ask our 49 sister states to do likewise, which calls upon the federal government to end its age-old practice of 'mandates without money.' That's not right, and not fair.

"Along the same lines, it is time to re-examine the relationship between state and county government. It's easy for the counties to call the state 'overly bureaucratic,' then ask for more state funds in the same breath. It gets tougher when we deal with the fact that Hawaii's state government delivers many services which, elsewhere, are county functions.

"In short, then, when the federal government mandates programs, the state or county has to pay. That's unfair. When the state mandates a county service, the state pays. That's fair. When the counties increase services and ask the state to pay, where's the fairness? Let us replace the finger-pointing with fairness, and then let's do the job for the people.

"One exception. When there are victims of horrendous natural disasters, we all have to chip in. In this regard, we pledge to find ways to assist the victims of Hurricane Iniki to rebuild their homes and businesses and lives.

"Reform is also critical for our system of education. Public schools are the foundation of our society. Our young people must be prepared to be a part of this society, and to lead it in the future. We will make our public schools work.

"This calls for fiscal reform. This calls for new ways to assess progress and increase accountability. It calls for curriculum reform, new approaches to school development, and incentives for achievement. In other words, we must take comprehensive action to improve the classroom environment and the factors that affect it.

"We must set a new and bold goal for housing. That goal is to reach the point where government -- be it state or county -- is out of the affordable housing business. Ideally, that should be the responsibility of the private sector. Government resources should be devoted to rentals and to helping peoople get their feet on that all-important first rung on the housing ladder. I call upon the Housing Committee and the State administration to work together toward the day when government housing programs have three priorities: rentals, rentals, and rentals.

"The future of our State must also include protecting and preserving the precious natural resources that help make Hawaii so special for all of us. Our environment is fragile and needs care. Preserving it should be our legacy for future generations.

"Our agenda is, as I said earlier, ambitious. I believe, though, that we can and must complete this agenda. These uncommon times offer us an opportunity that we might not have later on. And perhaps nowhere is that opportunity more apparent than in this period of reflection over what happened one hundred years ago, when the independent nation of Hawaii was overthrown.

"Traditionally, the Hawaiian people graciously welcomed strangers to their shore. Their aloha was genuine. And what was their reward? They had their country, the source of their pride and their identity, ripped away from them. Generation after generation, the Hawaiian people have lived with this memory of injustice. Generation after generation, the memory -- too often unspoken -- has haunted Hawaiian and non-Hawaiian alike.

"It all came home this past weekend. What we face is the quest for justice ... if we fail to act ... that failure will speak volumes. It will diminish us as individuals and as a society.

"We must support the right of Native Hawaiians to define and pursue sovereignty. We need to acknowledge that the form of sovereignty is really up to the Hawaiians. Our role as legislators must be to support their decision-making process, support their right to be made whole again, and find ways to meet our obligations to correct the wrongs and the injustice.

"In recent years, the State has taken steps in the right direction to repair broken trusts with the Hawaiian people. At the same time, the federal administration has denied rights and refused to accept responsibility. Every resident of this State must work together to change that. The federal government owes the Hawaiian people an apology for its illegal actions. It must make the apology real with compensation of funds and land. We call upon them to act. Now, one hundred years later, it is a matter of honor for all.

"I believe we can lead with compassion and self-respect.

"So whether it be Native Hawaiian issues, our economic future, our obligation to education ... common sense tells us that we must recognize our common ground and work from there. Sure, the times are not the best. Uncertainty marks the weeks and months ahead. The issues and problems and concerns can seem overwhelming. But I believe that what binds us is greater than what divides us. And if we have the resolve today to take the positive, reasonable, and common-sense action we need, then tomorrow, we'll be able to look back with pride ... and say that we here in this House made good on and lived up to the notion of 'public service' -- in the very best sense of that phrase.

"Mahalo and God Bless."

The Chair appointed Representatives Duke Bainum, Harvey Tajiri, David Stegmaier and Barbara Marumoto to escort the Honorable Jackie Young to the rostrum.

The Chair presented the Vice Speaker, stating:

"Members of the House of Representatives, I present the Honorable Jackie Young, Vice Speaker of the House of Representatives for the Seventeenth Legislature." The Chair then recognized Representative O'Kieffe, Minority Leader, who rose and responded:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

"Good morning, elected officials and special guests who have taken time to come down to watch us open the Legislature this year.

Mr. Speaker, we wish you every success in your tenure as our Speaker. But, my goodness, as I look at the loyal opposition, I sort of get an idea what General Custer must have felt at Little Big Horn.

"I'm a little hoarse today, but the nice thing about this ... President Clinton and Barbara Streisand have now made it socially acceptable.

"I am honored to be the leader of the House Minority, your loyal opposition, and I am beginning my seventh year in the Legislature and can't believe how fast those years have passed. It is sobering to realize that in a mere seven years, we will be entering a new century.

"Never in history has one century brought so much change to the world. We are now a global society and all of us must realize that we live in a multi-cultural, world community.

"We must learn to cherish and preserve the environment. We must learn to adapt to changing circumstances. All of us must take responsibility and make the commitment to add to the strength and spirit of the community in which we live.

"In order to move with pride and confidence into the 21st century, accountability will first have to be established.

"This accountability must span the gamut of society -from world, national, state and county leaders ... to citizens, parents and students.

"Our country has become permeated with the attitude that 'someone else is responsible.' This attitude has become pervasive throughout all aspects of society. It weaves its insidious destructiveness into our political system, our business community and our schools.

"Accountability must become an integral part of each and everyone of us.

"Accountability ... we must learn it. We must teach it. We must live it.

"Recently, an irate citizen complained about the high cost of the savings and loan bailout and he said he didn't think that the taxpayers should have to pay for it. He said, and I quote ... 'The government should pay for it.'

"Many of us seem to forget that we, the people, are the government. It is we, the people, who elect the officials. It is we, the people, who pay the officials, and it is we, the people, who must hold these same officials accountable.

"As citizens, we have allowed the government to continue with a 'business as usual' attitude, with no thought of future consequences, and certainly with no regard to accountability.

"Consider that this self-perpetuating entity, which we call state government, had 30,600 State employees in 1970. In 1980, that number had grown to 45,150, and in 1990, it had burgeoned to 57,050.

"This amounts to an increase of 86 percent of State employees while our entire State population during those same twenty years has increased by only 44 percent. This means that there are nearly twice as many State employees per capita now than there were twenty years ago.

"As a result, we, the taxpayers of Hawaii, are currently responsible for the paychecks of 10 percent of our working population, and yet, the current administration, rather than accepting accountability, continues to create and fund more positions.

The State of Hawaii owns 29.4 percent of our land statewide. On Oahu alone, it owns 17.2 percent of these lands.

"This same State bureaucracy is the largest single tenant of expensive downtown office space, occupying between ten and twenty percent of the available leases and costing the taxpayers in excess of \$20-million a year.

"While we have a desperate need for low cost, affordable housing, the state agency that is accountable for this housing is leasing some of the most expensive commercial office space available.

"We have a problem of priorities when our system believes that it is more important to provide the State Comptroller with a private bathroom costing \$41,150 while, at the same time, some of our students are forced to hold classes in their own school's bathrooms.

"Many experts, as well as legislators, question whether the removal of asbestos from the State Capitol is either prudent or necessary. Necessary or not, we are paying in excess of \$22-million to have it done. How much more would the people of our State benefit if that \$22-million were left in the budgets that are being so drastically cut in our educational programs, our hospitals, and our social services?

"We need to see internal reforms and accountability at the executive and the legislative levels. House Republicans will introduce initiatives in response to these needs. It is shameful that it is necessary for us to include in our Minority Package legislation to enforce behavior and values in our leaders which should be unquestionably inherent in them all.

"One of the reforms we will be introducing is to restrict the use of campaign funds and to provide for distribution of surplus funds. Contributors to political campaigns have every right to expect that their donations will be used for campaign-related purposes.

"Because some members of the Legislature have taken advantage of their travel privileges, it is necessary for us to introduce a measure that will enforce a consistent and responsible travel policy.

"A task force, established last session, recommended the removal of the election functions from the control of the Office of the Lt. Governor. Our Republican caucus will be strongly supporting this.

"Voter registration is one of the most important areas of responsibility for the Lt. Governor's Office. Despite an extensive and expensive advertising campaign during the past six years, Hawaii ranks 50th in voter participation. This dubious honor is not solely the fault of the Lt. Governor. It is incumbent upon us all to educate our children and ourselves to our responsibility in the electoral process.

"Additionally, the Minority Caucus will be introducing measures to require an annual list of both bid and non-bid State capital improvement projects. We would request that these lists be published annually in local newspapers stating the bid price and the final cost. The intent of these measures is to hold the bidders accountable so that the final cost for the project is not in excess of the bid price. Under the current system, the already overburdened taxpayers are having to bear millions and millions of dollars due to the cost overruns ... despite the millions and millions put into planning.

"During the 1992 legislative session, we attempted to expand on the concept of accountability by introducing a resolution requesting an annual Hawaii report card. This would be on the status of public education in Hawaii and specifically at each school.

"In the resolution, the Department of Education was asked to define its goals and objectives, to develop strategies and standards, to improve student performance and to provide complete current and comparable statistics. Revised and updated each year thereafter, this report card could be used as a measuring stick against which parents and students could assess achievement. Although the measure was passed, the deletions of certain provisions weakened the resolution so significantly that we are compelled to reintroduce a new one this year.

"H.G. Wells once said, 'Human history is a race between education and catastrophe.' If we want to avoid catastrophe, then ...

- \* Parents must share in the accountability of their children's education.
- Teachers must be accountable for their students' achievement.
- \* Students must earn their right for advancement.

"As we approach the 21st century, it is crucial that we develop partnerships between public and private sectors.

"Two exceptional examples of such partnerships are currently taking place in my district. The North Hawaii community hospital is becoming a reality, thanks to the efforts of many members of the community, private business, and the State.

"In addition, thanks to the initiative of the Waikoloa Development Company. In partnership with the Department of Education, Waikoloa will soon have a new elementary school.

"If government doesn't stop the hemorrhaging of our tax dollars, we will risk losing our young adults who are our intellectual and creative resource for the future.

"We can no longer be content with identifying problems. We must identify and put into place solutions.

"The solution, to me, is accountability.

"Accountability can enable people, organizations, committees, and ultimately the government, to achieve our goals. We must work together within this vision.

"Hawaii must be competitive.

"Hawaii must have an independent, responsible and responsive government.

"We must make a concerted effort to challenge the status quo and replace it with dynamic action and positive change.

"We must look forward to the future while building upon -- and learning from -- the past.

"Thank you very much."

The Chair then recognized Representative Baker, Majority Leader, who rose and responded:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

"Mr. Speaker, Lt. Governor Cayetano, distinguished guests, colleagues, friends and family -- Aloha Kakahiaka, and welcome on behalf of the Majority members of the House of Representatives.

"This has certainly been an emotion-filled week for all of us. We have acknowledged and remembered the events of 100 years ago in the kingdom of Hawaii, we have reflected on the life and work of a man dedicated to civil rights and justice for all, and we have contemplated the new course we want to chart for Hawaii as the Seventeenth Legislature.

"But it's not just Hawaii that's embarking on a new journey this day. Our nation, too, has new leadership. This morning at 7:00 o'clock, Hawaii time, Bill Clinton took the oath of office as the 42nd President of the United States, and our nation embarked on a new course, to forge a new partnership and revitalize America. We offer President Clinton and Vice President Gore our very best wishes and godspeed in the awesome task ahead. We know that as the federal government is successful in putting our national economy on sound footing, controlling the deficit, stimulating growth and providing leadership in such critical areas as health care, that Hawaii and our citizens will also benefit.

"Mr. Speaker, just as we anticipate opportunities derived from a new sense of purpose and direction at the national level, so do our citizens expect that at home. You very eloquently outlined for us this morning in your address the new focus. You've called on us to approach the challenges we face from the perspective of finding common ground and utilizing common sense. You've asked us to put aside the traditional labels and approaches and take a fresh, reasoned look at the issues before us. In essence, you have asked us to reinvent government. Perhaps not in exactly the same way envisioned by the authors of the book so named, but by the use of, as you put it, 'The boundless limits of common sense.' Mr. Speaker, your Majority members accept the challenge. We share your visions, and we are ready to work.

"On a personal note, Mr. Speaker, let me say how honored I am to serve my colleagues this session as Majority Leader and to be a part of your leadership team. Mahalo for the opportunity. I pledge my diligence, my best efforts, to fulfill the responsibilities entrusted to this office.

"Mr. Speaker, you have enunciated clearly that dignity, respect for others, and fairness, will be the watchwords of your leadership, and I assure you the policies of our House will ensure that those words are put into practice. We are instituting reforms that heretofore have been merely organizational rhetoric. Quorum requirements at all public decision-making sessions and recording each member's votes on bills in committee are but two of the measures that we're adopting to increase public confidence and participation in our process. Our members will find that their committee work is more meaningful and that their many talents utilized. Also, we have a firm commitment to improve public access. Perhaps our most ambitious effort in this area is the pilot

project we have undertaken with 'Olelo, the Corporation for Community Television which will be providing the public with eight hours of airtime weekly to televise some of our proceedings throughout the session. Mr. Speaker, these are but a few of the measures we are instituting to improve our accountability as elected officials and to help restore public trust in our institutions of government.

"Additionally, the glass ceiling in the House leadership ranks has been broken, and I am pleased to share that distinction with Vice Speaker Jackie Young.

"While I expect our debate to be lively and as diverse as the membership of our House, your Majority Caucus is mindful of the greater public purpose which we serve. Diversity is our strength when we remember the common ground that binds us together.

"Mr. Speaker, your Democratic Majority is ready to work with you, to work with our colleagues in the Minority, the Executive Branch, and our community, to take the challenges before us and turn them into opportunities ... to take the positive, reasonable and common sense action necessary to move Hawaii forward. We are prepared to confront the economic challenges so that our citizens truly have options. We are prepared to act so that the public trust placed in our hands is enhanced.

"Mr. Speaker, your Democratic Majority is organized and we are ready to conduct the peoples' business of the Seventeenth Legislature.

"Mahalo."

"My question to the Majority Floor Leader is whether or not Rule 14 which provides for the appointment of special committees for special or temporary purposes to consider and report on special or temporary matters referred to it ... whether or not those appointments would include proportional representation from the House Minority Party."

Representative Ihara answered:

"On behalf of the Majority Caucus, the answer is yes."

Representative Thielen thanked the Chair.

Representative Thielen then asked:

"Mr. Speaker, my second question is whether or not Rule 18(a) which provides for an Advisory Committee on Rules and Procedure will also provide for a proportional representation from the Minority Party."

Representative Ihara answered:

The Majority will follow past practice and include the Minority again."

Representative Thielen thanked the Chair and continued:

"And with that I would like to commend the Majority Party for stepping forward and commencing, I think, the positive road to reform on the Rules of the House of Representatives. This is a first step and it's a good step forward, and I appreciate, as our whole Minority Caucus does, having us included in a fair manner in being represented on these committees and in this body.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Ward then rose and stated:

"I also rise for a commendation of the Rules, but with a possible caution.

"I also applaud the Majority for the promulgation of these Rules and I think democracy has been reestablished after seventeen years, particularly in the committee system, of which today marks the end of that where the Chair rules.

"However, there's always tendencies of the past to spill over into the future and, Mr. Speaker, because of that, I would like to remind this august body of the rule which, last week, Mr. Funaki reminded us of one of the prime parliamentary principle, and that is that the question must be decided by taking a vote. I plead for all the chairs to listen to the next phrase. 'It is not enough to presume how a member will vote...a vote actually must be taken. It may be taken by an authorized and fair method.'

"So let us not presume that members of a committee agree with you. Even though, Mr. Speaker, you have a tremendous set of chairs, let us not presume that those members agree with he or her in their suggestions, but

they actually have a vote which I am assured by your leadership that will be the case, and I plead with all the chairs that they will follow that and, quite frankly, I think we will provoke the Senate into jealousy by the new rules that are coming today.

"Again, commendations to the Majority for having done so.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 7 was adopted.

At 12:46 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:48 o'clock p.m.

# SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering a bill on Third Reading on the basis of a modified consent calendar.

#### THIRD READING

### H.B. No. 1, HD 1:

Representative Say moved that H.B. No. 1, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kawakami.

Representative Ward then rose and moved "that this appropriation bill be reconsidered and referred back to the Finance Committee for further consideration and deliberation."

The motion was seconded by Representative Thielen.

The motion to recommit H.B. No. 1, HD 1, was put by the Chair and failed to carry by voice vote.

Representative Ward rose and stated:

"Because that motion didn't pass, I feel compelled to give the reasons why the reconsideration was made so if I may rise to speak against this particular measure.

"First, my apologies to everyone in the House here for having missed the boat in the Finance Committee where I know there was a specific discussion by a specific individual, but I feel we have to return and try to send the message to this community and particularly to these departments that we also, under a severe budget cut, can also cut our own budgets. Having been with a high United Nations official, I probably missed one of the most important votes, but that was the reason why I wasn't there

"The reasons why, Madam Chair, that I feel compelled to speak is as follows:

"If we have a 5.5 percent increase and we are telling others zero-growth or no growth, how in good conscience can we, when it comes down to where we are going to have to cut other budgets, do that? Inevitably, we are going to be forced to cut other budgets ... we know it's coming. And I know for the sake of our own staff -- and I am not speaking against anybody's staff on this issue -- no one works harder and longer than our staff. And that is not the issue.

"The issue is the principle of the message that we are sending -- that we can be left alone, and we can slash and burn everybody else's budget. Believe it or not, we are going to be close to two to four hundred million dollars in the hole within three months unless we come up with some money. After four decades of growth, I think we have lulled ourselves to sleep to think that everything is well and good. And if we'e going to have to cut, we have to cut beginning with ourselves. It's the principle of the issue. I think we're pretending that the economy is going to turn around and we're going to magically find this medicare and medicaid moneys, the money to pay for the Hawaiian Homes' lands, and the money that we're falling short for in so many areas.

"Madam Speaker, we are preaching austerity. The point is ... I think we have to practice it, and it begins in our own House. For example, we all have these three-mile piles in front of us. Madam Speaker, why don't we at least print on both sides? Again, that's not a whole big savings but it's small. Why can't we cut some of our travels? Let's re-examine some of the budget.

"That's the whole point of recommitting ... to see if there's anywhere, as we push other departments, that we can push ourselves. The point is ... have we really

examined all the possibilities to only get five percent off the top of it?

"Every collective bargaining agent is hearing what we are saying. They are seeing the message. You guys have done 5.5 percent. Regardless of the reason and the reasons are justifiable, but they're saying that and they're going to be able to leverage it against us. Ninety percent of every state employee is in the union. If we increase our budget without increasing others, we're going to lose that high ground when push comes to shove in about three months.

"And I might hasten to add, Madam Speaker, for those few in this room who think that we already get paid too much, I'm not even speaking to that issue because, like you, I have also taken more than a fifty percent pay cut to be able to stand here and sit in this seat. That is not the issue.

"The issue is ... the signal that we're sending out for others to slash and burn their budgets and we're not doing ours. The reality of the perceptions of our actions today is if the bill passes, we're sending the message that we care about ourselves, possibly more than we care about the people out there, and I don't think that's the way to start out. I think it's a fatal perception. It's a dangerous one ... it has almost the same tinge of what first class travel was perceived like in the past.

"I urge everyone to examine the implications of what we are doing today. And mind you, fifty percent of our colleagues in state legislatures on the Mainland have already gone into the red. Cutting begins at home. And this wasn't easy to stand up, having missed the boat to speak to you about this but it's the principle of where I see we're going to be in three months.

"Thank you for your tolerance of this and, Madam Speaker, it's your first day at the podium and I thank you for allowing this debate to happen.

"Thank you."

Representative Baker then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"I think it's important to put this issue into perspective. It's not as if the House is moving to expand its budget by 5.5 percent. All of the categories that we have some real control over are at zero percent increase. We are not looking to expand our activities. We have based our budget on the categories that we actually have expenditures for in 1992. We're basically staying at the same level. Our operating expenses have not increased.

"With regard to the 5.5 percent, this represents raises for our staff only -- for our permanent and our full-time staff. We're actually asking for a little bit of equity for our staff. We decided, after the Auditor's report of several years ago which chastised the Legislature for trying to do its job only with part-time session employees, that if we wanted to do the peoples' work and we wanted to do it as a co-equal branch of government, we could only accomplish it with professional staff. So at that time, in order to have incentives for people to come to work at the Legislature, we would put our staff on the grid with the relevant collective bargaining classification in the executive and the judicial branches. attempted to do was to provide the appropriate classification based on their job descriptions and to place our employees in comparable situations. Because of the inequities of the pay rates at that time, we were unable to raise everybody up, even those of us who wanted to do so, because we felt it was unfair. But what we have tried to do is to provide raises incrementally, over the past

several years, in an attempt to bring our staff up to comparable levels.

"It is important to note that when collective bargaining employees get their raises, they do so at the beginning of the budget year which is July 1. Our session and full-time employees don't get any raises until January of the following year. So we're not jumping our employees ahead of collective bargaining ... we are merely helping them to catch up. Our employees, in fact, are year-anda-half behind comparable positions in the executive and judicial branches that are following collective bargaining contracts. In effect, when the collective bargaining increases went into effect and those employees were getting seven to eight percent increases, we still only asked for our employees to have a 5.5 percent increase.

"I don't believe that our budget is out of line, I don't believe that we are doing something that we're not asking other departments. We have no funds to shift around. We simply do not have the flexibility within our budget because it's based on actual expenditures. I think in line with what the Auditor has continued to say about the Legislature needing to be a co-equal branch of government, needing the expertise, that it is important that we do provide some pay increases for our employees and provide the equity that they deserve.

"Thank you, Madam Speaker."

Representative Thielen then rose and stated:

"I appreciated the comments of the Majority across the aisle, and I am rising to speak against House Bill No. 1, HD 1.

"I agree that staff should not be cut; I agree that staff does need pay equity or parity with others in the public sector. However, there are a number of areas where we could cutexpenses that are non-personnel and if this means that we eliminate yearly travel allowances for legislators, then I'd say this is the year to do it.

"The difficult thing is that our legislative budget exceeds the State General Fund expenditure ceiling by nearly \$12.5-million and I, in good conscience, cannot vote for this bill.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 1, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE, THE LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR, THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU, AND THE OMBUDSMAN," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes to 2 noes, with Representatives Thielen and Ward voting no.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 1 had passed Third Reading at 12:29 o'clock p.m.

### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Representative Baker: "Just one announcement -- to remind everyone of the Legislative Fitness Fair that will be held here in the House chambers from 2:00 to 4:30 today. It's an opportunity for legislators and staff to pick up some tips on how to deal with stress and all of the rigors of this session."

Representative Apo then rose and remarked:

"Madam Speaker, I can't let this historic day go by without noting that, as far as I can recollect in checking around the membership, this is the first time in the history of this institution that the presiding officer is a female. I think it's something we should all be proud of and welcome you to that podium and offer you my support."

The Chair thanked Representative Apo.

At 12:30 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned until 11:30 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, Tuesday, January 26, 1993.

# JOINT SESSION

The Joint Session of the House of Representatives and the Senate was called to order at 10:09 o'clock a.m. by the Honorable Joseph Souki, Speaker of the House of Representatives.

At this time, the Speaker welcomed and introduced the following distinguished guests to the members of the Seventeenth Legislature:

The Chair then appointed Representatives Young, Baker and O'Kieffe, and Senators Holt, Matsuura and Reed to escort the Honorable John Waihee, Governor of the State of Hawaii, to the rostrum.

Representative Kawakami and Senator Tungpalan presented Governor Waihee with maile/ilima leis on behalf of the House of Representatives and Senate, respectively.

The Speaker then presented to the members of the Seventeenth Legislature and guests, the Honorable John Waihee, stating:

"Members of the Seventeenth Legislature, ladies and gentlemen, please join me in extending our warmest aloha and welcome to the Governor of the State of Hawaii, the Honorable John Waihee."

The Governor addressed the Joint Session as follows:

"Thank you.

"President Aki, Speaker Souki, members of the Seventeenth Legislature, honored guests, ladies and gentlemen:

"I am honored to be here today for my seventh State-of-the-State address. While the years have passed quickly, I can't help but think that January 1987 was a long time ago.

"Gone are the days of huge budget surpluses, of picking and choosing from a generous menu of government services, and of an economy that seemed to expand without end.

"My friends, we have entered a new era.

"We saw it during the presidential campaign, as the electorate -- the generation 'who hated politics' -- resolved to once again claim ownership of the American political process.

"We saw it here at home where our people's call for reform and change was reflected in the words of President Aki and Speaker Souki on Opening Day.

"We saw it in the quest for sovereignty by native Hawaiians in their efforts to assume greater responsibility over their own future.

"The changes are evident all around us.

"But so are the opportunities for re-inventing, reshaping and re-focusing government.

"And that's why I have to chuckle when political pundits talk about 1994 and about this administration closing up shop.

"The truth is, we cannot afford to talk about 'closure' and wrapping things up, because the business of government is never finished. And we have got business at hand.

"And that's what these changes, this current revolution in American politics, are all about: The desire to break the mold and to grab the future with our own hands and to shape it to conform to our dreams and our hopes.

"One of our first jobs is to stimulate our economy. With the cumulative impact of the national recession, the deterioration of the sugar industry, and the devastation of Hurricane Iniki, our response must be courageous and extraordinary.

"Last year, I announced the start of an accelerated capital improvement program. By expediting \$1.9-billion worth of projects authorized by you, we blunted and stabilized the downturn in our construction industry.

"This year, we've got to get tourism, our most powerful economic engine, up and running again.

"Travel from Asia and Europe is up, while our mainland traffic is down -- by nearly 13 percent. Of all of our new markets, Europe offers bright potential. There is no reason why we should not be able to double the number of European visitors by 1994.

"We need to promote and promote aggressively -- to tap these new markets and to re-introduce ourselves to markets that have been traditionally strong for us.

"Therefore, I'm asking for your continued support of our tourism marketing efforts, through an increase in the annual budget from \$21-million to \$30.5-million.

"The lack of a convention center is not helping our efforts.

"The Convention Center Authority has submitted a list of sites to you for your consideration. I strongly encourage you to immediately address the issues in this session so that construction can begin as early as 1994.

"Though tourism often dominates the spotlight, Hawaii pulsates with economic vitality. And you and I have worked hard together to foster this diversification.

"This year, we will break ground for the Sand Island Marine Education and Training Center, part of our overall Honolulu Waterfront Master Plan.

"We've fostered business development in film production, travel industry management, ocean sciences, home-grown or manufactured products, and nationally televised sporting events.

"Our renewed five-year Pro Bowl commitment and the recently announced Hawaii Sumo Tournament add to an important economic niche for world-class sports and exhibitions.

"By the way, how about Chad Rowan -- the first 'yokozuna' from Waimanalo in the history of the world.

"You know, it's no secret that in tough times, the demand for government services escalates.

"But just as every family in Hawaii struggles to live within its means, our state government must do the same. We must create new ways to do more with less.

"Last fall, every state department was directed to streamline.

"That means planning better, working smarter, and deriving greater results from committed resources.

"In December, I submitted a budget and indicated that four major issues -- health, education, tourism and Hawaiian affairs -- warranted further discussion and funding.

"I am also submitting a package of program adjustments and revenue enhancements -- things not normally included in the budget. But here's the bottom line: If you accept our package in its entirety, we should be able to do all of it and have a \$70-million balance at the end.

"We must also initiate action to cut government waste. Sometimes in pursuit of lofty goals, it seems unglamorous to concentrate on tidying up the shop. But when we are increasing government services on a fixed, zero-growth budget, cutting waste is a necessity.

"In fact, why not give our own workers and citizens a chance to tell us where it exists.

"One idea, which I stole from my fellow governor, Ann Richards, is a successful program, where citizens call in -- anonymously if desired -- to report on government waste

"In Texas, the 'hotline' generated suggestions saving more than \$200-million just in the first few days. Ultimately, the program saved \$1.9-billion.

"Of course, Texas has a much larger budget and deficit than we do, but if they can accomplish such a feat, we can make it work in Hawaii. Therefore, we are implementing our own 'Project Hotline' and it will be operational by mid-February.

"No one in or out of government is happy with our current procurement setup.

"Therefore, I will be sending to you a proposal to substantially overhaul major provisions of the state's procurement law with two basic goals.

"First, we need to make the process open, accountable and fair. That's why we will be asking you to enact reforms in policy, implementation, and enforcement.

- Our policy must be consistent for every level and every branch of government.
- -- We must match the levels of expenditures with the kinds of controls and guidelines they warrant.
- We must insist on uniform standards of enforcement utilizing a new office of an inspector general.

"Second, these reforms must allow our employees to do their jobs more efficiently. Many are struggling within today's system.

"Let me give you an example. Not long ago, I was at the Kona Hospital to see how renovations of the facilities were going.

"While visiting the new operating room, one of the doctors noted that the use of the room was delayed for seven months after its completion because of the complex bidding process to purchase lighting.

"The doctor turned to me and said, 'You know, if I did it myself, we would have been using the operating room seven months earlier.'

"More compassion, not profit, is the bottom line for government when it needs to fulfill its responsibilities, and this we need to do, with understanding and fairness.

"In my first State-of-the-State, education was a top priority, and you and I have been consistent ever since.

"Last summer, we created an ad hoc committee cochaired by Senator Mike McCartney and Representative David Ige. And what this committee discovered is that great things have and are being done in our schools. In fact, we are currently undergoing some of the most extensive educational reforms in the country.

"Yet four things appear to be missing in order to make these reforms truly work.

"First, we discovered that despite a lot of activity, most people were unable to relate these activities to our educational and reform goals. If we are going to succeed with educational reform, we need more than a catalog of objectives. We need a united crusade.

"Therefore, Mike, David and I, along with our DOE and private sector partners, are inviting the leaders of Hawaii back -- back to the classroom for a day in February -- to learn what contemporary education is all about.

"Second, we must develop a comprehensive, coordinated system of early childhood education and care by the year 2000. That's why the ongoing work of the Early Childhood Project is so important.

"The third missing ingredient is the lack of a resultsdriven system. The Commission on Performance Standards is critical to the overall success of our reforms. Ultimately, it will be the yardstick by which we measure the success of educational reform.

"Fourth, we must have the right facilities. To do so, we must: spend wiser, leverage existing dollars, and explore alternate sources of funding.

"To get this started, I propose we list the drop-dead date on the facilities special fund, to ensure a permanent, open-ended commitment to the quality of our school facilities.

"Hawaii's health care system is a role model for much of the nation. But it is not yet the seamless garment that will protect all of our citizens at reasonable costs. Our limitations are clearly presented by the report of the Blue Ribbon Panel jointly commissioned by you and me.

"The panel's report presents a wealth of sound and bold ideas, and we will be submitting to you a number of initiatives.

"One of the most important of these is the creation of a Hawaii Health Care Commission which will be a joint public/private task force designed:

- to control health care costs while maintaining high quality and attaining universal access; and
- -- to guarantee the community rating on health care coverage for all of Hawaii's small businesses.

"The need to meet our long-term care challenge is still facing us -- and so is the problem we encountered last year: How can we work out the federal relationship that penalizes Hawaii for taking the lead?

"We have a classical 'Catch-22' here. Federal approval is necessary to reallocate Medicaid funds to help finance our program. But we are also told that we can't get such approval unless we set the program up first.

"I propose that we move forward by putting a structure in place, whose authority would only be activated when you subsequently vote to fund it. In this way, we can go after the federal assurances that we need, while preparing for a well-coordinated startup.

"Last year, I spoke of the Medicaid 'Pacman' that was devouring our resources. One reason is that Hawaii is on the short end of an unfair federal compensation system.

"On one hand, the current federal formula, which sets eligibility for Medicaid, takes into account our higher cost of living. On the other hand, the formula that establishes the amount of federal matching funds does not.

"In other words, while more of our families rightfully qualify, we are not receiving federal dollars to support that added burden.

"We are seeking federal legislation to correct this inequity. If successful, we will be able to adjust our share of federal funds from 50 percent to more than 60 percent.

"Increasing federal support is precisely the goal of our proposal to implement a provider tax on hospitals and long-term care facilities. The revenue generated from the provider tax will enable the Medicaid program to earn a larger share of federal matching funds without causing undue hardships on our providers.

"At the same time, we propose to move on two other fronts:

"First, we intend to combine Medicaid, the State Health Insurance Program (SHIP) and the state's general assistance programs. This will provide a standardized benefits package, a fairer allocation to our Medicaid users, and expand coverage for SHIP.

"Secondly, we will incorporate a managed care system, which will move closer to ensuring equitable, quality health care, at less cost, to a greater number of people.

"To move us in this new direction, we are proposing a federal waiver to begin by July 1, 1993, as a national demonstration project.

"The physical health of Hawaii's people is important, but so is their emotional health. On any given day, approximately 1,400 of Hawaii's kids are in the state's care. These are children who could be home if their families had a little help.

"That's why I am so pleased to announce the start of the 'Families Together Initative' program. It was developed with the help of the National Governors' Association, nine of our executive agencies, the Family Court and the private sector. It is truly a model of cooperation.

"These agencies will pool resources and leverage federal dollars to make intensive, home-based services available to families at risk of losing their children.

"I also want to thank all of you for your continued support of Hawaii's mental health system. Our new State Hospital is a serene and supportive place. We've opened new psychiatric units at Hilo Hospital and at Maui Memorial Hospital.

"But we cannot let up. We must continue toward full accreditation of our psychiatric hospitals and community mental health centers. To do this, I ask your support for an additional \$6.6-million for care and treatment of children and adolescents who are at risk.

"Finally, I am recommending an additional \$1.1-million for each year of the biennium to help victims of domestic violence.

"Housing for our families has and will continue to be a high priority. In the last few years, we together jumpstarted housing production in Hawaii with numerous innovative programs.

"The action taken has paid off. Together with private sector partners, we've completed more than 17,000 units over the last four years.

"This is why we must keep our initiatives on track. To do that, I will be asking you to extend Act 15 -- to expedite the development approval process for affordable housing.

"I'm gratified by President Aki's and Speaker Souki's commitment to help create affordable rentals. Fifty percent of a proposed increase in the conveyance tax, if approved by you, will add both momentum and additional money for rental units.

"Through HFDC, we have provided land, zoning, and infrastructure -- the foundations for the private sector to move in and begin to produce affordable homes. We should accelerate these public/private transactions, selling state lands designated for housing directly to the private sector.

"This will not only stimulate the private sector to develop many more affordable units, but it will free up resources to launch new developments.

"In the same spirit of partnership, we are proposing to develop a State Office Building at Kapolei. Campbell Estate would build it, and the state would lease it.

"This will propel Kapolei closer toward its destiny as a true second city. And it will support our continuing efforts to decentralize government offices from the Capitol District, bringing both jobs and government services closer to where our people live.

"One of the biggest potential obstacles facing our families' ability to purchase homes is the availability of homeowner's insurance.

"The future of homeowner's insurance in our state has become cloudier for two reasons:

"First, in the eyes of the insurance industry, Hawaii is not the same risk environment it was before Iniki. We are now placed in the category of areas prone to violent storms.

"Secondly, insurance companies themselves, are faced with severe shortage of re-insurance, that is, the kind of insurance an insurance company buys to reduce its risk.

"This shortfall in the supply of insurance is national in scope. It will affect some 70,000 homeowners in Hawaii who will seek to renew their policies over the course of the next twelve months. I am told we can all expect substantial increases in what we pay for insurance.

"Resolving the property insurance problem will, in some ways, be like reducing the nation's budget deficit: it will take time, it will hurt, but it must be done.

"Consequently, we are taking the following actions:

- -- We are providing short-term relief by expanding the Hawaii Property Insurance Association coverage to include all islands.
- We have triggered the mechanism for payment of all HIG subsidiary claims and are working to put the surviving HIG back into the market.
- -- We are working with financial institutions and the lending industry to implement short-term and longterm solutions to minimize the impact on lenders and on the mortgage market.
- We are communicating directly with the international re-insurance market to re-kindle their interest in Hawaii.
- -- We are working with other state, federal and industry officials to create a natural disaster insurance program on the federal level, similar to the flood insurance program.

"And the Insurance Commissioner has appointed a task force to seek long-term solutions, including the creation of a windstorm pool, to cover future hurricane damage.

"As we proceed to work through these very complex issues, we will do so with an eye to minimizing the burden on each individual rate payer, insisting that past obligations be honored, and working toward sound long-term solutions.

"In recent years, we have made great progress toward improving conditions at the Oahu Community Correctional Center and the Women's Community Correctional Center.

"One of the most persistent concerns has been overcrowding. Therefore, I will be submitting a bill to establish a Corrections Population Management Commission.

"This commission will recommend initiatives relating to sentencing policies and practices; pre-trial services and bail programs; probation, parole and intermediate punishment programs; case management strategies; prison construction; and setting population caps.

"It costs us over \$100,000 to build each medium security bed, and approximately \$80 per day to keep one prisoner there. While those who are violent or repeat offenders require secure incarceration, for many offenders a secure prison is not that necessary. We will more aggressively pursue alternatives to incarceration.

"One of our most sacred trusts is the stewardship of our environment. Our job is two-fold:

"First, we must provide a means for people to learn about it, experience it, without destroying or abusing it.

"Last November, proud of its beauty, we opened the first 30 acres of the Kakaako Waterfront Park. With your

support, we will add an additional 40 acres, including an array of cultural and educational centers.

"Second, we must protect our environmental resources from exploitation and neglect.

"Two years ago, we took action to make it possible for private landholders and the state to jointly manage important private and public reserves.

"To secure permanent funding for these programs, I propose that we dedicate the remaining 50 percent of the increase in the conveyance tax I mentioned earlier.

"In addition to our conservation efforts, we are focusing resources on real rather than perceived risks to our environment. Too frequently Congress mandates programs with little or no money. Too often, budgets are shaped more by the last opinion poll than by scientific assessment of risk.

"So I have requested the Department of Health to develop a strategic plan to identify problems which pose the greatest environmental or public health threats, and then to implement a program to address those risks.

"At the same time, I am proposing new funding mechanisms based on the principle that the 'polluter pays.' The funds generated will be used to support recycling, water quality monitoring, environmental education, and pollution prevention programs.

"A few years ago, I stood at the Bishop Museum, reacquainting myself with the depiction of the struggles of plantation contract workers. But in the midst of rare photographs, what took my breath away was a chart.

"There, marching across the wall, black lines followed the growth of the various ethnic groups in Hawaii. Black lines that increased as more Caucasians, Japanese, Filipinos, Chinese and others came to our islands, and flourished.

"A single red line represented Hawaiians. And this red line, so high on the chart in the early years, diminished, grew smaller, until it almost disappeared.

"As I followed the red line, the black lines, I thought of the changes that had occurred: of the economic upheavals, the imported diseases and the thousands that died; of the political chicanery that stole a nation.

"More than any history book, those lines made time stand still. My eyes filled first with sadness -- then surged with pride. For in spite of all of the trauma that had been inflicted on the Hawaiian people, we had endured.

"And so in 1993, we celebrate the strength of the Hawaiian people, who have endured for 100 years, against all odds.

"1993 is a year of recognition, commemoration, and renewal of the long-standing quest for sovereignty.

"It is also a year that will test the foundation and our commitment to justice, tolerance and change. Having overcome disease, politics and greed, we -- Hawaiians and non-Hawaiians alike -- could still lose the battle to intolerance, ignorance and prejudice.

"In 1917, Queen Lili'uokalani wrote:

'I could not turn back the time for the political change, but there is still time to save our heritage. You must remember never to cease to act because you fear you may fail. The way to lose any earthly

kingdom is to be inflexible, intolerant and prejudicial. Another way is to be too flexible, tolerant of too many wrongs and without judgement at all. It is a razor's edge. It is the width of piligrass.'

"My friends, we are on a razor's edge. We are an island community, and it is impossible to turn our backs on the injustices visited to our host culture, who are now one in five among us.

"As citizens of Hawaii and of the United States of America, it is only right that we expect the injustices to be corrected and reparations made.

"The challenge before all of us, is how to right the wrong and re-create sovereignty in our contemporary multi-cultural, island society.

"I call your attention to the **Focus** section of last Sunday's paper. The headline reads: 'Overthrow: No apology needed.'

"Well, you can own a newspaper but you cannot own history, and an apology is the least that needs to be done.

"Having said that, I would also add that I agree with Mr. Twigg-Smith on one important point, and that is that history is not as important as what we do today.

"Therefore, I am asking you today to move beyond the discussion.

"First, I ask you to join me in aggressively seeking political recognition from the federal government for Hawaiians as a native people, just as all other native people throughout America are so recognized.

"Second, the state must continue to cleanup, uphold, and transition our own trust responsibilities.

"We have made significant progress in recognizing past breaches and fulfilling broken promises. Last year, you authorized payment for the public's past use of Hawaiian Home Lands. This year, we commit to resolving other claims, especially illegal alienations of home lands. We will vigorously press our charges of federal breaches -- this time, with a more sympathetic federal administration.

"We also have a proposal to pay our debt to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs for its share of the ceded land revenues, bringing to closure 12 years of dispute.

"Both the federal and state governments have a rare second chance to do what is right for Kaho'olawe -- which will soon be returned to us. I propose we set aside Kaho'olawe as a cultural reserve, to be healed and used only for those purposes that are consistent with the island's history and well-being. In this endeavor, I call upon the Protect Kaho'olawe Ohana to continue their role as stewards. I further ask that we declare our intention to transfer Kaho'olawe to the Hawaiian nation, once it is formed

"Third, we can and must take the step and support the sovereignty of native Hawaiians, without imposing a particular form or body.

"Across America, native governments and states govern side-by-side. But too often in the past, these native governments were imposed upon states by the federal government, engendering hundreds of years of distrust and separation.

"We are island people. Our many cultures, histories and common geography cry for a different solution. Why not take that first step?

"In this state, we have six sovereign entities -- the federal government, the state, and the four counties coexist, side-by-side. We govern in partnership, by law, and by social agreement.

"We are a state, not a national government. We cannot confer sovereignty. But we can embrace self-determination.

"To what entity should the state turn over management of Hawaiian Home Lands? How do we separate the Office of Hawaiian Affairs from the state? Who should choose the leader, or leaders that will guide this entity? How do we remove the divisiveness of the blood quantum while protecting the rights of native Hawaiians? These and a host of other questions should be answered by the people who are most affected. That is the essence of self-determination.

"So I call upon you to support a proposal by the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to convene a Hawaiian Congress, for all Hawaiians to elect their representatives, and to meet in convention.

"To talk, argue, deliberate and ask and answer the hard questions. And upon conclusion and ratification by Hawaiian voters, to petition me and you -- the Legislature -- who will in turn petition the citizens of Hawaii through passage of laws and constitutional amendments.

"My friends, we have an opportunity to improve our entire society. By making Hawaiians whole, we make our entire society whole ... we enrich the life of the land for all of us.

"In conclusion, let us reflect on the words of the Inaugural Poet, Maya Angelou:

'History, despite its wrenching pain, Cannot be unlived. But if faced with courage, Need not be lived again.

Lift up your eyes upon this day, Breaking for you. Give birth again, To the dream.'

"Thank you."

Senate President Aki then rose and stated:

"Governor Waihee, thank you very much for your very inspiring State-of-the-State address this morning. You have given us your thoughts and ideas on the important issues that we are faced with today. We all know that this is a time of great challenge and great opportunity for Hawaii. This Legislature will be hardworking and realistic. We are fully cognizant of the difficult and complex issues before us and the thousands of families and businesses struggling to survive an economy that is distressed at the moment.

"We have no illusions about how difficult our task will be. It will require that we pass a fierce test of our

"Governor, all the members of this legislative body stand ready to help shape a special place for the people of Hawaii. With a spirit of cooperation, the desire to work by consensus, and with a commitment to working together, we can face the tough challenges before us and

openly seek workable solutions to the problems and issues brought before the Legislature.

"Governor, let's do it! Let's give Hawaii the leadership it deserves, and let's do it now.

"Governor, again, thank you. And to all of you here today, thank you very much for coming, and God Bless You All!"

"There being no further business, I hereby declare this Joint Session adjourned."

At 10:53 o'clock a.m., the President declared the Joint Session adjourned.
