The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 12:06 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Nakashima presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Mr. Max Sword, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Nakamura, Thielen and Todd, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Twelfth Day was deferred.

ORDER OF THE DAY

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS
(FLOOR PRESENTATIONS)

The following resolution (H.R. No. 16) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

H.R. No. 16, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION COMMENDING DANIELLE ULULANI BEIRNE FOR HER INVOLVEMENT IN THE ADVOCACY FOR SELF-DETERMINATION FOR NATIVE HAWAIIANS," was offered by Representative Quinlan.

Representative Quinlan moved that H.R. No. 16 be adopted, seconded by Representative Cullen.

Representative Quinlan recognized "Aunty Ulu" for her exemplary leadership and participation in the community and the Hawaiian cultural revitalization and for advocating for the perpetuation of *aloha*, thanked her for being a leader in the advocacy of self-determination for Native Hawaiians, and introduced honorees who were seated on the Floor of the House:

Troy Thompson, her son;
Louis Ka'uhane-Wallace, her son;
Ka'imi Johnson, her grandson;
Kamalani Johnson, her grandson; and

Keaka and Zed Aumua, her granddaughter and grandson-in-law, who were seated in the gallery.

Representative Ward welcomed former Representative Ululani Beirne, his former debate coach and partner, recognized her for her determination and professionalism and being the heart and mind for change in the Hawaiian community, and offered his congratulations.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 16 was adopted, with Representatives Nakamura and Thielen being excused.

At 12:22 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:31 o'clock p.m.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Representative Takumi, for the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 58) recommending that H.B. No. 1359 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1359, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FISCAL BIENNIIUM 2019-2021 BUDGET REQUESTS FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Nakamura and Thielen being excused.

Representative Takumi, for the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 59) recommending that H.B. No. 1557, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1557, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations, brief comment. Mr. Speaker, this is a foreclosure, a warning to those who keep their house empty for any amount of time. They are fined, and it's kind of a revealing fact as it says in the very first paragraph that, in Hawaii, to do a foreclosure it takes 1,553 days, unbelievable. That's four to five years. It also says if you leave it empty one day, it's \$1,000.

"Mr. Speaker, it's already punitive, when you do a foreclosure, you're probably hurting something economically or some job dislocation. But, I would think we need to rework this, there's a lot of moving parts. So, until we get it really refined, I think we're going a bit extreme in how many people have been taken over or how many of the homeless come in, I know that's a concern. But as to whether this is going to eliminate it, it may just accumulate more fines. So, Mr. Speaker, until we really refine it, I think it's deserving of 'with reservations.' Thank you."

Representative San Buenaventura rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in strong support. In my district, there have been a number of zombie foreclosures. And I have found the problem to be hugely disastrous during the lava disaster, because we couldn't even open up those homes for the 800-plus families who were found homeless. A lot of those homes, which could have been made livable for these homeless families, we found that the owners were over in Germany, or they were owned by banks, they were being managed by realtors whose hands were tied.

"We found that these homes were being left vacant because, one, the rentals were either too high or were being purposely left vacant, hopefully with this weird idea that these owners, who are usually out-of-state, think that Hawaii homes are supposed to command these astronomical prices. They obviously did not know about lava zones. So these homes with these inflated prices are not being sold, and because of the unrealistic expectation of their owners, they are being left vacant, so reducing the number of affordable housing in my district as well as increasing squatters, which become a blight in my neighborhood.

"And for those reasons, I believe a high enough fine to force the owners to come to terms with a realistic price of these homes is the only way to go. Thank you very much."

Representative Okimoto rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, may I request a ruling on potential conflict? I serve as a director on a planned community association board and we can initiate foreclosures," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

Representative Okimoto continued, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, may this ruling apply for the rest of the session? Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose to respond, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, second time with reservations. Mr. Speaker, I sympathize with the plight of the lava victims and what is going on in the good Representative from Puna's district. However, this is statewide, this is a state legislature. If it's something that is specific to the Big Island, I think we can say with a population under a certain amount we can say that could be effective. If it's something that because of other ownership you could word it in such a way that it's not so broad or not so punitive.

"And Mr. Speaker, I think the bottom line is, if we are doing foreclosures and this new term, zombie foreclosure, if it takes us 1,500 days, we gotta do a better job as a government to do that. We should be looking or turn this into a study to find out why do we do foreclosures, taking so long, and so much bureaucracy that people would have the gall, if you will, to take over somebody's house, which they shouldn't be doing. But this is a good shot across the bow, but I've got reservations about how we're implementing it statewide. Thank you."

Representative Kong rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1557, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO UNOCCUPIED RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Kong and Ward voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Nakamura and Thielen being excused.
