The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 12:04 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Nakashima presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Lynn DeCoite, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Nakamura and Thielen, who were excused.

On motion by Representative Morikawa, seconded by Representative Matsumoto and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journals of the Fourth and Fifth Days were approved. (Representatives Nakamura and Thielen were excused.)

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 265, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Energy & Environmental Protection, with Representatives Nakamura and Thielen being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 146) recommending that H.B. No. 1597, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1597, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Nakamura and Thielen being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 147) recommending that H.B. No. 379, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Lower & Higher Education.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred jointly to the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 658, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH," passed Second Reading and was referred jointly to the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Nakamura and Thielen being excused.

"Ruling on a potential conflict, Mr. Speaker. Members of my family manufacture, retail and own vape stores in Oahu," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

Representative Cabanilla Arakawa continued, stating:

"Would that be for the rest of the session, Mr. Speaker?"

The Chair addressed Representative Cabanilla Arakawa, stating:

"Yes."

Representative Quinlan rose in opposition to the measure and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Quinlan's written remarks are as follows:

"This bill will only serve to make it harder and more expensive for Hawaii residents to transition from cigarettes, chewing tobacco, and other harmful products to a less harmful nicotine delivery system such as e-liquid."

Representative Ward rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I know that this is not allowable, but I'd love to abstain from this vote. Let me explain it and you can tell me what it is. I know we can't do that. But it's the reason why in the hearing, and we heard a lot of data on this, and we know that 80% of all the young people who are smoking, or 80% of the smokers who are young people have vaped. Clear correlation. Very, very strong. The only thing that we couldn't get in the hearing is--"

Representative Belatti rose to a point of order, stating:

"Point of order. In opposition or in support, Mr. Speaker, for the previous speaker?"

Representative Ward: "I'll go *kanalua*, madam."

At 12:44 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:45 o'clock p.m.

Representative Ward continued to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise with reservations, with the hope that someday we can abstain from voting, but that's a different issue. Mr. Speaker, I was trying to bare my heart about the conflict here, because the young people who are smoking, it's not good that they're vaping. And 80% of those who are smoking is young people are coming out of vaping. Therefore, it's a gateway. But a gate goes in and it goes out.

"The problem where I found in the hearing that we were missing, conspicuously in its absence, how many people are the hardcore smokers, who are vaping, who are leaving smoking. It's \$250-some million we lose because of smoking, the cost of smoking is very, very high. So, I want to see what's the net gain or the net loss of those who are going into smoking because of vaping and those who are coming out of smoking.

"Mr. Speaker, we should have metrics, we should have a databased policy legislation rather than, well it smells and it looks like big clouds of smoke coming out of people's cars and mouths. We should have data before we do that. That's why I have reservations, and I hope somebody, somewhere will get the data about how many hardcore people, and I understand there may be one or two in this body that vaped and got off of cigarettes, that's very, very important. For those reasons, I hope the data comes, and those reasons why I have reservations, even I'd love to go *kanalua*."

Representative Okimoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Tokioka rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Gates rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1574, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTRONIC SMOKING PRODUCTS," passed Second Reading and was referred jointly to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce and the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Gates, Okimoto, Tokioka and Ward voting aye with reservations, with Representatives McDermott and Quinlan voting no, and with Representatives Nakamura and Thielen being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 150) recommending that H.B. No. 1464, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.
