

## TWELFTH DAY

**Monday, February 8, 2021**

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, convened at noon, with Speaker Saiki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Troy N. Hashimoto, after which the Roll was called showing all members present, with Representatives Har, LoPresti, and Matsumoto participating remotely via videoconference.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Eleventh Day was deferred.

**REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES**

Representative Quinlan, for the Committee on Economic Development, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 30) recommending that H.B. No. 809, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 809, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO BROADBAND," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Quinlan, for the Committee on Economic Development, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 31) recommending that H.B. No. 1218, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. May I also have a similar ruling, I am also an officer of an HOA. Thank you, Mr. Speaker," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict," and that the ruling would extend through *sine die*.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1218, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HOME-BASED BUSINESSES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Quinlan, for the Committee on Economic Development, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 32) recommending that H.B. No. 1191, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1191, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Tokioka rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I'd like to ask for a ruling on a potential conflict. I work for a broadband service company in my private employment. Thank you," and

the Chair ruled, "no conflict," and that the ruling would extend through *sine die*.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1191, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO BROADBAND SERVICE INFRASTRUCTURE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Quinlan, for the Committee on Economic Development, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 33) recommending that H.B. No. 240, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 240, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative McDermott rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, no vote, brief comment. Mr. Speaker, this is one of those been there, done that. We've vetted this with our good friend Marcus Oshiro when he was here.

"The jury is out on what actually the studies indicate. I think the majority are saying, hey if you got the startup costs, you're going to be okay, but look it's not a sure slam dunk. And my biggest fear is not the startup costs, but my biggest fear is what I've said time and time again, when you mix political leadership with economic leadership, i.e. banking, you have favoritism.

"I know the author of this bill and I have full confidence in him, because he comes out of banking. But government running a bank is not the way to run an economy or to run loans. Mr. Speaker, I've spent too much time in the third world to see how these things overlap and they just don't work out.

"For those reasons, Mr. Speaker, I think we're treading water in another place, and I wish we could cite journals of two or three years ago and enter the same comments because I'm kind of repeating myself. But having said that, a no vote would be the best thing I can do for right now. Thank you."

Representative Okimoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Quinlan rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, if I may, in the words of the Minority Leader Emeritus, let this be a marketplace of ideas. Thank you. In support."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 240, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO A BANK OF THE STATE OF HAWAII," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representative Okimoto voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives McDermott and Ward voting no.

Representative Onishi, for the Committee on Labor & Tourism, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 34) recommending that H.B. No. 1043, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Economic Development.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. Representative Ward rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, no vote, brief comment, please. All of us have a home that's taken over by the homeless in our district. It's intractable, drug use, all kinds of things that really are a big, big nuisance. And this bill is a good bill because it solves that, except, Mr. Speaker, it says, \$5,000 per day if you don't correct it if you're the owner.

"And I know the author has had a real big problem in his district regarding this, but as I brought up in the committee hearing, why not a warrant as a way of getting the people to have the police come in and get rid of these people? So, I think we have to hit the nail on the head, but this puts a sledgehammer, I think a little bit too heavy, \$5,000 a day is huge. Even the political fines are not even that high, Mr. Speaker. For those reasons, a no vote. Thank you."

Representative Matayoshi rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support, brief comment. As the previous speaker stated, this is a bill introduced to try to help deal with that problem in all of our districts. Every district has its own house or houses that pose an incredible problem to its neighbors, it affects the health and safety of the neighborhood and the community that it's in.

"The problem I'm trying to really address, the fines are kind of a separate issue, the problem I'm really trying to address here is forcing the county to act. And in one of the issues I had with my district, the counties just will not, no matter how high the fines are, they will not start foreclosure proceedings. And this is after the first 90-day period and a second 90-day period, so already half a year has gone by. I'm sure if any of you have tried to deal with problematic houses in your district, you've run into the same issue.

"And I think that there needs to be a drop-dead deadline for action by the counties. Otherwise, the neighbors and the community really has no avenue for relief, there's no light at the end of the tunnel. And when there's no light at the end of the tunnel, people just lose hope. I want to give them some kind of thing to look forward to, that at some point, the government is going to take action and try to deal with this problem. And that's what this bill is trying to do. Thank you."

Representative Perruso rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"I appreciate the intent of the author, but I still have reservations."

Representative Wildberger rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Tam rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Kapela rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you so much, Mr. Speaker. With reservations. I've talked to the author about the measure, we've had some good conversations, I see where he's getting at. But there's a law of general applicability. It may have unintended consequences on the neighbor island where permitting and planning functions are spread out between several different agencies. Because of that, I have reservations, hopefully the next committee can look at that. Thank you."

Representative Matsumoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ganaden rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative D. Kobayashi rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

For those reasons, Mr. Speaker, I think we need to reexamine this bill."

Representative Lowen rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, just a brief comment in support. The bill currently has a blank date and also would not affect resale of used vehicles, only new vehicle sales."

Representative Wildberger rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support. *Mahalo*."
