

THIRTEENTH DAY

Tuesday, February 9, 2021

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, convened at noon, with Speaker Saiki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Daniel Holt, after which the Roll was called showing all members present, with Representatives Har, LoPresti, and Matsumoto participating remotely via videoconference.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Twelfth Day was deferred.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations, brief comment. Mr. Speaker, this adds the cost of the visitor rental fee, which is good, I mean they have to pay their fair share, *et cetera*. But the timing of this, like a lot of the things that are really good that's coming to a lot of the committees now, it's just not the right time.

"We are dying on the vine in terms of visitors, sometimes occupancy rate is like 19, 20, 30% at the highest, no, 20% at the highest on Oahu. If we don't ease what otherwise is a lot of confusion just about getting their shots to get here, to get here and then have the cost is going to be prohibitive.

"So, on behalf of those who haven't come here yet, I think we should make it as easy as possible for them, and this is, okay, it's not a big deal, but it's one of those impediments which can, given all other things being equal, could be the final straw that breaks the camel's back. For those reasons, Mr. Speaker, with reservations."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B.
