"The vast majority of active service members and their families don't pay income taxes here, and that has a deleterious effect on our budget for the state. Their students, their children attend our public schools, they use our public roads, they use our public infrastructure, and most of that, well some large part of that, is funded by income taxes. So, I did want to point out the possible negative impacts of losing any income tax that we do collect from those military dependents who may work in our schools or in other parts of our city and state government. *Mahalo*."

Representative Tam rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."
