

## FORTY-FIRST DAY

**Thursday, April 1, 2021**

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, convened at 12:02 p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Sonny Ganaden, after which the Roll was called showing all members present, with the exception of Representatives Har, Lowen, Marten, Ohno, Perruso, and Tokioka, who were excused.
