"Mr. Speaker, in support, brief comment, please. Thank you. I very much appreciate the intent of this bill and overall agree with its contents, but as it moves forward, I encourage the conference committee to take seriously the Department of Health's concerns regarding oversharing of case data and its unintended consequences. And may I also have permission to insert written comments into the Journal. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Okimoto's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, in support with comments on HSCR 1811, SB 811. Mr. Speaker, I wanted to bring the concerns of the Department of Health, which are also concerns of my own, they read as follows:

Potential for disclosure of a case to be identifying, especially in smaller schools or in districts where community transmission is low enough to make a case in a school a rare event. Identification of a case to classmates or others in the school community can lead to stigma and even bullying, which can cause harm to the case and/or family members.

Inciting panic among school community members who have not actually been exposed to the case, causing unnecessary disruption of learning or even school closure.

If a policy of mandated reporting of cases in schools is to be adopted, DOH believes it will be critical for DOE and its school communities to also address potential stigma that may follow from such disclosure, and to contextualize case disclosure with well thought-out guidance about what such disclosure does and does not signify.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Mr. Speaker, the priorities for the selection of the superintendent should be the overall qualification and ability to perform the job at a high level. I believe this measure would limit the candidate pool for the position of superintendent and exacerbate already difficult recruiting efforts. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1826) recommending that S.B. No. 560, HD 2 pass Third Reading.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 560, HD 2 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Tokioka rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, a no vote in opposition, and may I say a few words. Mr. Speaker, ranked-choice voting is back. I'm not sure why, but the reasons why it's probably back is because it failed because it's unnecessary and confusing.

"What do you mean it's confusing? Well, the experience is, specifically in my office, I said, well look, if my staff couldn't understand it, call the Office of Elections and figure out what it is, how you add up and do the mathematics one way or the other. Lo and behold, Mr. Speaker, the Office of Elections didn't know how to explain it. They don't know what this Australian system is and what it calls for.

"So, if in effect if we who are running the Office of Elections and those of us who have to get elected, if it's that confusing, the public is going to be really diminished by that.

"So, I don't see what the value would be, unless there's something that says there's going to be a real shift in the super majority to be even bigger than the super majority. I know Charles Djou probably would not have won under this particular bill.

"But the point is, it's not necessary, the system is not broken. And if we're going to confuse the people by making where they have to know advanced geometry in order to figure out who's winning, because some people who win who don't even have a chance at winning, but by the mathematics they somehow win. And this is why every year it comes up, it fails, and I hope this is the same rationale for this year, that we stick with what we got and make it better rather than shifting into a system that the Australians and the rest of the world can play around with. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Okimoto rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in opposition, brief comment. In races throughout the decades, Republican candidates can receive a small number of votes in the Republican primary ballot but win by strong majorities in the general. This bill would prevent voters from making that choice in our November elections.

"As Professor James G. Gimpel testified during a case challenging Maine's ranked-choice voting law, quote, unlike ordinary elections and ordinary run-offs, voters are required to make predictions about who will be left standing following an initial tabulation of the votes.

"The predictive nature that comes from ranked-choice voting obscures true debates, true issue-given dialogue between and among candidates, and eliminates genuine binary choices between two top tier candidates.

"Ranked-choice voting is not the solution to encourage more people to vote. It is overly complicated, confusing, and deprives voters of genuinely

informed choices. For these reasons, Mr. Speaker, I am in opposition to this measure. Thank you."

Representative McDermott rose in opposition to the measure and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative McDermott's written remarks are as follows:

"Establishing a 'ranked choice' voting system for special elections is simply an attempt to establish a precedent for expanding this confusing system to regular elections. If the argument is that special elections with a large number of candidates can produce a winner with less than a majority of votes, then the solution is to provide for a run-off between the top two contenders. Ranked-choice voting has a decidedly mixed record in mainland constituencies. Not only is it confusing to many, but the process is subject to potential manipulation. SB 560 is clearly a precursor. If it were employed in Hawaii for primary elections, as had been proposed in the past, with all candidates from every party on the same ballot, it would mean that in November voters would only have a choice between two candidates and possibly only from the same party. My contention is that ranked-choice voting would eliminate minority parties from offering a choice to voters in November. By starting with special elections, SB 560 would move Hawaii in that direction and that is why it should be defeated."

Representative LoPresti rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Strong support. I wanted to share an example of where this would have really helped. In my district, where I live, in the City Council race in 2010, this doesn't apply to city council, it applies to Congress, but the gentleman who won and became the city councilperson, I'm trying to look up the numbers, he won with a small, tiny majority of the vote. There were 14 candidates in that race, 14 candidates, and really one of those candidates was anti-rail, the other 13, we were all in favor of rail.

"It was the first election I ever ran, I didn't know what I was doing, I think I came in 12th. But my colleague from Ewa Beach would have been the city councilman, a Republican, if I remember correctly, because of something like ranked-choice voting. But instead what we had was a division of 14 interests, and only one of them, who was a fringe candidate, frankly, ended up becoming our city councilman, instead of somebody who actually more closely resembled the values, who embodied the values, of our community. And I'm happy to say it was my Republican colleague from Ewa Beach would have been better for that job. Thank you."

Representative Kong rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Tam rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support with a brief comment. Two other states have implemented ranked-choice voting, Maine and Alaska, and I don't think their voters are confused, and that's all I have to say."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 560, HD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO RANKED CHOICE VOTING," passed Third Reading by a vote of 47 ayes to 4 noes, with Representatives Kong and Tokioka voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Matsumoto, McDermott, Okimoto, and Ward voting no.
