SUSPENSION OF RULES

At this time, the Chair stated:

"Members, please note that per committee referral sheet 52, S.C.R. No. 132 and S.C.R. No. 215, SD 1, HD 1 have been re-referred solely to the Committee on Culture & the Arts and Agriculture/Health, Human Services, & Homelessness Committees, respectively. The Committee on Higher Education & Technology waived its referral to these measures and therefore it is appropriate for the House to consider action for adoption."

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

S.C.R. No. 132:

Representative Belatti moved that S.C.R. No. 132 be adopted, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Aquino rose in support of the measure and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Aquino's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I stand in strong support of Senate Concurrent Resolution 132. By way of Act 266, SLH 2019, the Pamantasan Council was created to assist the state and University of Hawaii in uplifting the Filipino community in academics and career. The Filipino community comprises a quarter of Hawaii's ethnic make-up but does not adequately match that proportion in terms of high education transfer rates between 2- to 4-year institutions, graduation rates, and professional careers. By way of this resolution, the Legislature reaffirms our support and commitment to Hawaii's Filipino community, bringing them one step closer to equity as the council works to develop ways to meet access, diversity, and workforce development goals. It is for these reasons that I stand in support of Senate Concurrent Resolution 132 on behalf of the House members of the Joint Filipino Legislative Caucus."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and S.C.R. No. 132, entitled: "REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO REPORT ON THE PAMANTASAN COUNCIL'S SYSTEMWIDE EFFORTS TO IMPROVE THE STATUS OF FILIPINOS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII," was adopted, with Representative Quinlan being excused.

Representative Nakashima, for the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2145-22) recommending that S.C.R. No. 63, SD 1, HD 1 be adopted.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 63, SD 1, HD 1 be adopted, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support and may I have permission to insert comments into the Journal. Thank you."

Representative McKelvey's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. speaker, I stand in strong support of this resolution and want to add my voice to that of the members of the community, insofar as naming the long awaited Kihei high school after Maui's own Patsy T. Mink.

"While there are many people, especially from the South Maui community, who are worthy of this honor, at the end of the day, to name this institution after Ms. Mink is a solid choice given the years of service she has in all levels of government. Although Patsy resided in the Windward side of Oahu when she was elected and served in Congress, she grew up and spent many years here on Maui, especially in South Maui where many of her family members lived and became an indelible part of our Maui Nui community. Her accomplishments are many but as a congresswoman representing Hawaii, she consistently found ways to try to divert federal

dollars to Maui for multiple projects, especially legacy projects for preservation.

"As a staffer in the State Senate, I distinctly remember Patsy Mink pulling down one of the largest ear marks ever, to try to preserve a huge swath of land as a natural area reserve and park for the community, despite opposition from then Republican local leaders determined to turn the area into mega resorts. Although the developers prevailed and we were robbed of this legacy due to her untimely passing, her steadfast determination and dedication in trying to achieve this victory to keep Maui - Maui will always be remembered and serves as a beacon to the many young people who will attend this school for years to come."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations regarding green colonialism that is stifling the African people. Thank you."

Representative Okimoto rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Strong support. Members, this is an important resolution. Being part of the Paris Accords is a way for us to battle the impending, if not already occurring, climate change. Mr. Speaker, coal, the demand for coal is being driven to all new highs thanks to the war of attrition that's being waged by Russia against our friends and family in Ukraine. And now more than ever, we need to be a part of the international community to

battle climate change. We can see firsthand just by going down to the roads and beaches what climate change is doing with coastal inundation. And so, I believe this resolution is extremely important, so I wanted to speak on it. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 108, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION AFFIRMING HAWAII'S ONGOING COMMITMENT TO THE GOALS OF THE PARIS CLIMATE AGREEMENT AND UNITED NATIONS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS AND ENDORSEMENT OF THE FOSSIL FUEL NON-PROLIFERATION TREATY," was adopted, with Representative Ward voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Kong, McDermott, and Okimoto voting no, and with Representative Quinlan being excused.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 24, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING APRIL 17 THROUGH APRIL 23, 2022, AS VOLUNTEER WEEK HAWAII THROUGHOUT THE STATE," was adopted, with Representative Quinlan being excused.

Representative Nakashima, for the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2152-22) recommending that S.C.R. No. 185, SD 1 be adopted.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 185, SD 1 be adopted, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Regarding the Ukrainian refugees, I rise in strong support with a brief comment. Mr. Speaker, we have a profile in courage with President Zelensky. He's not a politician, he's actually being a hero not only for his people, but for the world and for all of us to stand up for what's right, to do it, and at the risk of his own life.

"I think if we remember what happened to the president of Afghanistan after things got a little hot, what did he do? He got in his plane and he jumped across, who knows where he is today, but we know he's safe. He ran away from his people, he ran away from his country, the exact opposite that President Zelensky is doing now. I would like to see him become a Nobel laureate, a Nobel Peace Prize winner.

"But I would also say that the cruelty that the Russians, through Putin, is showing is unconscionable. There was a I think CNN or a Fox News story

that said, it was a Russian lady with a *babushka*, and she was saying, when the Germans were here, they didn't shoot us, they shot the soldiers. But the Russians shoot the civilians. Unconscionable, Mr. Speaker. That is a barbaric thing that I think is not tolerable in a civilized world. And unfortunately, this thing is not going to end, because as long as the Ukrainians live, as long as that spirit of Zelensky lives, Russia is going to have a real fight on its borders continually. Russia is behaving like a pariah, not a civilized nation.

"And I hope with this resolution that we send the signal that, hey, the world doesn't agree with you. Get in step with it, Putin. And we know the Russian people are good people. When they got leadership the way they have it, it's going to be a fearful future.

"And Mr. Speaker, to bring it home, and the off ramp of this is, we in the Pacific, if we have a Chinese Xi Jinping looking at Putin as a type of behavior to emulate and to become like, and he attacks Taiwan, Mr. Speaker, the Pacific is going to blow up again, as it did during World War II. That is my greatest fear, that Taiwan is in jeopardy the way that Ukraine is. For those reasons, Mr. Speaker, this is a great resolution, a great signal to send to the world. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R.
