Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

"Strong support, short comments. I think, Mr. Speaker, we are in an affordable housing crisis. And I think when we take a look at what fuels our pipeline to build affordable housing, it is our private activity bond cap. And I think when we take a look at this reso, it reaffirms this House's commitment to affordable housing. Because I think we've seen people wanting to do special purpose revenue bonds despite us last year putting a five-year moratorium through Act 182 to stop SPRBs and other things up until 2028.

"We only have \$360 million a year to put towards private activities, and I think our commitment here is that all of it should go to affordable housing. I think some of us were very much interested in the GM 3 that came down asking for \$200 million to go to other things other than affordable housing. So, I think this is a very, very important and timely resolution to reaffirm this House's commitment to affordable housing and to show that we are committed to making sure the pipeline continues and that all \$360 million of our private activity bond cap goes to affordable housing. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Nakamura rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"In strong support. May the words of the Housing chair be entered into the Journal as my own. And I just want to thank and acknowledge the Housing chair for his strong advocacy on this point, that without this resolution and the clear intention of this House, if we don't do this, then we are going to see much less affordable housing built in our state. So, thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Quinlan rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

We should not only rely on the Budget and Finance to do the screening, but we ourselves, the Legislature, should screen more carefully as to which special purpose revenue bonds get approved. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose in support of both measures and asked that the remarks of Representative Kobayashi be entered into the Journal as his own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)
