"P R O C L A M A T I O N"

WHEREAS, under Section 16 of Article iii of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, the Governor is required to give notice, by a proclamation, of the Governor's plan to return with the Governor's objections any bill presented to the Governor less than ten days before adjournment sine die or presented to the Governor after adjournment sine die of the Legislature; and

WHEREAS, House Bill No. 300, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to the State Budget," passed by the Legislature, was presented to the Governor within the aforementioned period; and

WHEREAS, under Section 16 of Article iii, the Governor may veto any specific item or items, except for items to be expended by the Legislative and Judicial Branches, in any bill that appropriates money for specific purposes by striking out or reducing the same; and

WHEREAS, House Bill No. 300 appropriates money for specific purposes and certain appropriation items in that bill are unacceptable to the Governor of the State of Hawai'i;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSH GREEN, M.D., Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby issue this proclamation, pursuant to the provisions of Section 16 of Article iii of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, giving notice of my plan to return House Bill No. 300 with my objections to certain appropriation items contained therein to the Legislature as provided by said Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution.

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, I am returning herewith, without my approval, House Bill No. 300, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to the State Budget."

The purpose of this bill, the General Appropriations Act of 2023, is to adjust and request appropriations for the fiscal biennium 2023-2025 to fund the operations and capital improvement projects of Executive Branch agencies and programs.

While the bill as a whole has merit, the use of general fund moneys must be reprioritized due to: (a) the change in the Council on Revenues' general fund tax revenue projection in May 2023 that necessitates that the State's financial plan be rebalanced through line-item vetoes and reductions to the budget; and (b) the need to maintain healthy financial reserves so that the State can meet its reserve policy requirements. Because of this, the following general fund appropriations were subject to: (a) an assessment of items that require additional planning, public input, and clarity on the use of moneys; and (b) an evaluation of each expending agency's ability and capacity to spend down the moneys efficiently within the authorized appropriation period.

Consequently, I object to the expenditure of the following appropriations for the reasons indicated:

A. For the following thirteen general fund appropriations, I object to their expenditure due to the need for additional planning, public input, or clarity on the use of moneys; or concerns regarding each expending agency's ability and capacity to spend down the moneys efficiently within the authorized appropriation period.

1. The \$5,000,000 appropriation of the total \$28,735,463 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LNR172 - Forestry - Resource Management and Development, designated in section 3, item A-11, page 7, line 19, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 699, seq. #3000-001, may have been intended to be used for operating and renovation; improvement; acquisitions; motor vehicles; equipment and appurtenances.

2. The \$5,000,000 appropriation of the total \$8,974,146 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for AGR192 - General Administration for Agriculture, designated in section 3, item A-15, page 8,

line 16, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 30, seq. #2100-001, may have been intended to be used for the mitigation and population control of feral animals. I will be allotting funds to the Department of Land and Natural Resources from that department's appropriation in this bill to help with this need because that department has the appropriate staff and capacity to undertake this task.

3. The \$50,000,000 appropriation of the total \$100,000,000 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for BED138 – Hawaii Green Infrastructure Authority, designated in section 3, item A-21, page 9, line 17, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 144, seq. #1000-001, may have been intended to be used for the solar energy storage loan program.

The \$60,225,000 appropriation of the total \$60,690,440 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LNR801 – Ocean Based Recreation, designated in section 3, item H-6, page 36, line 16, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 726, seq. #3000-001, may have been intended to be used for Boating and Ocean Resources - Renovations, Improvements, Acquisition, Motor Vehicles, Equipment, and Appurtenances, and the Ala Wai Small Boat Harbor Education Center.

7. The \$5,000,000 appropriation of the total \$61,022,542 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LAW900 – General Administration, designated in section 3, item I-20, page 39, line 20, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 650, seq. #2101-001, may have been intended to be used for plans, design, construction, and equipment for new building.

8. The \$12,000,000 appropriation of the total \$26,362,784 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for DEF118 – Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, designated in section 3, item I-30, page 41, line 11, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 295, seq. #2100-001, may have been intended to be used for plans, design, construction, and equipment for new headquarters for the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency.

9. The \$4,000,000 appropriation of the total \$49,233,054 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for AGS131 - Enterprise Technology Services, designated in section 3, item K-20, page 46, line 38, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 54, seq.

#2100-001, may have been intended to be used for planning for the relocation of the Data Center.

10. The \$3,000,000 appropriation of the total \$7,786,554 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for HRD191 - Supporting Services - Human Resources Development, designated in section 3, item K-24, page 47, line 25, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 459, seq. #2101-001, may have been intended to be used for information technology support and computer equipment and infrastructure.

11. The \$100,000 appropriation of the total \$274,977 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LNR101 - Public Lands Management, for operating costs, designated in section 3, item K-30, page 48, line 7, of the bill, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 685, seq. #2101-001, may have been intended to be used for the Kawehewehe Waikiki Boardwalk.

12. The \$1,050,000 appropriation of the total \$15,380,669 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for AGS221 – Public Works - Planning, Design, and Construction, designated in section 3, item K-35, page 48, line 35, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 61, seq. #2103-001, may have been intended to be used for proof of concept and master planning.

13. The \$500,000 appropriation of the total \$4,091,600 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for AGS233 - Central Services - Building Repairs and Alterations, designated in section 3, item K-38, page 49, line 10, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 69, seq. #2100-001, may have been intended to be used for planning for the relocation of the Mapunapuna baseyard.

B. For the following general fund appropriation, I object to the expenditure of \$50,000,000 for the Hawaii Technology Development Corporation, for infrastructure improvements for regional economic development for the First Responder Technology Campus. I understand that planning for the Campus is still in its initial stages. Given that the timing of construction will be subject to the approval of necessary land use entitlements and permits, it would not be fiscally prudent to commit such a large amount to this project without having secured such authorizations. Further, it appears highly unlikely that the contracts and encumbrances for this project can be completed before funding for the project lapses on June 30, 2024. I also object to the expenditure of \$2,000,000 of the \$4,000,000 appropriation for the Hawaii Center for Advanced Transportation Technologies for renewable energy technology, as this program is in its early stages of development, and I will be allotting \$2,000,000 from the remaining balance of this appropriation to support this program.

The \$50,000,000 appropriation of the total \$60,624,444 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for BED143 - Hawaii Technology Development Corporation, designated in section 3, item A-19, page 9, line 4, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 153, seq. #2102-001, may have been intended to be used for infrastructure improvements for regional economic development, and the \$2,000,000 appropriation of the same total appropriation, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 151, seq. #1002-001, may have been intended for the Hawaii Center for Advanced Transportation Technologies for renewable energy technology, microgrid, and other related programs.

C. For the following general fund appropriation, I object to the expenditure of \$88,800,000 to the Agribusiness Development Corporation for the Wahiawa Irrigation System because this is a major policy decision for the State that requires thorough review and planning that would exceed the one-year timeline of the appropriation. This decision involves more than the preservation of the system for irrigation purposes. It is unclear if sufficient funding is provided for the operation and maintenance of the irrigation system. I understand that a report is being prepared evaluating the cost of repairs and other operating expenses needed to maintain the irrigation system. Further, a clear framework as to the responsibilities of the Agribusiness Development Corporation, the Department of Agriculture, and the Department of Land and Natural Resources with respect to operating and

maintaining the Wahiawa Irrigation System and Lake Wilson needs to be developed. However, I am committed to the development of diversified agriculture in Central Oahu and I will be allotting \$5,000,000 from the remaining balance of this appropriation to support the initial planning and design to improve or further develop the irrigation system.

The \$88,800,000 appropriation of the total \$106,160,761 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for BED170 - Agribusiness Development and Research, designated in section 3, item A-16, page 8, line 23, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 181, seq. #2100-001, may have been intended to be used for water infrastructure, land acquisition, and irrigation system management.

D. For the following general fund appropriation, I object to the expenditure of \$120,000,000 of the \$170,000,000 appropriation to the School Facilities Authority for teacher housing. I support the need to provide housing for our teachers and I will be allotting \$50,000,000 from the remaining balance of this appropriation to support the State's commitment to this endeavor. This funding will assist in the initial phases of providing much-needed teacher housing.

The \$120,000,000 appropriation of the total \$171,761,193 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for EDN450 - School Facilities Authority, designated in section 3, item G-6, page 31, line 33, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 365, seq. #3000-001, may have been intended to be used for teacher housing.

E. For the following general fund appropriation, I object to the expenditure of \$500,000,000 for deposit into the emergency and budget reserve fund for fiscal year 2024-2025. With the deposit of \$500,000,000 into the emergency and budget reserve fund in fiscal year 2023-2024, the State will meet its financial reserve policy requirements for the fiscal biennium 2023-2025. By line item vetoing this amount for fiscal year 2024-2025, the negative impact of reducing funding needed for public services will be mitigated. In addition, I object to the expenditure of \$33,000,000 for the State's matching portion of federal broadband grants for fiscal year 2024-2025. I believe that the \$33,000,000 appropriated in fiscal year 2023-2024 for the State's matching portion of federal broadband grants will be sufficient to meet the federal matching requirements at this time and that state match requirements can be revisited when additional federal funds are secured.

The \$500,000,000 appropriation of the total \$545,351,873 appropriation for fiscal year 2024-2025 funded by general funds for BUF101 - Departmental Administration and Budget Division, designated in section 3, item K-5, page 44, line 31, of the bill, for operating costs, specifically those funds that, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 196, seq. #3001-001, may have been intended to be used for deposit into the emergency and budget reserve fund, and the \$500,000,000 amount in the proviso in part III, page 51, section 4, line 5, of this bill, and the \$33,000,000 appropriation of the same total appropriation, as indicated by the Budget Comparison Worksheet dated May 15, 2023, at page 195 seq. #3000-001, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for the State's matching portion of federal broadband grants.

Specific Items Vetoed

Section 16 of Article III of the State Constitution provides that, "[e]xcept for items appropriated to be expended by the judicial and legislative branches, the governor may veto any specific item or items in any bill which appropriates money for specific purposes by striking out or reducing the same." Because of the foregoing objections, I have taken the following actions pursuant to my appropriation item veto authority:

1. Reduced by \$5,000,000 the total \$28,735,463 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LNR172 - Forestry - Resource Management and Development, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for operating costs and renovation; improvement; acquisitions; motor vehicles; equipment and appurtenances; designated in section 3, item A-11, page 7, line 19, of the bill, and changed it to \$23,735,463.

2. Reduced by \$5,000,000 the total \$8,974,146 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for AGR192 - General Administration for Agriculture, for operating costs, specifically those funds

that may have been intended to be used for the mitigation and population control of feral animals, designated in section 3, item A-15, page 8, line 16, of the bill, and changed it to \$3,974,146.

3. Reduced by \$88,800,000 the total \$106,160,761 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for BED170 - Agribusiness Development and Research, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for water infrastructure, land acquisition, and irrigation system management, designated in section 3, item A-16, page 8, line 23, of the bill, and changed it to \$17,360,761.

4. Reduced by \$50,000,000 the total \$60,624,444 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for BED143 - Hawaii Technology Development Corporation, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for infrastructure improvements for regional economic development, and the \$2,000,000 appropriation of the same total appropriation for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for the Hawaii Center for Advanced Transportation Technologies for renewable energy technology, microgrid, and other related programs, designated in section 3, item A-19, page 9, line 4, of the bill, and changed it to \$8,624,444.

5. Reduced by \$50,000,000 the total \$100,000,000 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for BED138 - Hawaii Green Infrastructure Authority, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for the solar energy storage loan program, designated in section 3, item A-21, page 9, line 17, of the bill, and changed it to \$50,000,000.

6. Reduced by \$1,500,000 the total \$201,814,260 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for BED150 - Hawaii Community Development Authority, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for East Kapolei infrastructure implementation master plan and programmatic environmental impact statement; the \$18,500,000 appropriation of the same total appropriation for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for Kakaako Street upgrades; the \$42,000,000 appropriation of the same total appropriation for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for Kalaeloa electrical upgrades-districtwide; and the \$61,000,000 appropriation of the same total appropriation, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for the Iwilei-Kapalama TOD infrastructure design and construction, designated in section 3, item A-23, page 9, line 33, of the bill, and changed it to \$78,814,260.

7. Reduced by \$120,000,000 the total \$171,761,193 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for EDN450 - School Facilities Authority, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for teacher housing, designated in section 3, item G-6, page 31, line 33, of the bill, and changed it to \$51,761,193.

8. Reduced by \$25,000,000 the total \$62,545,402 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LNR806 - Parks Administration and Operation, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for state parks-renovations; improvement; acquisitions; motor vehicles; equipment and appurtenances; designated in section 3, item H-5, page 36, line 8, of the bill, and changed it to \$37,545,402.

9. Reduced by \$60,225,000 the total \$60,690,440 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LNR801 - Ocean- Based Recreation, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for Boating and Ocean Resources - Renovations, Improvements, Acquisition, Motor Vehicles, Equipment, and Appurtenances, and the Ala Wai Small Boat Harbor Education Center, designated in section 3, item H-6, page 36, line 16, of the bill and changed it to \$465,440.

10. Reduced by \$5,000,000 the total \$61,022,542 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LAW900 - General Administration, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for plans, design, construction, and equipment for new building, designated in section 3, item I-20, page 39, line 20, of the bill, and changed it to \$56,022,542.

11. Reduced by \$12,000,000 the total \$26,362,784 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for DEF118 - Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, for operating costs, specifically those

funds that may have been intended to be used for plans, design, construction, and equipment for new headquarters for the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, designated in section 3, item I-30, page 41, line 11, of the bill, and changed it to \$14,362,784.

12. Reduced by \$500,000,000 the total \$545,351,873 appropriation for fiscal year 2024-2025 funded by general funds for BUF101 – Departmental Administration and Budget Division, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for deposit into the emergency and budget reserve fund, and reduced by an additional \$33,000,000 the same total appropriation for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for the State's matching portion of federal broadband grants, designated in section 3, item K-5, page 44, line 31, of the bill, and changed the total appropriation to \$12,351,873 and stricken the \$500,000,000 amount in the proviso in part III, section 4, page 51, line 5, of the bill, and changed it to \$0.

13. Reduced by \$4,000,000 the total \$49,233,054 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for AGS131 - Enterprise Technology Services, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for planning for the relocation of the Data Center, designated in section 3, item K-20, page 46, line 38, of the bill, and changed it to \$45,233,054.

14. Reduced by \$3,000,000 the total \$7,786,554 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for HRD191 - Supporting Services, Human Resources Development, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for information technology support and computer equipment and infrastructure, designated in section 3, item K-24, page 47, line 25, of the bill, and changed it to \$4,786,554.

15. Reduced by \$100,000 the total \$274,977 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for LNR101 - Public Lands Management, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for the Kawehewehe Waikiki Boardwalk, designated in section 3, item K-30, page 48, line 7, of the bill, and changed it to \$174,977.

16. Reduced by \$1,050,000 the total \$15,380,669 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for AGS221 - Public Works - Planning, Design, and Construction, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for proof of concept and master planning, designated in section 3, item K-35, page 48, line 35, of the bill, and changed it to \$14,330,669.

17. Reduced by \$500,000 the total \$4,091,600 appropriation for fiscal year 2023-2024 funded by general funds for AGS233 - Central Services-Building Repairs and Alterations, for operating costs, specifically those funds that may have been intended to be used for planning for the relocation of the Mapunapuna baseyard, designated in section 3, item K-38, page 49, line 10, of the bill, and changed it to \$3,591,600.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning House Bill No. 300 with the appropriations reduced or stricken as described above.

- SECTION 4. This bill also appropriates \$100,000 for one full-time equivalent program manager position for the Office of Enterprise Technology Services.

This bill is objectionable and cost prohibitive because the State uses almost 600 IT systems and the cost of compliance with this bill could reach hundreds of millions of dollars. The cost and effort required also would have a chilling effect on the modernization of State IT systems. State agencies already provide language access support for the State's public-facing systems and should be given the discretion to provide cost effective language access, such as providing access by using multilingual staff or written publications.

Moneys received from the pilot program would be deposited into the Art in Private Places Special Account.

This bill is objectionable because the intent of the works of art program is to provide works of art for new and renovated State buildings funded from one percent of the amount appropriated for the project's construction cost element. Using State-purchased works of art for non-State individuals, businesses, or entities does not fulfill the intent of the works of art program and denies the public the opportunity to enjoy works of art in public buildings. It may result in public property being used for a non-public purpose in violation of Section 4 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i.

Further, given that some of the art pieces may have been purchased using tax-exempt bond proceeds, there could be adverse tax consequences to the State if the amount of revenues generated from the loan program are significant when compared to the amount of tax-exempt bond proceeds used to acquire the works of art. Also, this bill would have a negative impact on Hawai'i's creative economy as businesses and individuals could rent works of art from the State rather than purchase art pieces from the artists.

Our laws provide the DLNR an objective means to issue new permits—by lottery. This lottery system will continue to allow the DLNR to issue new permits while the DLNR may seek a more balanced approach to prioritizing applications. Additionally, the law already provides that DLNR may refrain from renewing permits to permittees who fail to comply with permit terms and conditions.
