The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 12:06 p.m., with Vice Speaker Ichiyama presiding.

The Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward, who were excused.

"On your request for a ruling on a potential conflict, the Chair's ruling that the conflict of interest rules would not raise a conflict here. And so, that ruling will remain in effect for the remainder of session."

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. With reservations. My reservations is based upon the testimony of the DCCA insurance commissioner which notes in the record, 'it is unclear whether the amendments in sections 1 through 3 of this bill,' which, Madame Speaker, is the entire bill, 'would be construed as "in addition to the essential health benefits" within the meaning of 45 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) § 155.170(a), or subject to defrayment provisions under 45 CFR § 155.170(b) which apply to benefits "in addition to the essential health benefits."

"Madam Speaker, this speaks to the complexity of state health insurance laws, the intersection with our Prepaid Health Care Act, and the federal Affordable Care Act. With the chaos that is occurring currently in Congress, I think it's really incumbent upon us to tread softly. Even though this bill does in fact embrace and include more coverage, which I support, it's the underlying threat to potentially our Prepaid Health Care Act, which is why I believe DCCA put their testimony forward and why we need to proceed carefully in this area of any more state health insurance mandates. Thank you, Madam Speaker."

These multiple-use lands should remain under DLNR's management.' HB 1323 contradicts the recommendations of this report by mandating that these lands be transferred to DOA and eliminating the review by the Board of Land and Natural Resources.

"DLNR has published a public website, Revocable Permit & General Lease Land Transfers, with an interactive map, where the work of the Act 90 Working Group is clearly detailed. Given that they have been to collaborate successfully thus far, with so few issues left outstanding, I would suggest that the Legislature refrain from intervening at this time."

Representative Pierick rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1317, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO WORKFORCE HOUSING," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Water & Land, with Representatives Garcia, Muraoka, and Pierick voting no, and with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representative Evslin, for the Committee on Housing, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 139) recommending that H.B. No. 916, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Tourism and the Committee on Economic Development & Technology.

Representative Todd moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 916, HD I pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Tourism and the Committee on Economic Development & Technology, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Garcia rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 916, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE LOW-INCOME HOUSING TAX CREDIT," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Tourism and the Committee on Economic Development & Technology, with Representative Garcia voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representative Evslin, for the Committee on Housing, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 140) recommending that H.B. No. 1451, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Water & Land.

Representative Todd moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1451, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Water & Land, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Pierick rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Garcia rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1451, HD I, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Water & Land, with Representative Garcia voting aye with reservations, with Representative Pierick voting no, and with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representative Evslin, for the Committee on Housing, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 141) recommending that H.B. No. 1298, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Labor.

Representative Todd moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1298, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Labor, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Pierick rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Muraoka rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Garcia rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1298, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HOUSING," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Labor, with Representatives Garcia, Muraoka, and Pierick voting no, and with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representatives Evslin and Kila, for the Committee on Housing and the Committee on Transportation, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 142) recommending that H.B. No. 157, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs.

Representative Todd moved that the report of the Committees be adopted, and that H.B. No. 157, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Souza rose in support of the measure with reservations and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Souza's written remarks are as follows:

"I have very strong reservations regarding this measure, HB 157. As the representative for District 43 (Kapolei and Makakilo) and the only state representative who resides in the Villages of Kapolei and has for over three decades, I am concerned about this bill and the consequences it will have for my constituents. This measure forces the transfer of the Villages of Kapolei to the City and County of Honolulu by January 1, 2026 without regard for any of the ongoing processes that currently involve both the Hawai'i Housing Finance and Development Corporation (HHFDC) and the city related to this matter. Projects are currently underway to ensure the infrastructure is in place and up to par to meet the city requirements for the transfer of the Villages of Kapolei roads to the City and County of Honolulu. This bill will mandate the transfer without any contemplation of the negative implications that may flow from halting the current progress. The transfer of the roads should occur sooner than later so the city can take over the Villages of Kapolei roads and the community can realize the benefits of our roads being under city jurisdiction. However, this bill is utilizing our legislative power to force an agreement between HHFDC and the city and aims to intervene in an ongoing process with a set deadline of January 1,

"Reading this bill raised a red flag for me from a legal perspective and the committee report even states that the 'committees have requested a formal opinion from the Department of the Attorney General seeking advice on the legality of requiring the City and County of Honolulu to accept the terms of the transfer.' This bill will not only set a bad precedent if it moves forward, but it will raise more questions than answers. What happens if the roads were to be prematurely forced into the hands of the city without proper negotiations between both parties? Will the work that HHFDC has yet to complete to bring the Villages of Kapolei roads up to par as a current requirement of completion for the transfer to the city occur once the transfer is complete? If we force a transfer at a certain dollar amount without due diligence, it will be a disservice to our community members in the long run.

"In its testimony to HB 800 this session, the City and County of Honolulu addressed this measure, HB 157. The city states, 'First, with respect to the roads of the Villages of Kapolei (roads), the city previously testified in opposition via HB 157 Relating to Transportation. The basis for that opposition was that the city entered into a verbal agreement with the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation (HHFDC) in 2024 to accept dedication of the roads for a present-day discounted value of \$60M. The City stands ready to formally accept dedication under the terms agreed to in 2024 with the Executive Director of HHFDC, disposing of an infrastructure non-conformity issue that has long plagued the City and HHFDC. Please allow the City and State to dispose of this longstanding issue in 2025 by the agreed-upon terms in 2024.'

"We must proceed in a thoughtful way and not only focus on the result, but the manner in which we are trying to create the change we seek. Perhaps HB 800, or a House resolution or House concurrent resolution urging

HHFDC and the city to work together to efficiently transfer the Villages of Kapolei roads to the City and County of Honolulu by December 31, 2025 present more appropriate routes to prompt the transfer. The rigidity of HB 157 is not the proper avenue to pursue the transfer."

Representative Amato rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 157, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, with Representatives Amato and Souza voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representative Hashem, for the Committee on Water & Land, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 143) recommending that H.B. No. 1316, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1316, HD I, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representative Hashem, for the Committee on Water & Land, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 144) recommending that H.B. No. 1007, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs.

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1007, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representative Hashem, for the Committee on Water & Land, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 145) recommending that H.B. No. 1132, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Public Safety.

Representative Todd moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1132, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Public Safety, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Garcia rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Amato rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1132, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Public Safety, with Representatives Amato and Garcia voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representative Hashem, for the Committee on Water & Land, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 146) recommending that H.B. No. 299, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Agriculture & Food Systems.

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 299, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII INVASIVE SPECIES COUNCIL," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Agriculture & Food Systems, with Representatives Cochran, Kong, and Ward being excused.

Representative Garrett, for the Committee on Higher Education, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 147) recommending that H.B. No. 223, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.
