So even though they're working together all year round, it's still really expensive to live there. If we have the opportunity to work all year round, it doesn't necessarily mean our cost of living will go down, based on other states.

"We are very, very knowledgeable and we have lots of skills coming into this job. So, we have the capacity to solve basically all of our state's problems in a short amount of time. High cost of living, housing, homelessness, all that stuff. But we haven't done it in like, over 50 years. So, I don't think we need more time to solve the issues. We just need to go ahead and do the things that will work in a short amount of time."

Representative Lee rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"I rise in support. Thank you, Madam Speaker. As this body is well aware, about six or seven months ago, there were about eight chosen landfill sites potentially for the city and county, and six of those reside in District 50. What I'm afraid of, and this is supported by the Department of Land and Natural Resources, it's supported by the farms, actually asking us to expand the scope of this so that they would support it. But it is supported by 100% of my constituency.

"I want to acknowledge, and I want to be very respectful for the people, for the representative, the constituents of the people in Nānākuli and for the representative out on the North Shore where the current land site out in Wahiawā is being considered.

"But what this body may not be aware of is that over the last 70 years, in Kailua alone, there have been not one, not two, not three, not four, not five, but there have been six landfill sites in Kailua over the last 70 years. And if it is not Wahiawā, it would be bringing a seventh landfill to Kailua, into the District 50. Not only that, but Kapa'a Transfer Station sits upon Kawainui Marsh, which is the namesake, one of the two sacred waterways, that Kailua was named after.

"So, I support this bill. My constituents support this bill. And I understand that other districts may not want this. But in response to Wahiawā as the chosen site, there have been so many bills that have been proposed this session that protect Wahiawā, but this is the only bill that will protect another landfill from coming to Kailua and District 50. Thank you, Madam Speaker."

Representative Marten rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"I rise in support, and I'd like to have the words of the speaker from District 50 entered into the Journal as my own. And also, just to briefly mention that in Kailua, we are really striving to restore our *ahupua* 'a from *mauka* to *makai*, we have so many different initiatives with nonprofits going on at this time. It's a really exciting thing. And another landfill doesn't fit well in that program. Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Reyes Oda rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you. I rise in opposition. I had looked into the landfill site selections, and this is way back in one of the original ones where they were talking about the different sites for the landfill, one of which is in 'Ewa Beach, probably about a five-minute walk from my house. It was using the Hawai'i Prince Golf Course as a potential site, which was thrown off early. But the point being that, if you drive into 'Ewa Beach down Fort Weaver Road, one of the considerations we're using right at the corner across from Buffalo Wild Wings and Safeway. And if that's a potential site, I don't see that it couldn't be a potential site in other places that those communities, and I feel I feel bad to be saying that we have to put a site anywhere, but that it has to be up for consideration too.

"I gave up my job in Nānākuli to come here, and sometimes I used to refer myself as the teacher from beautiful Nānākuli Valley in the middle of PVT and Waimānalo Sanitary Landfill, because that's where my location was.

"But in reading the some of the testimony, one of them had said that it may cause others to seek similar protection, where then we're trying to codify each and every group and organization or environmental issue or everything to the point that we're not giving the city any latitude to make any decisions. And I think also, within another testimony, it said that we need to have discussions about a comprehensive look about how we manage our waste. And I think that's also important, too. Thank you."

Representative Muraoka rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"I rise in support. If this bill doesn't pass, there's a very strong possibility that Waimānalo Gulch doesn't move. Waimānalo Gulch is at capacity. And like my colleague from Kailua, the last few landfills have either been in his community or mine. So, I support this bill."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 878, HD I, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO LANDFILLS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, with Representatives Garcia, Kong, Reyes Oda, Shimizu, and Souza voting no, and with Representatives Belatti, Cochran, Kila, and Ward being excused.

Representative Kahaloa, for the Committee on Agriculture & Food Systems, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 312) recommending that H.B. No. 92, as amended in HD 1, be recommitted to the Committee on Agriculture & Food Systems.

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 92, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO AGRICULTURE," was recommitted to the Committee on Agriculture & Food Systems, with Representatives Belatti, Cochran, Kila, and Ward being excused.
