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Thursday, March 20, 2025

Representative Souza's written remarks are as follows:

"As the chair of the Aviation and Space Caucus, I wholeheartedly support Senate Bill 1638, SD 2, HD1, Relating to Air Carriers.

"This bill establishes within the Department of Transportation a threeyear Moloka'i Air Carrier Subsidy Pilot Program which will provide subsidies to airlines operating out of Moloka'i Airport and requests an appropriation.

"The preamble of this bill states the following:

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"The legislature finds that the lack of affordable air travel disproportionately affects Molokai residents, many of whom rely on air transportation for essential services, including healthcare, employment, and education. The legislature further finds that reliable and cost-effective air service is not merely a convenience but a necessity for residents of remote island communities. As such, ensuring that Molokai residents have access to affordable air transportation serves a compelling public interest by improving economic opportunities, enhancing access to medical care, and supporting the overall well-being of the community.'

"The crux of this bill is about ensuring access for rural communities----in this case, Moloka'i.

"These subsidies will not only allow for more competition among current air carriers in the Moloka'i air travel market, thereby prompting more affordable airfares for passengers, but it will also provide an opportunity for other air carriers to enter the market.

"With all of the executive orders and major policy changes that are ongoing at the federal level, it is important that as a state we are providing sustainable solutions to help improve our air travel situation where we can in those instances where federal law does not preempt state law."

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1002, SD 2, HD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING," was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Cochran and Ward being excused.

Representative Hashem, for the Committee on Water & Land, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1405) recommending that S.B. No. 946, SD 2, HD 1, as amended in HD 2, be referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs.

Representative Todd moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 946, SD 2, HD 2 be referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Amato rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I rise in opposition. This for me is a hard no. I can't believe we're even considering allowing an exemption for treatment plants to discharge sewage. Did we learn nothing from the U.S. Supreme Court telling Maui County that discharging even treated sewage and other such effluents, even through a well, is illegal and is a violation of the federal EPA Clean Water Act.

"I for one believe in the rule of law and following the courts. And we need to follow the Supreme Court ruling to follow the Clean Water Act while we still have one. In these times with despotic wannabe tyrants gutting the EPA and dismantling so many other federal agencies, it is up to us, the members in this chamber, to support the courts.

"Colleagues, things have changed. We can no longer just go along with all-powerful special interests just to get along. Now more than ever in our lives, we must fight and stand up and protect Hawai'i and our environment. Please join me in voting no. Thank you."

Representative Lowen rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. In support. If you read the bill, you will see that the only change to existing law in this draft is removing an exemption that existed for allowing treatment plants to discharge water if they were utilizing sewage to produce clean energy. So, it is not making significant changes to existing law."

Representative Garcia rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"In opposition. I would like to concur with my colleague from Kihei minus the wannabe tyrants. I don't think wannabe tyrants has anything to do with this bill, but I agree that we should be cautious when emitting wastewater into our oceans."

Representative Shimizu rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I rise in opposition. I agree with the representative that just spoke before me. And I am just in opposition, in an ideal world where we would not have to discharge sewage into our beautiful ocean. Thank you."

Representative Alcos rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Muraoka rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 946, SD 2, HD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT," was referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, with Representatives Alcos, Amato, Garcia, Muraoka, and Shimizu voting no, and with Representatives Cochran and Ward being excused.
