### Tuesday, March 25, 2025

And it's about time that that happens, so that our roadways can be under the jurisdiction of the City & County of Honolulu and HPD can enforce the traffic code on those roadways. And also, so that the overgrown areas with shrubbery and grass, which poses a threat to the safety of our residents, it blocks vision in a lot of the different roadways, and it also causes an eyesore for residents.

"We need consistency and maintenance of the Villages of Kapolei in its entirety. And this resolution urging the Hawai'i Housing Finance and Development Corporation to continue working with the City & County of Honolulu to efficiently transfer the roads within the Villages of Kapolei to City & County of Honolulu will be the start so that the Villages of Kapolei residents can finally get their due. Thank you."
