Friday, March 28, 2025

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 12:04 p.m., with Vice Speaker Ichiyama presiding.

The Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Cochran, Hussey, Muraoka, and Ward, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Fortieth Day was deferred.

Representative Souza rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Souza rose to respond, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. Can I request that comments be inserted into the Journal. And also, a brief comment. I just wanted to say that this is the-"

Representative Garcia rose to a point of order, stating:

"Point of order, Madam Speaker. The kind gentlewoman from Makakilo did not express her support or opposition to the resolution."

Vice Speaker Ichiyama: "Thank you. Representative Souza, still in opposition?"

Representative Souza continued, stating:

"Still in opposition. I just wanted to say that this is the second measure that we've seen come to the Floor that talks about an emergency access for West O'ahu beyond my district, beyond District 43. And there's residents in Makakilo who are still asking for a second point-"

Representative Kila rose to a point of order, stating:

"Point of order, Madam Speaker. Under Rule 28.7, members may debate the consequences of a bill, but may not question the intent or motives, and I believe the remarks are violating that rule."

Representative Souza: "This is facts, Madam Speaker, this is the second measure that has come to the Floor."

At 12:20 p.m., Representative Garcia requested a recess, and the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:21 p.m.

Representative Souza continued, stating:

"Still in opposition, Madam Speaker. Thank you. Just to clarify, that was not going to intent, that was just stating the facts, that this is the second measure that has come to the Floor pertaining to districts beyond District 43. And I do have residents in Makakilo, in District 43, for decades they've been wanting a second point of access so that in the event of an emergency, a wildfire, they don't want to be the next Lahaina. We're trying to be proactive. I did introduce a couple of resolutions pertaining to the Makakilo Drive extension, they were not heard. I introduced bills, same thing. I think that we need to ensure equity for all of our communities. And my residents, my constituents in District 43 expect that they're also going to be looked after. Thank you."

Representative Souza's written remarks are as follows:

"I am in opposition to HR 43, HD 1, Urging the City and County of Honolulu to work with stakeholders to construct an emergency access road on the Wai'anae Coast. This is the second measure that has come to the House Floor pertaining to another point of access for westside residents beyond District 43.

"I am in agreement that in the event of an emergency, residents on the westside (specifically west beyond District 43) need another route for ingress and egress aside from Farrington Highway. However, if this issue is significant for the communities on the westside, mainly referring to the communities that comprise House District 44 and House District 45, then having another route for ingress and egress on the mountain in Makakilo in House District 43, should be of equal importance in the event of an emergency or wildfire. The Makakilo Drive Extension was promised to Makakilo residents decades ago and would be a second route for the well over 20,000 residents of Makakilo to have access off the mountain in the event of an emergency. The current mitigation plan of utilizing an access road in the Makakilo Quarry owned and operated by Grace Pacific LLC is not sustainable and merely serves as a bandage for a longstanding problem. I introduced two resolutions this session, HR 9, Requesting the Director of Transportation to establish the Makakilo Drive Extension Task Force to address issues delaying the construction of the Makakilo Drive Extension Project, and HR 14, Requesting the City and County of Honolulu to transfer its authority to construct a Makakilo Drive Extension to the State, in addition to bills I introduced also relating to the Makakilo Drive Extension.

"Equity for all communities is important, especially when it comes to providing safety measures for communities. One community is not more important than another community. It is unfathomable that the safety of my community is not being prioritized when it comes to providing a second point of access for Makakilo residents."

Representative Kila rose to a point of order, stating:

"Madam Speaker, point of order. The comments that were made are still in violation of rule 28-7, and you can criticize the idea but not necessarily the intention, character, or motives of another member."

At 12:22 p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:26 p.m.

S.B. No. 289:

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, S.B. No. 289, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ETHICS ADMINISTRATIVE FINES," passed Third Reading by a vote of 47 ayes, with Representatives Cochran, Hussey, Muraoka, and Ward being excused.

S.B. No. 1319, SD 1:

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, S.B. No. 1319, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO IDENTIFICATION PROCESSING," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes to 2 noes, with Representatives Amato and Iwamoto voting no, and with Representatives Cochran, Hussey, Muraoka, and Ward being excused.
