Representative Iwamoto rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I rise in support with one reservation. This is requesting the Judiciary to convene a working group to review the Residential Landlord-Tenant Code to determine if any amendments or updates are necessary to improve the landlord-tenant interactions and address other housing issues.

"Like with many working groups, I think it's really important that community members, and in this case, tenants, who are often underrepresented within the real estate industry, among attorneys, oftentimes tenants go to court unrepresented or minimally represented by a public interest organization such as Legal Aid or Volunteer Legal Services Hawai'i, both of which I have worked for. So, I understand that tenants feel underrepresented as a whole.

"I just wish that these task force that address tenant issues are explicitly ask the body to be configured with equal representation from landlords, real estate agents, property managers, as well as equal representation from those who do assist tenants or tenant groups or tenants themselves. Thank you so much."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and S.C.R. No. 123, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE JUDICIARY TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO REVIEW THE RESIDENTIAL LANDLORD-TENANT CODE TO DETERMINE IF ANY AMENDMENTS OR UPDATES ARE NECESSARY TO IMPROVE LANDLORD-TENANT INTERACTIONS AND ADDRESS OTHER HOUSING ISSUES," was adopted, with Representative Iwamoto voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Amato, Cochran, Garrett, Ichiyama, Perruso, and Quinlan being excused.

Representative Iwamoto rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I rise in support with reservations. So, in 2020, the Legislature passed Act 16, which codified the following, that we as a state are prohibiting construction of private shoreline hardening structures, including seawalls and revetments, at sites having sand beaches and at sites where shoreline hardening structures interfere with existing recreational and waterline activities. We will be hearing four different resolutions on this area of law today.

"So, this particular resolution before us that we're voting on has to do with issuing a 25-year easement for state submerged lands in front of personal property. In this particular instance, the erosion that's occurring is partially caused by the government constructing a harbor. So, the government hardened the nearby shoreline, which caused erosion of this particular property. For that reason, I support with reservations. But these requests for shoreline hardening are a case-by-case basis, and on this one, I'm voting with reservations. Thank you."

Representative Souza rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and S.C.R. No. 4, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A TWENTY-FIVE-YEAR TERM, NON-EXCLUSIVE EASEMENT COVERING A PORTION OF STATE SUBMERGED LANDS AT KIKIAOLA, KEKAHA, KAUAI, FOR A SHORELINE PROTECTION STRUCTURE, AND FOR USE, REPAIR, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE IMPROVEMENTS CONSTRUCTED THEREON," was adopted, with Representatives Iwamoto and Souza voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Amato, Belatti, Cochran, Garrett, Ichiyama, Perruso, and Quinlan being excused.

Representative Yamashita, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2135) recommending that S.C.R. No. 5, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, be adopted.

Representative Iwamoto rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. Rising in support with reservations. This specific easement is because, so the structure that's currently there now functions as a sea wall. However, there were stairs built into the wall that eroded over time and went into disrepair. This resolution just requests that they rebuild the stairs. These particular stairs retract into the wall, they do not extend into the ocean, causing a kind of extension of hardening. Because they retract into wall, I will support with reservations. Thank you."

Representative Souza rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and S.C.R. No. 5, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A TWENTY-FIVE-YEAR TERM, NON-EXCLUSIVE EASEMENT COVERING A PORTION OF STATE SUBMERGED LANDS AT WAIKIKI, HONOLULU, OAHU, FOR CONCRETE STAIRS, AND FOR USE, REPAIR, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE IMPROVEMENTS CONSTRUCTED THEREON," was adopted, with Representatives Iwamoto and Souza voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Amato, Belatti, Cochran, Garrett, Ichiyama, Perruso, and Quinlan being excused.

Representative Iwamoto rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I rise in opposition. This is issuance of an easement, which again, it has to do with personal property and offering an easement of submerged public lands. In this case, the structure that the revetment is fronting used to be a landscaping wall many, many years, decades ago, but over time it's now become constructively a seawall just because of sea level rise.

"So, to me, this is exactly one of the issues that the law in 2020 was meant to address. Here we have sea level rise now taking a public beach away from the public. So, in this case, I would oppose this because it is specifically about a revetment where there was sand or should be sand and now it is basically a taking of public lands from the people. Thank you."

Representative Souza rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 7, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A TWENTY-FIVE YEAR TERM, NON-EXCLUSIVE EASEMENT COVERING A PORTION OF STATE SUBMERGED LANDS AT LAIE, KOOLAULOA, OAHU, FOR A ROCK REVETMENT THAT INCLUDES STAIRS, AND FOR USE, REPAIR, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE IMPROVEMENTS CONSTRUCTED THEREON," was adopted, with Representative Souza voting aye with reservations, with Representative Iwamoto voting no, and with Representatives Amato, Belatti, Cochran, Garrett, Ichiyama, Perruso, and Quinlan being excused.

Representative Yamashita, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2138) recommending that S.C.R. No. 6 be adopted.

Representative Todd moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 6 be adopted, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Iwamoto rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I rise in opposition. So, this one authorizes the issuance of a 25-year term non-exclusive easement covering a portion of state submerged lands at 'Ewa Beach, 'Ewa, O'ahu for a seawall. So, this is specifically being prohibited by the statute l referenced. And for that reason, I rise in opposition." Representative Souza rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 6, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A TWENTY-FIVE-YEAR TERM, NON-EXCLUSIVE EASEMENT COVERING A PORTION OF STATE SUBMERGED LANDS AT EWA BEACH, EWA, OAHU, FOR A SEAWALL, AND FOR USE, REPAIR, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE IMPROVEMENTS CONSTRUCTED THEREON," was adopted, with Representative Souza voting aye with reservations, with Representative Iwamoto voting no, and with Representatives Amato, Belatti, Cochran, Garrett, Ichiyama, Perruso, and Quinlan being excused.

Representative Matayoshi, for the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2139) recommending that S.C.R. No. 136, SD 1, HD 1, as amended in HD 2, be adopted.

Representative Todd moved that S.C.R. No. 136, SD 1, HD 2 be adopted, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Iwamoto rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I rise in opposition. Here this resolution requests the Hawai'i State Energy Office to convene a nuclear energy working group to study the feasibility of using advanced nuclear power technologies in this state. According to the committee report, the committee received testimony in opposition to this measure from the Environmental Caucus of The Democratic Party of Hawaii, Maui Peace Action, Malu 'Aina Center for Non-violent Education & Action, 350Hawaii, Energy Justice Network, Greenpeace Hawaii, Hawaii Chapter of Americans for Democratic Action, Kauai Women's Caucus, Kulia I Ka Nu'u Outreach and Aloha Lokahi Association, and from 42 individuals. Many of them were concerned that this used to be a task force to look into geothermal as an option and in the committee amendments that occurred right before the last committee, it turned into nuclear power that's going to be studied.

"The report also cites the Hawai'i State Energy Office as offering comments. But if I may just share a few of the excerpts from their testimony. And so, this is HSEO, the Hawai'i State Energy Office, 'notes that Article XI, section 8 of the Hawai'i State Constitution states, "No nuclear fission power plant shall be constructed or radioactive material disposed of in the State without the prior approval by a two-thirds vote in each house of the legislature." Therefore, a working group would need to have compelling evidence that nuclear power generation technologies met technical readiness criteria, delivered energy that was cost-competitive to what it was replacing, and could deliver and manage energy production in a safe and reliable manner.'

"Small modular reactors, or SMRs, 'are not likely well suited for Hawai'i due to a variety of reasons.' And 'in terms of technical readiness, the Nuclear Energy Agency reported no operational SMRs deployed in the U.S. as of 2024. Currently, there are only three SMRs operational worldwide, in China, Russia, and Japan. The development of light water-cooled SMRs undergoes licensing review by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), and planned SMRs in the U.S. are in the pre-licensing phase, with none expected for deployment until 2030 at the earliest for prices that have yet to be determined.

"Given the current lack of cost, production, safety, and nuclear waste management information on SMRs, the Hawai'i State Energy Office has no expectation that SMRs will be commercially available at cost-competitive prices for another decade and therefore believes the formation of a nuclear energy working group is premature...Furthermore, Governor Green's direction to HSEO has been to "conduct a full-scale analysis of every possible energy source, except nuclear, that can accelerate Hawai'i's transition away from fossil fuel dependence."

"So, in conclusion, 'HSEO requests that the creation of a nuclear working group be set aside until commercial SMR units have been installed successfully elsewhere in the United States, installation and operational costs are available, and waste management systems and processes have been deployed and proven to be safe, reliable, and cost-effective. At such time, it would be more appropriate to expend time and resources to evaluate the potential and applicability of nuclear energy for power generation in Hawai'i.' For these reasons, I stand in opposition."

Representative Tarnas rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you. Just note my reservations and I would like to cite the concerns of the State Energy Office. Thank you."

Representative Poepoe rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Kapela rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Grandinetti rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Lowen rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. In support. I actually appreciate the testimony being read aloud because I don't really disagree with a lot of what's in there. But this issue has come up, this is the third year in a row. There's an interest from many legislators in looking at whether it's an option for Hawai'i. And I think that it's important sometimes to settle these questions so that we can move forward and focus our efforts where they make sense to focus them. And so, I think that there is a good reason for moving this forward. And it is a very sort of short-term working group just to sort of get a definitive answer on this question for now and settle some things so that we can focus on moving forward on developing resources that are viable in the state. Thanks."

Representative Muraoka rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Souza rose in opposition to the measure and asked that the remarks of the representative from Kaka'ako be entered into the Journal as her own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Reyes Oda rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Alcos rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Hussey rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"With reservations. Thank you, Madam Speaker. I'd like the record to reflect that there were efforts, I believe in the 1970s, to construct a nuclear power plant here, I believe in He'eia, and the community actually successfully fought back against those plans. Thank you very much."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and S.C.R. No. 136, SD 1, HD 2, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE HAWAII STATE ENERGY OFFICE TO CONVENE A NUCLEAR ENERGY WORKING GROUP TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF USING ADVANCED NUCLEAR POWER TECHNOLOGIES IN THE STATE," was adopted, with Representatives Alcos, Hussey, Reyes Oda, and Tarnas voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Grandinetti, Iwamoto, Kapela, Muraoka, Poepoe, and Souza voting no, and with Representatives Amato, Belatti, Cochran, Garrett, Ichiyama, Perruso, and Quinlan being excused.

SUSPENSION OF RULES

At this time, the Chair stated:

"Members, please turn to your digital action sheets by clicking on the action sheet tab on the top middle of your screen. We will be taking up two motions. One, to suspend the rules to reconsider our previous action in disagreeing to the Senate amendments. And one, to reconsider our previous action and give notice of the intent to agree."

At 12:04 p.m., Representative Todd requested a recess, and the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:06 p.m.

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of reconsidering action previously taken in disagreeing to amendments made by the Senate to certain House Bills. (Representatives Amato, Belatti, Cochran, Garrett, Ichiyama, Perruso, Quinlan, and Woodson were excused.)

RECONSIDERATION OF ACTION TAKEN

Representative Todd moved that the House reconsider its action previously taken in disagreeing to the amendments made by the Senate, and give notice of intent to agree to such amendments for the following House Bills, seconded by Representative Morikawa:
