Senator Solomon rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, there was an editorial that appeared in the Advertiser this Sunday in reference to a bill that I had passed out of your Higher Education Committee pertaining to establishing a Hawaii State University which would have given autonomy to UH-Hilo and West Oahu College. In the editorial it says, '... Still, the Senate Higher Education Committee has passed out a bill to separate UH-Hilo and make it a state university with its own board of regents. Not surprisingly, the bill's author

and chairman of the committee is a senator from the Big Island, Malama Solomon. A House bill has not gone even that far."

"Mr. President, I'd like to say that I'm very proud to be the author of that piece of legislation and I would like to remind the editorial staff of the Advertiser that that is the purpose of a legislator ... to be creative and be able to provide a new direction for the State of Hawaii.

"Another thing, Mr. President, I'd like to bring to your attention is that in your committee's review of the Higher Education budget it has come to our attention that the undergraduate budget at Manoa has eroded away tremendously. Many courses, Mr. President, have not been funded adequately and it's quite obvious that the Manoa campus is moving more towards graduate, postgraduate and research.

"Therefore, Mr. President, I would like to inform my colleagues that the reason I did pass the bill out of committee was to be able to keep the legislation alive so that we have more time to discuss and to look at other alternatives so that we can improve the educational experience for the undergraduates. And may I remind the Advertiser editorial staff that the governor himself has set the momentum; that this is the year of the undergraduate.

"Thank you very much."

Senator Holt then rose to comment on the previous speaker's remarks and said:

"I would like to follow up on the point made earlier that not only does the editorial staff comment on laws before they are passed, they also conduct polls, like the one they are going to do on the convention center tonight, after the act is signed into law. Thank you."
