

THIRTY-NINTH DAY**Wednesday, March 27, 1991**

The Senate of the Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1991, convened at 11:35 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Eijo Ikenaga, Honolulu Myohoji Mission, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Aki, Cobb, Holt, Nakasato and Solomon who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Eighth Day.

Senator McCartney introduced to the members of the Senate Mark Tai Atuaia of Kahuku High School, who was seated on the floor of the Senate, as follows:

"Mr. President, it gives me great honor and pleasure to introduce an outstanding student-athlete in the State of Hawaii who is with us today with his parents -- Mark Tai Atuaia.

"As you all know, Mark is an outstanding athlete from Kahuku High School who has set many statewide rushing records in football and I would like to share some of those with you.

"Mark has broken the Kahuku High School rushing record; he has set the State of Hawaii single game rushing record of 350 yards in a game; the State of Hawaii single season rushing record of 2,015 yards; and the State of Hawaii career rushing record of 3,415 yards.

"As you know, Mr. President, our educational system is very important to us and we all know that athletics is an important ingredient in our educational system. Today, it is truly a pleasure to introduce Mark Atuaia, a scholar-athlete who has achieved so much for the State of Hawaii and for Kahuku High School and who is going to go on to play and study at Brigham Young University (BYU).

"By the way, I have assured Mark that when he comes to play at Aloha Stadium with the BYU team I will not be one of those people booing him on the field but will be cheering him on.

"At this time, I would like to introduce Mark Tai Atuaia and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fatu Atuaia."

The honoree and his parents rose to be recognized. Mark was presented the congratulatory Senate certificate by Senator McCartney and a lei by Senator Ikeda. Senators Hagino and George presented leis to Mr. and Mrs. Atuaia.

At 11:43 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:45 o'clock a.m.
