The Senate of the Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1991, convened at 11:43 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Daiva dasa, Hare Krishna Temple, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Sixty-Second Day.

Senator Crozier then introduced to the members of the Senate Mr. Chris Zivalich and Mr. Calvin Ching as follows:

"Mr. President, today, there are two gentlemen in the gallery who just received awards from the Hawaii Chapter of the American Society for Public Administrators.

"The first is my aide Chris Zivalich who received the 1991 Public Academia Award. Many of you know Chris from being around the Democratic Party or working here in the halls. He also was the director of the Central Michigan University Extension Program and was responsible for bringing the public administration masters program to the Central Michigan University system here in Hawaii. Many people within the state government have earned their degrees through the Central Michigan extension program, and hopefully Hawaii is a better place through his efforts.

"Calvin Ching is the recipient of the 1991 Public Administration Award. Some of our colleagues who served in the ConCon remember Calvin. He is court administrator of the Records and Information Management Division of the District Court. He was recognized for his outstanding contributions to the state Judiciary and for his innovative leadership in the field of records and information management."

Mr. Zivalich and Mr. Ching rose to be recognized.

At this time, Senator Nakasato, on behalf of Senators Koki, McCartney and himself, introduced Mr. Koichi Takakura of Okinawa who was seated in the gallery. Senator Nakasato said, "Mr. Takakura was introduced to the Senate five years ago and it was at that time that he started the construction of his dream project, a huge golf course in Okinawa that cost him over \$400 million with a \$70 million club house on three-and-a-half acres."

Senator McCartney then rose to speak on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, I'd like to set the record straight again regarding the University of Hawaii on-campus arena issue. In this morning's sports page of the Advertiser the headline reads, 'Wallace "embarrassed" by 4,000-seat arena.'

"I want to read a few quotes that he made. He said the 'expansion may never occur. "Four thousand seats isn't enough for anybody," Wallace said. I said all along they would go with 4,000 seats. I'll not be around when they have 10,000 seats. I'll be too old.... They should have given the money to Windward Community College.... Anything less than 10,000 is an embarrassment.'

"He also said in another column that 'What we're talking about is just another Bloch Arena with a shiny roof.' He was fairly fumed and he said this is a 'glorified high school arena.'

"Also, in the Star-Bulletin this afternoon, he said that if we're going to build a 4,000-seat arena, don't bother. Instead of wasting the money on a small arena we should give it to Windward Community College.

"Mr. President, I just want to state for the record, I'm a Senator who's not embarrassed by what our Conference Committee has done. I'm proud of what they did, and I don't think it's an embarrassment. I think we took a very tough stand. We took care of education first. We took care of our priorities. We took care of Maui Community College. We took care of Windward Community College, the College of Education, the Hawaiian Studies building. I am very proud of what the conferees have done.

"I think his remarks are inaccurate, premature and uncalled for. I don't know where in the proviso language or any language in the budget where it specifies 4,000 seats. So he is totally inaccurate and wrong about that. I think what the conferees did was to try and find common ground on this issue, to find a win-win situation where we could take care of educational needs and still keep the arena alive. That is why the \$32 million is in place. We want to keep the arena alive. Nobody is killing the arena.

"He talks about a roof, a shiny roof. The roof was Stan Sheriff's idea to save millions of dollars. And if we go to this new design put up by the Tempcor Corporation, with an aluminum dome, we're going to save millions of

dollars, so we can put in more seats. So it's not a shiny roof and a glorified high school arena.

"Mr. President, I commend your conferees for taking a tough stand in supporting education and finding a win-win situation that would also keep the arena alive and to keep the issue going. They did an excellent job and they should be commended.

"The remarks by the basketball coach, in my mind, are way out of line and inaccurate, and nobody is talking about 4,000 seats. I just want to set that record straight.

"Thank you."

Senator Solomon also rose to speak on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, speaking on a point of personal privilege, in support of the previous speaker.

"Mr. President, I would like to remind the basketball coach that he should pay more attention to his win-lose record. Perhaps, that is what he should be embarrassed about.

"Thank you very much."

At 12:40 o'clock p.m., on motion by Senator Solomon, seconded by Senator Reed and carried, the Senate stood in recess until 4:00 o'clock p.m.
