Friday, January 29, 1993

The Senate of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1993, convened at 11:37 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Sister Hannah Mary Carter, Daughters of St. Paul, Catholic Diocese, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Seventh Day.

ORDER OF THE DAY

THIRD READING

H.B. No. 1, H.D. 1:

Senator A. Kobayashi moved that H.B. No. 1, H.D. 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Senator B. Kobayashi.

Senator Hagino rose to speak in support of the bill and said:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak in favor of the bill.

"First of all, I would like to commend the chair of the Ways and Means Committee for her part in assuring a very sound budget on the part of the Senate. In previous years, when I served as chair of the Legislative Management Committee, the easiest thing was to go along with the House and I apologize for that effort. I say it because I know it is not easy to hold a zero line budget when another House is saying that it needs the money for staff, so, I would really like to commend the chair of Ways and Means for her part in the budget.

"Mr. President, I support the bill with the assurance that we will seek additional savings, if possible, and the result in savings will lapse into the general fund to meet other public and urgent statewide program needs. During our legislative hearings, the legislative agencies came to us and stated that they are holding a zero line budget. They are not seeking any increases in their budgets so I, again, commend the chair of Ways and Means for also doing it for the Senate.

"In previous years, we have returned hundreds of thousands of dollars back and, I understand, in the last fiscal year that just ended, we have returned over \$335,000.00. I am hoping that we will continue this frugality and also look for other means to save our money. In this respect, Mr. President, I will be supporting the bill."

Senator Blair also rose to speak in support of the measure as follows:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak in support of the passage of the bill but only out of necessity. The staff has been hired and must be paid, if we are to discharge our constitutional responsibility. The sixty-day clock is running and, in fact, almost 15 percent of the session is over. As the session progresses, however, we will be reminded of this bill when we increase the tax burden on our citizens while reducing the services that we provide to them. We will probably be called hypocrites for asking others to make sacrifices after isolating ourselves from inconveniences. And hypocrites we are, for we begin this session with generosity towards ourselves. Admittedly,

more generosity towards the House than towards the Senate.

"Although our zero growth budget on the Senate side looks good in relative terms, we can do so painlessly because we've run a surplus in previous years. We are really not engaging in any sacrifice, even on the Senate side, and I concur with the previous speaker that we should lapse funds as we lapsed the \$335,000.00 in Act 1 of 1991.

"And while I don't wish to appear to be too selfrighteous with respect to the House budget, after a dozen years in the House and six in the Senate, I believe that the House is even more in need of fiscal restraint than we are. It defies my sense of logic to say that the House needs to spend so much more than the Senate. Each half of the bicameral legislature represents the same number of constituents; each half works on the same issues; each legislative product moves through both houses. The only logical difference that I can see between the appropriate funding of the House and of the Senate is the additional salary for 26 members of the House. In terms of staffing, there should be parity between the House and Senate. An analogy would be an assembly line for cars. They're one half of the assembly line; we're the other half. They need the same number of staff, it would seem to me, that we do, since the same number of cars are going to go all the way through the system.

"Sadly, however, our historical response to the House's profligacy has been to seek parity which, in fact, has only compounded the problem and given us the surpluses which we rollover or give back depending on circumstances.

"I am thankful that this year we have taken the first step by not asking for parity. I think that's wonderful. Hopefully, we will take a second step, which is to establish accountability. We can do so by opening our books to public scrutiny and demanding that the House do the same, because sunlight is a wonderful disinfectant for what ails this body and the House.

"I will be voting 'yes' with reluctance, Mr. President. In doing so, I ask you and Senator Bert Kobayashi, the chair of the Legislative Management Committee, to commit yourselves to producing and publishing a monthly report of spending. Parenthetically, I believe the House has been doing that for years. The report should be adequately detailed so as to be truly informative and not merely summary. For example, it should allow office-byoffice comparisons. The underlying documentation, the invoices, the cancelled checks must also be freely available. I think once the sunlight falls on the situation, corrective action is inevitable. If you do that, Mr. President, you will have my gratitude. Thank you."

Senator Fukunaga also spoke in support of the measure and said:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak in support of this measure.

"As one of the newest members who have come to the Senate from the House, I feel that I must rise to speak somewhat in defense of the House and also to commend the Senate for the position it has taken on maintaining a zero percent growth budget. I hope that the House's recent adoption of the administrative and financial manual, which was contained and attached to House Resolution 6, will serve as some assurance to the Senate that the House is ready to adopt prudent fiscal

management and that combined with the sound prudent fiscal policies adopted by the Senate that both houses will be able to go forward with a very solid financial plan for the biennium before us.

"Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator A. Kobayashi added her support of the measure and said:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak in favor of the bill. I would like to thank the Senator from Wahiawa-Waialua for his remarks and would like to thank all my colleagues who gave advice and moral support while we were negotiating with the House. I would like to assure the Senator from Maui that we will try to achieve parity. We are in discussion and will be certainly working on better guidelines, better accountability, parity for all the staff, all of whom are hardworking and put in a lot of overtime, and the words 'overtime pay' is missing from this building. No one ever gets overtime pay -- none of us. The least we can do is pay everyone in a timely fashion and that's why I urge a quick and positive response to this bill. Thank you."

The Chair then said:

"Members of the Senate, the one day delay was worthwhile. We did talk to members of the House leadership. For the Senators who did raise questions about the legislative budget, we do intend to pursue your concerns. The House has indicated that they are willing to meet with their leadership to discuss our concerns so that we can achieve some kind of accountability in both the House and the Senate."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, H.B. No. 1, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE, THE LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR, THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU, AND THE OMBUDSMAN," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:
