

## THIRTY-FOURTH DAY

**Tuesday, March 23, 1993**

The Senate of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1993, convened at 11:35 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Patria Agustin, Aldersgate United Methodist Church, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Gaulty, Holt, McCartney, Mizuguchi and Nakasato who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Third Day.

The following introductions were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Fukunaga presented and introduced a delegation of veterans from the 442nd Regimental Combat Team on the celebration of its 50th anniversary, as follows:

"Mr. President, it is a rare privilege this morning to introduce to this distinguished body our guests who represent the 442nd Regimental Combat Team and its veterans, their regional chapters, and 'sons and daughters' affiliates. Senator Matsunaga and I are honored to be among their sons and daughters, as well as their beneficiaries.

"Today marks the beginning of the 442nd Regimental Combat Teams's 50th Golden Anniversary Reunion, between March 24th and March 28th, a memory-packed five days in which we can reflect upon the enormous impact that their wartime exploits have had upon the State of Hawaii, on each of us, and upon the rest of our country.

"The story of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team is a stirring saga of Nisei soldiers who rose above the pain of discrimination from their own people and government to prove their loyalty on the battlefields and to gain the respect and acceptance of the American people.

"They put that same courage to work in building the Hawaii of the 20th century. Their fervent dedication to equality and justice have helped propel Japanese Americans, Chinese Americans and native Hawaiians into positions of national influence -- and the truth is that most of us here in the Seventeenth Legislature would not have the opportunity to represent the people of the State of Hawaii if not for them.

"On this occasion, we can thank them and honor their legacy by rededicating ourselves to the struggle to improve Hawaii -- to deal with today's issues over Hawaiian sovereignty, treatment of new immigrants, balancing between educational reforms or long-term health care -- all in the spirit of 'go for broke.'

"At this time, I'd like to present some of our 442nd Regimental Combat Team guests. Seated on the floor are: Mr. Henry Kuniyuki, the vice president and president-elect of the 442nd Veterans Club; Mr. George Nakasato, chairman of the 50th Anniversary Reunion Committee, and a long-time aide to Senator Matsuura; Mr. Paul Takeguchi, vice president of the 442nd Veterans Club; Mr. Sam Hironaka, treasurer; and Mr. Harold Fukunaga, immediate past president and my father.

"I would now like to defer to Senator Matt Matsunaga to introduce the rest of our guests."

The gentlemen stood to be recognized. Mr. Kuniyuki was presented the congratulatory Senate certificate by Senator Matsunaga. Senators A. Kobayashi, Solomon, Fernandes Salling, Ikeda and Fukunaga presented the leis.

Senator Matsunaga then introduced the following persons and stated:

"Mr. President, it is indeed an honor and privilege for me to introduce the following individuals: Mr. Shiro Kashino from the Seattle Nisei Vets; Mr. Ray Nosaka, president of the 100th Battalion (Club 100); Mr. Guy Koga, president of the Sons and Daughters of the 442nd; Mr. Leonard Oka, the founder of the Maui Sons and Daughters organization; Mrs. Debra McQuilken, founder of the Seattle Sansei Vets; and Mrs. Janice Sakoda, member of the Sons and Daughters of the 100th; Mr. Cary Miyashiro of the Legacy Foundation; Mr. Arnold Hiura, 442nd media coordinator; and, finally, the wife of Mr. Shiro Kashino, Mrs. Louise Kashino."

The ladies and gentlemen, present in the gallery, rose to be recognized.

Senator Matsuura then added:

"Mr. President, today brings back some sad memories. I'm one of the older members of the Senate and I remember the war years. I know George has been working on this anniversary for a long, long time. But I want to share with you my personal loss of a friend who volunteered for the 442nd (Infantry) Regiment.

"Our neighbor, the Kameda family, had a whole bunch of boys, and one of them, Yoshito, who was about 12 years older than I, was like an older brother to me. Yoshito took me fishing and we were very close. When this friend of mine Yoshito got inducted into the Army, I was at the elementary school. After being inducted at the fire station in Haleiwa, the Army truck stopped right in front of the elementary school. I ran out of the class looking for my friend. After finding my friend, he gave me his only paper lei and told me to be a good boy.

"On June 26, 1944, Yoshito was killed in action; he was only 21 years of age. Today brings back some sad memories for me, but I want to congratulate all of you. It was a job well done. Thank you."

Senator Solomon also rose to state:

"Mr. President, also in the spirit of this wonderful day in honoring the veterans of the 442 Regimental Combat Team that are with us today, I would like to mention that my administrative assistant and aide, who does everything for me in my office, Dr. Ryoji Namba, is also a veteran of the 442nd.

"I want to inform all of my colleagues that I'm very, very proud of 'Doc' and happy that he has been with me for eight years. He is also present in the gallery. Mahalo!"

Dr. Namba also stood to be recognized.

Senator B. Kobayashi then introduced a group of Boy Scouts from Troop 216 of Kaneohe, seated in the gallery: Travis Hong, Cory Ida, Gregory Ida and Gavin Ida, accompanied by Scout Leader Glenn Ida Jr. and Mrs. Phyllis Ida.

At this time, the Chair remarked:

"Members of the Senate, the Chair is very proud to have been a member of the 442nd Infantry -- Company I in Waianae. I served for a period of 10 years and those were very, very memorable years for me."

At 11:49 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:55 o'clock a.m.
