Friday, April 21, 1995

The Senate of the Eighteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1995, convened at 11:34 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend James Parker, First Baptist Church of Wahiawa, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Fernandes Salling, Grauly, McCartney and Tanaka who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fifty-Third Day.
