At 11:41 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:47 o'clock a.m.

At this time, Senator Holt introduced and welcomed the leaders of the following Native American Indian tribes: the Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin, the Mashantucket Pequot Nation of Connecticut, the St. Croix Chippewa Nation of Wisconsin, the Narraganset Nation of Rhode Island, and the Nunamiut Eskimos of Akaktuvuk, Alaska. All of the guests were presented Senate certificates and leis by various Senators.

At 11:51 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:56 o'clock a.m.

Senator Anderson rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege.

"Mr. President, it's unusual but I have written some comments that I would like to incorporate into the Journal. As you know I normally don't do that, but I would like to make a few comments and primarily the written comments because I didn't want to forget anything. I normally don't write everything down when I speak.

"Mr. President, I have listened, watched and read what all of you had to say about how we are going to move toward economic security. There is not one of us here today who has served at least four years in government service that can blame one or the other for the condition that our State is in today. We are all to blame.

"Mr. President, we have to help the State move forward not only by decreasing government but to take the lead, and I mean the Senate, in getting jobs for our people. I have heard that the ball is in the House of Representatives' court as far as gambling. This is not true. There is only one bill, Mr. President, and that is for shipboard gambling that is in that court. This particular bill has given us a fair idea of the many jobs that could be generated both on land and sea. It gives us an idea of how it would be beneficial to our tourist industry and a segment of our community. But we have to have serious hearings on horse racing for the Big Island and how that could create a whole new industry. I believe that it would not only provide jobs at a race track but it would (because of the available lands) create new jobs for people who would breed animals on the Big Island. This also means the building of homes; stables and such. It would help create a better situation for our diversified agriculture, in the area of feed and other commodities that could be used. This would also help the people who are used to working on the plantations and the economy could be stimulated in many other ways with proper public hearings.

"The lottery, Mr. President, has been on-going for many years, but I believe poorly studied and very poor public hearings held that would provide those that are pro or con on whether it will really provide the jobs and provide the dollars that would help our economy. We haven't given proper hearings for the lottery like putting it in the evenings so we can go out, not the House of Representatives, but us -- the Senators. They look to us to lead, and if we're not going to lead, then we're going to become followers. But we have to go out into the community and find out if in reality there are going to be jobs. Is it going to give us the dollars that will help our economy? We have to look at all of these things, Mr. President.

"We have been working on improving trade in the Pacific, but, Mr. President, Washington -- the people in Congress -- are not only interested in the Pacific as we are, they are also looking at amending antiquated types of legislation that could help Hawaii. They are looking at the possibility of repealing all or part of the Jones Act. I personally believe that the Jones Act has prevented us from competitive freight rates. And I also believe that we have lost the initiative to be competitive. We have to move, Mr. President, and not wait to see if Congress is going to repeal all or part of this Act. We have to move to upgrade our harbors that generate \$27 million a year and that is now. If shipping is improved it will not only bring costs down for businesses but it will help the consumer in the area of purchasing of goods, which will also, Mr. President, as I have mentioned in other bills, help our diversified agriculture industry. Last, but very important, it will provide more jobs for our people who have worked, and are now working, and those who would like to work in the harbors.

"Mr. President, with these things that I have mentioned, we will move our economy in the area of tourism, construction, diversified agriculture, new entrepreneurs, and harbors, but more importantly, it would help the overall economy because there will be new dollars that will be flowing through the system which will move our State forward.

"So I ask you, with all the other bills that we have, consider these things because the people of our State are looking to us to lead, and not to follow. Thank you very much, Mr. President."

Senator Holt also rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, I'd like to rise on a point of personal privilege.

"Mr. President, I have distributed to all the members a couple of newspaper articles and a sheet on the chronology of events relating to H.B. No. 1927, H.D. 1, S.D. 1. I would just like to state for the record to clarify what happened last session, but more so to alert the committee chairmen who receive bills from the House that they amend and the House passes out without going to conference and without amending it, that this is what might happen to you as has happened to me in an article written by Richard Borreca. He states that the bill that we passed, which amended a House bill, provides the Business Registration Division of DCCA the authorization to set a commercial value on some information that is being used for commercial purposes in the private sector.

"We amended the bill in committee and I have it all here in this chronology. The question was asked of the Division Director. He provided us with a memo from the Attorney General. In that memo from the Attorney General was a draft of legislation that they felt was necessary for authorization. It was discussed in that hearing. We had open public decision-making in that hearing. The bill was then passed out of committee on a roll call vote. It came down to the Senate where we passed it out of here and over to the House. And as you see on the second page of the chronology of events, the House disagreed with the Senate amendments. They appointed conferees on this particular bill, and they have the names of the conferees. So apparently the House did know that there was an amendment made by the Senate. However, come May 1, 1995, they reconsidered their action on the disagreement and moved to agree to the Senate amendments and all 51 members of the House voted for the bill.

"In essence, Mr. President, the article that was written this past Monday accuses me of pushing bills through without public hearings and not allowing people to testify. I think, Mr. President, there are a lot of bills in this process that we pass from one house to the other where the other body does not amend the amended bill that comes back, and it is moved out in agreement. Those have not brought anywhere near the attention that this particular bill does. And I just hope, for clarification purposes, that this body understands what happened, despite the article, and that all chairmen recognize that the process which we go by in this body is that if something illegal was done, it should be taken to the right authorities. But in this particular case what we did was perfectly legal. It was not done in a rush. The bill sat in the House for many, many days. And I don't think it's deserving of the kind of comments that we received publicly.
