#### SIXTH DAY

### Friday, January 29, 2016

The Senate of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2016, convened at 11:38 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Thielen who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fifth Day.

At this time, Senator Baker introduced Representative Tina Liebling, member of the Minnesota House of Representatives, who was accompanied in the gallery by Hawai'i State Representative Della Au Bellati.

Senator Gabbard welcomed Doug and Sandy Sexton of Summerfield, North Carolina, who were seated in the gallery.

Senator Dela Cruz recognized the All Blacks Legends, and presented the following remarks:

"Thank you, Mr. President. Today, we welcome former members of the New Zealand national men's rugby union team, as they are more well-known as the All Blacks Legends. These legends are part of New Zealand's renowned rugby history, as the All Blacks are the most winningest team in the history of any sport with a winning percentage of 76 percent, and the only national rugby team to have won the Rugby World Cup on three occasions.

"The Legends are in Hawai'i again to advocate for the sport of rugby through Rugby for Good at different school complexes. Rugby has become increasingly popular both nationally and internationally, and is now being used as a tool to attract youth to participate in a program that focuses on teaching self-discipline, character development, and garnering leadership.

"If we look at our statistics, Native Hawaiian and Polynesian inmate populations are disproportionately high relative to the population in Hawaii. In 2008, 39 percent of Hawaii's prison population were identified as being Native Hawaiian and, additionally, 7 percent were Pacific Islanders. The cost to house inmates compared to funding for a student is \$40,000 to \$10,000. Also, while Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders students make up 35 percent of DOE's student body, this population makes up nearly 57 percent of all student suspensions. By targeting this demographic at a younger age, the state can combat this trend by providing an out-of-school program that supports personal and educational growth.

"With the help and support of Superintendent Kathryn Matayoshi, she's identified three complexes where we've begun pilot projects for middle school after-school programs focusing on rugby. The three complexes are Castle-Kahuku, Ka'ū-Kea'au-Pāhoa, and Nānākuli-Wai'anae. The Downtown Athletic Club helped fund the pilot project.

"The Legends will be wrapping up their annual visit with a tournament tomorrow at King Intermediate, in our colleague from Windward Oʻahu's district, and hopes to widen the popularity of rugby in Hawai'i so students from K through 12 will embrace the sport. We will continue this effort by partnering with Play Rugby USA, Rugby for Good Hawai'i, and the New Zealand Consulate General.

"Now please join me in recognizing: All Blacks Legends Frano Botica, Frank Bunce, Walter Little, and Charles Riechelmann; Jake Hamstra from the New Zealand Consulate General; Dallen Stanford with Play Rugby USA; and Brandon

Ahlo and Kaipo Sarkissian from Rugby for Good Hawai'i. Let's welcome them to the Hawai'i State Senate."

At 11:43 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
