#### TWELFTH DAY

## Tuesday, February 5, 2019

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 11:37 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Kidani who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Eleventh Day.

The students were seated in the gallery with faculty Dr. Regina Ostergaard-Klem and Dr. Adam Burke.

Senator Kanuha recognized Kanoe Cup Choy, Colin Kippen, and other staff of the Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement, who were seated in the gallery.

Senator English recognized Office of Hawaiian Affairs trustee Kalei<sup>4</sup>āina Lee, who was present in the gallery.

Senator Shimabukuro acknowledged her constituents Momi and DeMont Conner, who were seated in the gallery.

Senator Thielen introduced Scotty Reis-Moniz, a constituent and volunteer extraordinaire.

Senator Inouye welcomed Sandi Weir and a special group of guests from Alaska Cruise Lines, who were seated in the gallery with Charlie Toguchi.

Senator Rhoads acknowledged Marsha Joyner, who was present in the gallery.

Senator Kahele recognized Joseph Kūhiō Lewis, and presented the following remarks:

"Colleagues, as we celebrate Hawaiian Caucus Week here at the Legislature, it's my honor this morning to introduce our second honoree for Hawaiian Caucus Week as we, today, celebrate outstanding mākua, or parents, in our Native Hawaiian community. The individual I'm going to introduce you to is, without question, a leader in his community. He is a dedicated champion of Native Hawaiian issues, and he's someone who embodies ha'aha'a—humility—and honesty, diligence, and someone who leads by example for his children, and so I'm proud to introduce to you today's honoree, Mr. Joseph Kūhiō Lewis; could you please stand?

"Colleagues, Kūhiō is a proud product of Hawai'i's public education system—a graduate of McKinley High School; he is a graduate of Honolulu Community College and the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa. He has since then served as the president of the Kapolei Community Development Corporation, then as a community outreach and engagement manager. Also, he has served at the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. He is a member of the Hawaiian Civic Clubs; he's also a member of the Native Hawaiian Health Care Systems and, presently, is the chief executive officer of the Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement.

"What I admire the most about Kūhiō is his love and his dedication and his strong values for his children and how he leaves a lasting impression on them as a father and a parent. Kūhiō is a single father: He raises his son, Bryson Makanaokalani, and daughter, Breana Kawaiola, and he embodies in them what it means to be a Native Hawaiian, and the important culture and rich and diverse history and the vibrancy of everything that it means to be Hawai'i. Kūhiō is a skilled listener; he's someone who has various different perspectives. He is someone who tries to find common ground in very difficult issues, and he brings an insightful approach to the challenges that we face in Hawai'i today.

"And so I'd like to, again, introduce to you and ask for a round of applause for who I would consider a very distinguished leader in the State of Hawai'i: Mr. Joseph Kūhiō Lewis. Could we also get his children, Breana and Bryson, to stand? And I would also like to recognize, colleagues, his father, Dickie, who is in the gallery, if his father, Dickie, could please stand. Mahalo, Dickie."

At 11:45 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
