Wednesday, February 6, 2019

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 11:36 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twelfth Day.

Senator Riviere recognized Danielle Ululani Beirne, and presented the following remarks:

"Members, guests in the gallery, and esteemed guests who are here with us today: Today is the third day of Hawaiian Caucus Week. We're honoring our outstanding kūpuna who've made impactful contributions to our community, and today I'm proud to introduce to you somebody I've known for several years now, a great leader in the Ko'olauloa moku: Danielle Ululani Beirne—we know her as Aunty Ulu. She's a lifelong resident of the district and a great advocate for the community of Kahana. Welcome today, Aunty Ulu.

"So, for over 20 years, she was a Native Hawaiian affairs consultant to Outrigger Hotels. Aunty Ulu was also a member of the State House of Representatives; she served in the Seventeenth Legislature in 1993 and '94. And over the past four decades, Ulu has been involved in many organizations, including the Coalition of Hawaiian Organizations and Hui Na'auao. In 1995, she was appointed by Governor John Waihe'e to the Hawaii Sovereignty Elections Council as a councilmember. She also served as a delegate on 'Aha 'Ōiwi Native Hawaiian Convention in the 1990s, and also on Na'i Aupuni: Native Hawaiian Governance Convention in 2016. I'll just say on the side: She stays very active and is one of the cultural interpreters in the Ahupua'a 'O Kahana State Park that we have. More recently, Aunty Ulu has been very active with the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs, and she is the president of the Ko'olauloa Hawaiian Civic Club and has been for the last 10 years. She's a dedicated community leader who consistently advocates for issues affecting kūpuna, Ko'olauloa, the North Shore, and all of Hawai'i. Colleagues, please join me in recognizing Aunty Ulu Beirne.

"With Aunty Ulu is Troy Thompson, Louis Wallace, and Kamalani Johnson today, and Kaiwi Johnson, too. Welcome the family. And in the gallery, we have Sherri Lynn Johnson and Kahiau Wallace; Keaka Aumua with her husband, Zed Aumua; Puanani Beirne is with us today, I believe, and Charles Kaai, and other members of the Hawaiian Civic Clubs, so please all be welcomed. Aloha. Thank you."

Senator Rhoads acknowledged Bixby Ho, a friend and constituent, who was seated in the gallery.

At 11:41 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

"Before proceeding, I'd like to thank President Emeritus Kim, who created what we're about to take action on, and she was so gracious to remind me that I had been negligent in conferring on our new members a special designation that she had created for all of the members when she was Senate President. So, at this time, the Senate would like to take a moment to make a special presentation to our newest members. Senators Fevella, Kanuha, Keohokalole, and Moriwaki, will you please join me at the rostrum? I'd also like to ask Senators Kidani, Kahele, English, and Kim to join us and assist me in making the presentation."

Senators Fevella, Kanuha, Keohokalole, Moriwaki, Kidani, Kahele, English, and Kim then approached the rostrum.

The Chair continued:

"In conjunction with our 55 years of Statehood anniversary in 2014, we presented a very special lapel pin to current and past members of the Senate. This pin is a symbol of a member's service in the Senate and to the people of the State of Hawai'i.

"Pursuant to Senate Rule 92, the Senate pin shall only be worn by current or past members to whom it is presented."

"Senators Fevella, Kanuha, Keohokalole, and Moriwaki, on behalf of the Senate, thank you for your service." At this time, Senator Kidani presented Senator Fevella with the Senate pin, Senator Kahele presented Senator Kanuha with the Senate pin, Senator English presented Senator Keohokalole with the Senate pin, and Senator Kim presented Senator Moriwaki with the Senate pin.
