

## FORTY-EIGHTH DAY

Thursday, April 11, 2019

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 11:40 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Chang who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Seventh Day.

At this time, Senator Dela Cruz recognized the Mililani Mauka Eagleteks Robotics Team, the 2019 State VEX IQ Robotics Challenge elementary school division winning team, who had also qualified for the World Championships and would be heading to Louisville, Kentucky. Senator Baker noted:

"I think this measure, as amended by the House, provides an important framework for regulating the practice of midwifery in our state. As many of you may know, this practice was regulated for many years, and when most folks were not using midwives any more (there were only two still left in the state back in the '70s), the regulation went away because the two midwives practicing were nurses, and they were regulated under the Board of Nursing. This measure provides the bones for our regulation. It requires DCCA to have rules promulgated, which will be through a public process. It does not prohibit healing practices by traditional Hawaiian healers engaged in prenatal, maternal, or child care as recognized by any council of kūpuna convened by the group designated in our constitution to do so. I believe that we are at a point in time where we need these regulations, and I ask my colleagues to agree with me to the good work of the House and move this measure forward. Mahalo."

"This is one of the budget bills that needs to go forward so that all of the budget matters can be considered appropriately and constitutionally by the governor. It is important that we move this measure forward; I ask my colleagues' support. Mahalo."

The motion was then put by the Chair and carried.
