Thursday, January 23, 2020

The Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2020, convened at 11:37 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Dela Cruz, Harimoto, and Kidani who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fourth Day.

On behalf of Senator Dela Cruz, Senator Nishihara congratulated and honored Sergeant Chris Kim of the Honolulu Police Department, and presented the following remarks:

"First, I'd like to have Sergeant Kim please rise. My colleagues and I offer our deepest condolences for the loss of your brother and sister in blue, Officers Enriquez and Kalama. But we will not forget their sacrifice.

"Now, more than ever, we must recognize the work of our heroes and protectors. I would like to recognize the 2019 national CrimeStoppers Coordinator of the Year, Sergeant Chris Kim, and his exceptional work. He has made history by being the first coordinator in CrimeStoppers Honolulu's 38-year history to receive this award—truly an important award.

"Sergeant Kim did not have an easy time. What he managed to do was to completely turn the Honolulu CrimeStoppers ship around. When he took over and took up the mantle of CrimeStoppers Honolulu coordinator, tips were declining rapidly. In response, Sergeant Kim implemented the P3 Tips application, allowing the public to anonymously submit tips with their smartphones. What happened next was a 200 percent increase in tips! This increase led to the arrest of 34 wanted individuals and 458 cases being closed.

"Not satisfied with this success, Sergeant Kim decided to expand the Student CrimeStoppers program across our islands. Presenting in schools throughout our island, Sergeant Kim tackled topics such as bullying, fighting, vaping, and social media safety. This work with our keiki resulted in a 400 percent increase in tips to the Student CrimeStoppers program.

"Sergeant Kim also utilized our state's media. They promoted media awareness for the Animal CrimeStoppers program to combat animal cruelty, and they have worked with the media to increase volunteer hours and personnel for the program. Six hundred fifty applicants were inspired by the TV story that aired. These volunteers resulted in a 120 percent increase in volunteer hours.

"It is unsurprising that Sergeant Kim was invited as a guest speaker to discuss Honolulu CrimeStoppers' huge success at this year's CrimeStoppers convention. So let us congratulate and thank HPD's Sergeant Kim, our nation's top CrimeStoppers coordinator for 2019. You have made Hawai'i proud!

"Also seated next to him, we have Chief Susan Ballard and members of his family: his mother, Jong Hee Kim; older brother, David Kim; younger brother, John Kim; oldest daughter, Hailey Kim; and the youngest daughter, Christalyn Kim. Again, thank you all for coming and blessing us with your presence here. Thank you very much. Thank you, Mr. President."

At 11:43 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
