The Senate of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2021, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with Senators Chang, Dela Cruz, English, Gabbard, Lee, Misalucha, Moriwaki, Rhoads, Shimabukuro, and Wakai present and participating via videoconference, and with the exception of Senator Ihara who was excused.
