# Wednesday, March 24, 2021

The Senate of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2021, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with Senators Chang, Dela Cruz, English, Gabbard, Ihara, Lee, Moriwaki, Rhoads, and Shimabukuro present and participating via videoconference.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Fifth Day.

At this time, Senator Keith-Agaran introduced his office staff, who were present in the gallery: Susan Wong, Danielle Evangelista, Robert Nishimoto, Pam Ono, and James Nelson, who had delivered a Moment of Contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session.

# RE-REFERRAL OF HOUSE BILLS

The Chair re-referred the following House bills that were received:

At this time, Senator Kidani, Chair of the Committee on Education, requested a waiver of the notice requirement pursuant to Senate Rule 21 for H.B. No. 608, H.D. 2.

Senator Kidani noted:

"The Committee on Education would like to insert a proposed S.D. 1 to continue the discussion around asserting the Board of Education's position as a policy-making entity for public education. The proposed S.D. 1 eliminates the superintendent's vote in collective bargaining but does not alter the governor or Board of Education votes. Thank you."

The Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Kidani then announced that the Committee on Education would be holding a public hearing on H.B. No. 608, H.D. 2, Proposed S.D. 1 that afternoon at 3:15 p.m. in Conference Room 229 and via videoconference.

Senator Baker rose to call the members' attention to the fact that it was "Equal Pay Day," because it takes women until March 24th to catch up to what their male colleagues made the year prior—except, of course, on the Senate floor. Senator Baker remarked that it's unacceptable, and that they could help fix this by raising the minimum wage and holding employers accountable for gender discrimination. Senator Baker then noted for the record that their colleague, Senator Brian Taniguchi, tried to do just that, and it died in the House of Representatives.

The Chair then made the following announcement:

"The deadline to file standing committee reports on House bills that need to pass Second Reading and move laterally to the final Senate committee is 9:00 p.m. this evening."

The Chair continued with the following remarks:

"The second, on a point of personal privilege, is simply to announce for the record here: Two years ago, we hosted Assemblymember Rob Bonta on our floor. He was visiting Hawai'i, and he was recognized as the first Filipino elected to the California Assembly. It was announced this morning that he is the new attorney general for the State of California, succeeding Attorney General Becerra, who has been named to the Biden cabinet, so I would like to extend, on behalf of the Hawai'i State Senate, our congratulations to Rob Bonta and his new appointment. I have not Googled it yet, but I assume he is the first of Filipino ancestry to be named attorney general for the State of California."

Senator Taniguchi rose on a point of personal privilege to share that there would be a CSG-West meeting on Zoom that afternoon at 1:00 p.m.
