

## TWENTY-FOURTH DAY

Thursday, March 3, 2022

The Senate of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2022, convened at 11:38 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present, with Senators Chang, Dela Cruz, Gabbard, Ihara, Keohokalole, Lee, Moriwaki, Rhoads, Shimabukuro, and Wakai present and participating via videoconference.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Third Day.

At this time, Senator Shimabukuro introduced intern Elle Yi, who had offered a moment of contemplation prior to the Senate's floor session. Senator Shimabukuro noted that Ms. Yi was interested in politics (including women's rights, education, and animals) and that Ms. Yi's mother, Dr. Jin Park, was a professor at UH Mānoa. Senator Shimabukuro then introduced other members of her staff who were seated in the gallery: legislative researcher Louis Galdeira, committee clerk Aric Harp, and chief of staff Keahi Renaud. Senator Shimabukuro then acknowledged Dr. Park, who was also seated in the gallery.

Senator San Buenaventura acknowledged that, although the State Capitol was closed, today was the Hawai'i State Council on Developmental Disabilities Day at the Capitol, and a number of advocates were watching. Senator San Buenaventura then recognized the self-advocates and advocates of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities, sponsor of the Day at the Capitol event. Senator San Buenaventura also recognized Daintry Bartoldus, executive administrator of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities, and her staff for coordinating the annual event to provide opportunities for individuals with developmental disabilities and family members to participate in the legislative process.
