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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMMISSION FOR NATIONAL AND COMMUNITY SERVICE.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 90D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 4 "(a) Members of the commission shall be appointed by the  
5 governor on a bipartisan basis subject to section 26-34. The  
6 commission shall consist of not fewer than fifteen and not more  
7 than twenty-five members. Not more than fifty per cent of the  
8 commission plus one member may be from the same political party.  
9 To the extent possible, the commission shall be balanced  
10 according to race, ethnicity, age, disability, and gender  
11 characteristics. All appointments shall be for [~~four-year~~  
12 three-year terms. Members shall not serve more than two  
13 consecutive terms. The commission shall include:
- 14 (1) An individual with expertise in the educational,  
15 training, and developmental needs of youths,  
16 particularly disadvantaged youths;



- 1           (2) An individual with experience in promoting the
- 2                   involvement of older adults in service and
- 3                   volunteerism;
- 4           (3) A representative of community-based agencies or
- 5                   community-based organizations within the State;
- 6           (4) The superintendent of education, or a designee;
- 7           (5) A representative of county governments;
- 8           (6) A representative of local labor organizations in the
- 9                   State;
- 10          (7) A representative of business;
- 11          (8) An individual between the ages of sixteen and
- 12                   twenty-five who is a participant or supervisor in a
- 13                   volunteer or service program; and
- 14          (9) A representative of a national service program
- 15                   described in Title 42 United States Code section
- 16                   12572(a), as amended, as a nonvoting, ex officio
- 17                   member."

18           2. By amending subsection (f) to read:


19           "(f) Members currently serving under Executive Order 94-01

20 may be reappointed to a new [~~four-year~~] three-year term and may

21 serve two consecutive terms."

1 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.  
3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.







