
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 14 of Act 58, Session Laws of Hawaii
2 2004, as amended by section 50 of Act 22, Session Laws of Hawaii
3 2005, is amended to read as follows:

4 "SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
5 provided that:

6 (1) The amendments made to sections 40-1, 40-4, and 40-6,
7 Hawaii Revised Statutes, by part I of this Act shall
8 not be repealed when those sections are reenacted on
9 June 30, [~~2005,~~] 2006, by section [~~24~~] 1 of Act [~~115,~~]
10 137, Session Laws of Hawaii [~~1998,~~] 2005;

11 (2) Part I shall be repealed on June 30, [~~2007,~~] 2010, and
12 sections 28-8.3, 201B-2, and 201B-11, Hawaii Revised
13 Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which they
14 read on May 5, 2004, and sections 40-1, 40-4, and
15 40-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in
16 the form in which they read on June 30, 1986; and

17 (3) Section 9 shall take effect on July 1, 2004."

Description:

Extends the sunset date to June 30, 2010, of provisions: Granting the Hawaii Tourism Authority (HTA) the authority to retain attorneys independent of the Attorney General; exempting HTA's accounts from supervision by the Comptroller; granting HTA the authority to appoint a sports coordinator; establishing that all interest and revenues or receipts derived by HTA from projects shall be deposited into the Tourism Special Fund (TSF); specifying that 5 percent of TSF funds may be used for administrative expenses; and certain other provisions.
