# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FISH.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The humuhumunukunukuapua`a (rhinecanthus  
2    rectangulus), also known as the rectangular triggerfish, was  
3    designated as the official fish of the State in 1985. However,  
4    the enabling legislation was automatically repealed by operation  
5    of law in 1990, five years after the date of approval. Many  
6    among the general public, however, mistakenly assume that the  
7    humuhumunukunukuapua`a is still the state fish. The legislature  
8    finds that Hawaii does not currently have a fish designated as  
9    the official fish of the State.

10           The purpose of this Act is to permanently establish the  
11    humuhumunukunukuapua`a as the official fish of the State.

12           SECTION 2. Chapter 5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended  
13    by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to  
14    read as follows:

15           "§5-    State fish. The humuhumunukunukuapua`a  
16    (rhinecanthus rectangulus), also known as the rectangular  
17    triggerfish, is established and designated as the official fish  
18    of the State."



- 1 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DROUGHT MITIGATING WATER STORAGE FACILITIES.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Section 235-110.92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:

3 "(e) The credit allowed under this section shall be  
4 available for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2000,  
5 and shall not be available for taxable years beginning after  
6 [~~December 31, 2005.~~] December 31, 2010."

7 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
