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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE  
THIRTY-EIGHTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Mililani's thirty-eighth representative  
2 district encompasses the new and expanding area of Mililani  
3 Mauka and the oldest part of the town, including the town  
4 center. Rapid development has caused chronic overcrowding in  
5 the newest schools, and has resulted in a population of over two  
6 thousand five hundred students at Mililani high school. A  
7 barely functioning phone system at Mililani high school has  
8 created a frustrating and unsafe situation. Built on an area  
9 the size of several city blocks, the campus must have a reliable  
10 phone system for the health and safety of the students.

11           In recent years, the legislature has funded a new ten-  
12 classroom building at Mililani high school. In 2003, \$360,000  
13 was appropriated for design, and another \$5,700,000 was  
14 appropriated in 2004 for construction. Due to the increased  
15 costs of construction and labor costs, an additional  
16 appropriation will be needed to complete the project.



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1           In addition to the needs of the newer schools and the high  
 2 school, the original Mililani schools are nearly forty years  
 3 old. These schools have many issues, including repair and  
 4 maintenance, as well as facilities that are outdated and in need  
 5 of restoration.

6           SECTION 2. The following sums, or so much thereof as shall  
 7 be sufficient to finance the projects listed in this Act, are  
 8 hereby appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of  
 9 Hawaii for fiscal year 2006-2007.
