
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES TO
CONSIDER RESURFACING THE FLOORS OF THE STATE CAPITOL TO
ADDRESS SAFETY CONCERNS.

1 WHEREAS, the State Capitol was built in 1967 and the
2 original physical features that have not been replaced or
3 refurbished are nearly forty years old and may pose a safety
4 concern; and

6 WHEREAS, the common area concrete floor surfaces of the
7 State Capitol could be considered unsafe under certain
8 conditions, such as when the surfaces are wet or newly-buffed;
9 and

11 WHEREAS, there have been instances and reports of people
12 slipping and falling at the State Capitol due to loss of balance
13 while walking on the common area floor surfaces; and

15 WHEREAS, the Legislature is concerned about the safety of
16 people walking on the concrete floor surfaces of the chamber
17 level and the first, second, third, and fourth floors of the
18 State Capitol; now, therefore,



20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
21 Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
22 of 2006, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
23 Accounting and General Services is requested to consider
24 resurfacing the concrete surfaces on the chamber level and the
25 first, second, third, and fourth floors of the State Capitol to
26 address safety concerns; and
