
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TEMPORARY ADVISORY COMMISSION
ON BIOLOGICAL DIVERSITY.

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that Hawaii's biological
2 diversity and biological resources are assets of the public land
3 trust that are culturally, spiritually, medicinally, and
4 otherwise significant to native Hawaiians and the general
5 public; and

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7 WHEREAS, Hawaii runs the risk of losing its biodiversity as
8 natural habitat is developed, natural environment is degraded,
9 and non-sustainable consumptive practices are perpetuated; and

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11 WHEREAS, Hawaii's unique biological diversity and
12 biological resources are assets of a public trust established in
13 article XI, section 1, of the Hawaii State Constitution and
14 section 171-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and

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16 WHEREAS, Hawaii's biological diversity and biological
17 resources are of great potential economic benefit in the areas
18 of medicine, scientific research, biotechnology, and commercial
19 development; and

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21 WHEREAS, there is a need to develop public policy to
22 balance scientific research and commercialization with the
23 preservation of Hawaii's fragile bio-resources, and fair and
24 equitable benefit-sharing with the general public and native
25 Hawaiians, who are the beneficiaries of the public land trust;
26 and

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28 WHEREAS, the Legislative Reference Bureau, in its report to
29 the Legislature entitled, "Bioprospecting: Issues and Policy
30 Consideration", January 2006, recommended four policy areas for
31 discussion, including:

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33 (1) Prior informed consent;
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35 (2) Rights of indigenous knowledge holders;



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(3) Equitable benefit-sharing; and

(4) Conservation, preservation, and sustainable use of biodiversity; and

WHEREAS, if the rights-holders and stakeholders, who have worked on these issues can agree to these four policies, it may serve as the basis upon which a regulatory permitting and licensing process can be developed; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, that the Governor is requested to establish a temporary advisory commission on biological diversity, to be placed within the Office of Hawaiian Affairs for administrative purposes only, to make recommendations for policy development in the area of:

- (1) Prior informed consent;
- (2) Equitable benefit-sharing;
- (3) Bio-safety protocols;
- (4) A permitting and licensing process; and
- (5) Cultural rights for the use of Hawaii's biodiversity; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests that members of the temporary advisory commission on biological diversity represent the various rights-holders and stakeholders including the following:

- (1) The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs or a designee;
- (2) The President of the University of Hawaii or a designee;
- (3) The Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism or a designee;



- 1 (4) The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural
2 Resources or a designee;
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- 4 (5) Five members of the native Hawaiian community,
5 residing in the State of Hawaii, who have a
6 demonstrated background in:
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 - 8 (A) Traditional and customary use of biological and
9 genetic resources;
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 - 11 (B) Indigenous and traditional technologies;
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 - 13 (C) Scientific and technical uses of native Hawaiian
14 practices;
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 - 16 (D) Legal procedures nationally and internationally,
17 in connection with the protection or
18 commercialization of biological and genetic
19 resources; and
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 - 21 (E) Native Hawaiian cultural rights as contained in
22 the Hawaii State Constitution and statutes;
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 - 24 who are appointed by the Governor from lists of
25 nominees submitted by the President of the Senate and
26 the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and
27 Hawaiian organizations;
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- 29 (6) Two representatives from the biotechnology industry,
30 whose principal place of business is in the State of
31 Hawaii, who are appointed by the Governor from lists
32 of nominees submitted by the President of the Senate
33 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and
34 members of the biotechnology industry, based in
35 Hawaii; and
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37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the temporary advisory
38 commission on biological diversity is requested to prepare a
39 report of its recommendations to the Legislature and the
40 Governor not later than twenty days prior to the convening of
41 the Regular Session of 2007; and
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43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
44 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the Senate, the
